Scout Mail in Prisoner-of-War Camps and Displaced Persons Camps in Europe during and after World War II

Prisoner-of-War Camps

Scouting in Prisoner-of-War camps in Germany was very limited as Scouting was generally banned by the Nazi regime. In few cases, Scouting was tolerated. It was mainly Rover (senior) Scouts, since the camp inhabitants were, for the most part, young men. Rover Scouts in at least one POW camp engaged in a mail delivery service.

DP Camps

Soon after the capitulation of Germany in the second world war, the allies entrusted the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration (UNRRA) with the establishment of special camps for the displaced people. There were hundreds of camps scattered across Germany, Austria, Italy and even Yugoslavia. The majority of camps were located in the American and British occupation zones of Germany. These camps were actually temporary cities of no small proportions with many of the needs of ordinary cities, including mail services.

Purpose of the exhibit

The exhibit documents local postage stamps related to Boy Scouts and Girl Guides, issued for and used by inhabitants in Prisomer-of-War camps and Displaced Persons camps in Europe during and after World War II.

In the beginning the German Post could not cope with the postal needs due to war damages. This inspired local organisations in many camps to set up its own post for camp needs. A good number of these issued own stamps.

Boy Scout Troops and Rover Scout Crews were active in some of the DP camps, and several of these were involved with the mail delivery service and Scout stamps were issued.

These DP camp stamps are in the category of local or provisional issues rather than official country issues. No country was responsible for their release, nor required their use. Nevertheless, many of the DP camp stamps have seen real postal use and were not just souvenirs.


Scout Mail in DP Camps

Scout Mail in Displaced Persons Camps in Europe after World War II



1945.

Lübeck UNRRA displaced persons camp, Lübeck, had a Latvian Scout troop, a Latvian Rover Crew and Latvian Girl Guides, Polish Rover Crew, provisional committee to organize Scouting among all the Polish boys in Germany and Scouting that was started by a director of an UNRRA assembly team. A mail delivery service was operated by Polish Rover Scouts.



"Urzad Poctztowy Polskiego Obozu w Niemczech 1" means "Post Office of the Polish Camp in Germany 1". Cachet in form of a simulated postal stamp indicates that 20 pfennig postage is paid.

March 1949.

Polish Scouts held a Rover Moot with skiing course for younger Boy Scouts 3-10 March 1949 near Neustadt, Schwarzwald. The Polish Rovers and Scouts came from DP camps in Germany.


A postage stamp was issued in connection with the event, printed in sheetlets of four.



The text on the stamps reads ALPY POCZTA ZŁAZOWA which translates to Alps Departure Mail. It is understood that Rover Scouts carried the mail from the event to the nearest post office.





The sender was the Boy Scout Headquarters in the Detmold camp. Red cachet "MEERBECK Displaced Persons Mail Paid".



Detmold and Augsburg stamps were also used in Greven and Würzburg. **Greven** UNRRA displaced persons camp, a camp for Latvian displaced persons, had a Scout troop and a Rover Crew.

Würzburg IRO displaced persons camp (American sector), a camp for Latvian displaced persons, had Girl Guides and a Rover Crew.

Scouting Around the World Lithuanian DP Camp Detmold - Nürtingen and Tübingen

1946 Lithuanian DP Camp Detmold, five stamps with Lithuanian Boy Scout emblem. These stamps were to some extent also used by Lithuanians in other German cities.

1946

Detmold and Augsburg stamps were also used in connection with a Lithuanian Boy Scout camp in August 1946. The camp was named D. L. K. GEDIMINO PILIES TUNTAS – JUNGBORN STOVYKLA / L.S.S. The camp was presumably for Lithuanian Boy Scouts from DP camps in Germany.

- D. L. K. stands for Grand Duke of Lithuania, and Gediminas was Grand Duke in the 1300's.
- Gedimino Pilies is Gediminas Tower, located in Vilnius, Lithuania.
- Tuntas means Scouts and Stovykla means Camp.
- Jungborn is the place, located in the district of Harz, in Saxony-Anhalt, Germany.
- L.S.S. is Lietuvos skautų sąjunga (Scout Association of Lithuania).




Boy Scouts in the D.P. camp at Augustdorf in the Lippe district of North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany operated a mail delivery service.

Scout units were formed in many of the Displaced Persons camps in Germany, following the Second World War. In several of the camps, the Scouts also undertook a mail delivery service, this was the case for the Boy Scouts in the D.P. camp at Augustdorf in the Lippe district of North Rhine-Westphalia, Germany.





The Lithuanian Scouting association was formed in 1918, and 1948 was a year of jubilee in the Lithuanian Scouting activities. A Lithuanian Boy Scout camp was held in Mittenwald in Bavaria, Germany. Kempten and Mittenwald were both located in the American occupation zone.







Four stamps had been printed from tentative plates on 1 September 1947, but were not put into use: 18 Pf Peter the Great, 24 Pf General Suvarov, 48 Pf Alexander Pushkin and 84 Pf Kremlin Palace, all with design by B. Kiriushin. The stamps were mimeographed on the reverse side of old Russian calendar pages. Wording in the Russian language and values in German currency. On 21 June 1948 the old Reichsmark and Rentenmark were exchanged for the new Deutsche Mark. Violet surcharge in new currency on three stamps.

The Russian Scout Post was also transferred. Emergency Christmas holiday issue. Revaluation (new Deutsche Mark) and perforation of the 1946 and 1949 issues of Mönchehof.


The name "Plast" derives from the Ukrainian word "plastun" which is synonymous with the English term "Scout".

Under Soviet, Romanian and Polish occupation from 1920, Ukrainian scouting activities were abolished, but continued in western Ukraine under Czechoslovak administration until the Soviet occupation in October, 1939. Plast survived the Second World War and began to flourish again in the refugee camps in Western Europe.

By 1946 Ukrainian Plast membership exceeded 10,000 Scouts who participated in regular camps, training courses, jamborees, publishing various publications, including a Ukrainian translation of Baden-Powell's "Scouting for Boys". Plast became a member of the D.P. (displaced persons) Division of the Boy Scouts International Bureau.






