The Purpose of this PH 2C exhibit is to show the philately of the 1975 World Scout Jamboree.

The **Scope** is in all aspects to examine the interaction of the postal system with Nordjamb-75.

Nordjamb-75, the 14th World Scout Jamboree in Lillehammer, Norway, was hosted jointly by the Boy Scouts of the five Nordic countries Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden.

Nordjamb-75 was more than a Jamboree, and it encompassed three forms of hospitality:

- The World Scout Jamboree in Norway:
 17,259 Scouts from 94 countries attended the Jamboree from July 29 to August 7, 1975
- Home Hospitality in all five countries for attendees at the Jamboree and Conference
- The 25th World Scout Conference in Denmark with delegates from 87 national Scout organisations

THE 1971 WORLD SCOUT CONFERENCE POSTMARK ON VENUE ENVELOPE

Jamboree?

World Jamborees are milestones in Scouting history.

The World Scout Jamboree is an international Scout camp of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), typically attended by several tens of thousands of Scouts from around the world, aged 14 to 17.

Protest against gigantism

Up until the 1960s, the jamborees had become relatively large events, with a lot of shows and little sign of being scout events. Therefore, at WOSM's 20th World Conference in 1965, the Nordic countries discussed the possibility of organizing a jamboree in the Nordics. This was the first (and so far only) time that the jamboree was a collaboration between several different nations.

Turned down in 1967:

At the 1967 World Scout Conference in Seattle, U.S.A., the Nordic countries proposed that a Jamboree should be held in Norway, hosted and organized jointly by the five Nordic countries. The offer was declined, and the 1971 Jamboree was subsequently held in Japan.

Decided in Japan, 1971:


The 23rd World Scout Conference took place in Tokyo, Japan August 12-17 at the Tokyo Prince Hotel. 71 National Scout Organizations were represented.

The 1971 World Scout Conference resolved:

"Confirms the decision to hold the 14th World Jamboree and 25th World Scout Conference in Scandinavia, in 1975, and records its thanks to all the countries which offered to be hosts to these world events."

1. Planning of Nordjamb-75

The Nordjamb-75 camp committee selected a campsite in Lillehammer, Norway. This campsite had been successfully used for the 1968 Scout national jamboree which had 8,500 participants.








Companies and other mailers with some amount of mail often use meter marks for postage payment. Publicity, or advertising slogans are a good way of conveying information. The Norwegian Boy Scout Association (Norsk Speidergutt-Forbund (NSF)) used this slogan with the Nordjamb-75 logo in their Krag CA4 meter stamp machine in 1975. Bicoloured meter slogans are possible with vertical feeding of the mail through the machine.

The meter slogan was used from July 1 to October 3, 1975, and serial number 70893-73048 are recorded.






Domestic letter with the NSF meter slogan, first day of usage. 80 øre for domestic printed matter to 20g 1.3.1975-1.3.1981.



No. 15 was issued on 28 April, and contained information about the new Scout stamps.


The denomination for the two stamps was for single-weight domestic and foreign letter rates.

A total of 84,185 First Day Covers were serviced by Norway Post Philatelic Services and received the official First Day Postmark on 19 June. This includes a variety of cacheted and un-cacheted covers. In addition an unknown number of First Day Covers with regular postmarks.



Postdirektoratet (Norway Post) issued Postal Circulars to all post offices. There were 50 Circulars in 1975. No. 17 was issued on May 13, 1975 and contained information about the new postal card.

It would appear that at a relatively late date Norway Post decided to supplement the pair of "Homage to Scouting" stamps with a postal card designed specifically for the Jamboree. Interestingly, neither the "Five Fingers One Hand" motto of Nordjamb-75 nor the tent village of interlocked tents was included in the design. The Postal Card had a stamp imprint of 100 øre which at the time of issue paid the postcard rate to any destination domestic and abroad.

The card was designed by Ingrid Jangaard Ousland and was printed in multi-colour offset by Emil Moestue A/S of Oslo. Sheets of 32 cards were printed at a time on white, surface coated stock card, each sheet being printed three times – 2 colours per pass. The sheets were then cut to standard A6 size, 148x105 mm.




Postal card addressed by the designer to herself.

500,000 cards were printed, of which approximately 20,000 were cancelled on the first day of issue, and approximately 51,300 were sold from the Jamboree post office.


The postal cards were on sale in Oslo, Bergen, Trondheim, Stavanger, Tromsø and in Lillehammer postal district.






NORWAY POST ANNOUNCES THE JAMBOREE P.O.

Norway Post announced the Jamboree Post Office in Postal Circular No. 24/1975. Original.

World Jamboree are milestones in Scouting history. In a sense they are also milestones in postal history. Few other events pose a similar postal problem: To develop a system for effective mail collecting, receiving and distribution to serve a multi-national population which expands from nil to tens of thousands literally overnight and shrinks back to nil with equal rapidity after a week or so.

The Main Post Office was located in a large tent in the central Market Area. The post office comprised two sections; a post office, staffed by four counter clercs, and a philatelic sales bureau staffed by 2-3 ladies.

In addition to the main post office in the central Market Area, there were small sub-offices in each of the 10 sub-camps, the Senior Scout Camp and the National Headquarters area. The sub-offices sold stamps and postcards, weighed letters, maintained a posting box and handled sub-camp collections and deliveries. No actual postmarking was undertaken at the sub-camp offices.

There were postal collecting boxes at the main Jamboree office, in the 10 sub-camps, the Senior Scout Camp and at the National Headquarters, other boxes were situated in the Press Center and at the hospital, making a total of 15 in all. Mail posted in any of these boxes received the Nordjamb handstamp.

In Norway, many of the post offices were open from 09:00 hrs to 15:00 hrs with no break for lunch. On July 29, the opening day and the day of issue for the postal card, this early closing caught many campers by surprise. Therefore, the camp offices were reopened from 16:00 hrs to 18:00 hrs by kind co-operation of the Postmaster and his staff.

Thereafter the offices were open daily from 09:00-12:30 hrs and from 14:00-16:30 hrs except on Sunday Aug 4, when the main office only was open 14:00-16:30 hrs and then only for the sale of stamps and postcards.

POST OFFICE – There is a branch office in each Subcamp Administration Centre. Here you can buy stamps and have your letters weighed. General postal services are available at the Camp Post Office near the main Jamboree entrance. Incoming mail will be delivered to




A sticker to add to page 21 with the missing information was prepared and handed out to the participants.

The postmark was designed by Arne Johnson who also had designed the postage stamps. It shows the "Tent Village" which became the Jamboree emblem: five inter-twined tents and the World Scout badge. A fixed date rubber type of handstamp was used. A total of 16 Nordjamb handstamps were delivered to the Jamboree Main Office by Norway Post. 8 of these were subsequently transferred to Lillehammer post office to cope with postal requests for first day and other covers and also to service first day mail from the Jamboree which the Jamboree staff were unable to handle on the Tuesday evening. There were also a further 12, identical handstamps retained for use at the Philatelic Bureau in Oslo.

The postmark date was not adjustable, and the entire rubber segment was changed every day. Slight differences in day and month digits are observed. The postmark is invariably struck in black colour (one red strike is from non-postal use).

THE NORDJAMB POSTMARK SHOWS THE JAMBOREE EMBLEM






It is estimated that a total of 160,000 postcards and 35,000 letters were sent from Nordjamb-75.







Domestic postal card from Nordjamb-75 6-8-1975. 100 øre for postcards domestic and to Nordic countries 1.3.1975-1.3.1981.






IRC SOLD AT NORDJAMB-75

The vast majority of mail posted at Nordjamb-75 was correctly franked. The Jamboree Postmaster commented that this was quite remarkable since most of the campers were working in a strange currency. Postage due tax marks were not applied on outgoing underpaid mail. It seems quite clear that the Jamboree post office staff was hard pressed most of the time and simply turned a blind eye on such misdemeanours.


POSTAGE DUE NOT CHARGED

Mail addressed to the camp was pre-sorted at the Lillehammer post office into 13 groups: National Headquarters Camp (NHQ), the Senior Scout Camp (SCC), the Camp Office, and the 10 sub-camps.

Poste restante, also known-as general delivery in North American English, is a service where the post office holds the mail until the recipient calls for it.



The postmark is invariably struck in black. One red mark has been recorded, impressed on unused non-descript stationery. It appears that in the Home Hospitality tent next door to the Jamboree Post Office a rubber handstamp of the official design was in use on July 29 which was the opening day. Thereafter the date was defaced or cut away. As the only colour ink pad in the tent was red that was the colour used. It is thus clear that the use of the red postmark is non-postal.

3. The Jamboree Postal Arrangements Post Office Savings Bank

The Norwegian Post Office Savings Bank (Norges Postsparebank) was founded 1948 after a major political battle, with the goal to encourage savings. The bank offered its services through all Norwegian post offices.

41 deposits were made at Nordjamb-75, and there were 338 withdrawals from Norwegian accounts. There were 168 withdrawals from Swedish accounts and 5 from Finnish accounts.


DEPOSIT AND WITHDRAWALS AT NORDJAMB-75



178 parcels to abroad were were sent from Nordjamb-75. Numbers to each country were not recorded.

PARCEL TO THE UNITED STATES

For parcels to the United States, a buff coloured, tie-on label (form Bl.181) had to be completed and affixed to the parcel, stating the contents and value and instructions for disposition of the parcel if not deliverable as addressed.

The twin-language Norwegian and English label and its rouletted stub were poststamped with the Nordjamb postmark, the stub being detached and retained by the exchange post office.


















In the central Market Area adjacent to the Jamboree Post Office, a focus for philatelic interest was provided in the form of a marquee or large tent entitled Scout "U" Bank. The Scout "U" Bank gathers stamps of the world from donors for resale to collectors with all profits going to aid disabled Scouts.

The Scout "U" Bank tent housed a series of booths – all but one having philatelic interest:

- The Scout "U" Bank. Every Jamboree attendee was requested to bring 30 used stamps with him as a donation to the stamp bank. This booth was extremely well patronized because the material on offer had universal appeal
- Norwegian Scout Stamp Collectors; offering Norwegian FDC's, the Jamboree card cancelled on the day of issue, the Norwegian Scout HQ meter slogan and the two Austrian meter slogans
- The Swedish Scout Union, taking orders for the forthcoming issue of Swedish Scout stamps including FDCs, and Swedish Scout meter slogans
- The Danish Scout Stamp Collectors Club; offering Danish and Greenland Scout covers
- The Benelux Scout Stamp Club; offering Benelux Scout covers together with the Swiss meter slogan
- SSCC, the Scout Stamp Collectors Club (U.K.); offering Scout stamps & Scout covers of the world
- SOSSI, Scouts On Stamps Society International (U.S.A.); offering Scout covers
- The Badger's Club offered badges and patches not for sale but rather for trading; one patch in the pot for every one extracted



JAMBOREE COMMITTEE ENVELOPE







1968 BOY SCOUT NATIONAL CAMP VIEWCARD, NORDJAMB-75 LOGO IMPRESSED











The contingents with Scouts and leaders were clustered into 10 subcamps which were run and staffed by the different Nordic countries and the major camp activities took place on a subcamp basis. 







COVER FROM HARALD AARBOGH, NORWEGIAN CONTINGENT LEADER




6. The National Contingents

Armenia

The first Armenian Scouting groups were organized in 1910 and continued until 1922 when Scouting was banned and the Young Pioneers became the official state youth organization in Armenia. In 1929, the World Organization of the Scout Movement recognized the Association of Armenian Scouts, Haï Ari, based in France. While the Association did not have its own territorial base, it was the exception to the rule, remaining a member of the World Organization and the European Scout Region. 27 Armenian Scouts attended Nordjamb-75. In 1994, Scouting started again in Armenia.









Scouting was founded in Finland in 1910, when Finland was an autonomous part of Russia. The Russian governor-general of Finland banned Scouting in 1911. The ban on Scouting in Finland was not lifted until after the Russian revolution in 1917, and Finland declared its independence. Finland was co-organiser of Nordjamb-75. 392 Scouts from Finland attended, plus an unknown number of attendees in Jamboree staff and Senior Scout Camp.



During World War II all Scouting movements were prohibited and officially dissolved in the Netherlands. **253 Scouts from the Netherlands attended Nordjamb-75.** In 1995, the Netherlands hosted the 18th World Scout Jamboree.



The Scout movement was first introduced in the Philippines in 1910 during the American Occupation. For most of the late 20th century and into the 21st century, the Boy Scouts of the Philippines is among the largest Scout organizations in the world. 217 Scouts from the Philippines attended Nordjamb-75.

FILIPINO POSTMARK WAS AT THE JAMBOREE, BUT NOT ACCEPTED TO USE ON MAIL



The Philippines Contingent used an official Filipino special postmark at the Jamboree on August 4 to celebrate Philippines Day. 1000 covers (SSCC-E18) were prepared with a pair of the 1973 Philippines Golden Jubilee of Scouting stamps and postmarked. These were not accepted to be sent through the Norwegian mail. The covers were sold unaddressed by the Contingent for NOK 5 and later in the Scout Stamp Bank Tent for NOK 6 to raise funds for the Phillipines Contingent.

FILIPINO POSTMARK USED AT THE JAMBOREE, MAILED AND POSTAGE DUE



The covers with the Philippines franking and postmark were not accepted as legally prepaid by Norway Post. Covers that nevertheless were addressed and posted received a small "T in circle" postage due mark. Postmarked Nordjamb-75 6-8-1975 and T in circle handstamp, but no evidence of postage due paid by the addressee.

Scouting was officially founded in Saudi Arabia in 1961, though Scouting was active many years prior to the founding date. 35 Scouts from Saudi Arabia attended Nordjamb-75.

In 2011, Sweden hosted the 22nd World Scout Jamboree.


ENVELOPE BY 6TH SWEDISH JAMBOREE TROOP






Ernest Thompson Seton started the Woodcraft Indians in 1902. Daniel Carter Beard started the Sons of Daniel Boone in 1905. When Baden-Powell created the first Scouting program in 1907, he used elements of Setons' work in his Scouting for Boys. Several small local Scouting programs started in the U.S. soon after. U.S.A. hosted the 12th World Scout Jamboree in 1967. 2492 Scouts from the United States attended Nordjamb-75 and this was the largest contingent at the Jamboree.














A total of approx.. 11,500 covers and cards were mailed from the conference via Lyngby post office.




Nordjamb-75 was a resounding success for the attendees from all over the world. It was also great experience for enthusiastic Scout philatelists!

SCOUT STAMP EXHIBITION AT THE POSTAL MUSEUM



Nordjamb-75 and the support from Norway Post by issuing two postage stamps and a postal card created interested for Scout philately. The Norwegian Postal Museum in Oslo staged a Scout stamp exhibition in the fall of 1975. Reinert Rødland was instrumental in supplying material for the exhibition which had its own special postmark.

Nordjamb-75 was not only a success for the participating Scouts. It also provided a field day for Scout philatelists, as exemplified by this January 1976 cover from Reinert Rødland of Norway to William Anderson in the United States. Mr. Rødland was central in the philatelic activities at Nordjamb-75.

THE NEXT WORLD JAMBOREE WAS PLANNED IN IRAN

The 25th World Scout Conference in Copenhagen that followed immediately after the Jamboree at Lillehammer resolved that the 15th World Scout Jamboree should be held in Iran at Nishapur.

We have already been in contact with the president for the next jamboree in Iran – we are welcome!



Scouting is not political, but like anyone else, Scouting is indeed affected by politics. The destabilizing events of the 1979 Islamic Revolution in Iran caused the 15th World Jamboree to be cancelled near the end of 1978. Instead, the World Organization of the Scout Movement announced the "World Jamboree Year" by holding several international World Jamboree Year camps in Australia, Canada, Sweden, Switzerland and the United States.
