– the philately of the 1975 World Scout Jamboree –

The **Purpose** of this PH 2C exhibit is to show the philately of the 1975 World Scout Jamboree. The **Scope** is in all aspects to examine the interaction of the postal system with Nordjamb-75. Nordjamb-75, the 14th World Scout Jamboree in Lillehammer, Norway, was hosted jointly by the Boy Scouts of the five Nordic countries Denmark, Finland, Iceland, Norway and Sweden. Nordjamb-75 was more than a Jamboree, and it encompassed three forms of hospitality:

- The World Scout Jamboree in Norway:
17,259 Scouts from 94 countries attended the Jamboree from July 29 to August 7, 1975
- Home Hospitality in all five countries for attendees at the Jamboree and Conference
- The 25th World Scout Conference in Denmark with delegates from 87 national Scout organisations

Jamboree?

World Jamborees are milestones in Scouting history.

The World Scout Jamboree is an international Scout camp of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), typically attended by several tens of thousands of Scouts from around the world, aged 14 to 17.

Protest against gigantism

Up until the 1960s, the jamborees had become relatively large events, with a lot of shows and little sign of being scout events. Therefore, at WOSM's 20th World Conference in 1965, the Nordic countries discussed the possibility of organizing a jamboree in the Nordics. This was the first (and so far only) time that the jamboree was a collaboration between several different nations.

Turned down in 1967:

At the 1967 World Scout Conference in Seattle, U.S.A., the Nordic countries proposed that a Jamboree should be held in Norway, hosted and organized jointly by the five Nordic countries. The offer was declined, and the 1971 Jamboree was subsequently held in Japan.

Decided in Japan, 1971:

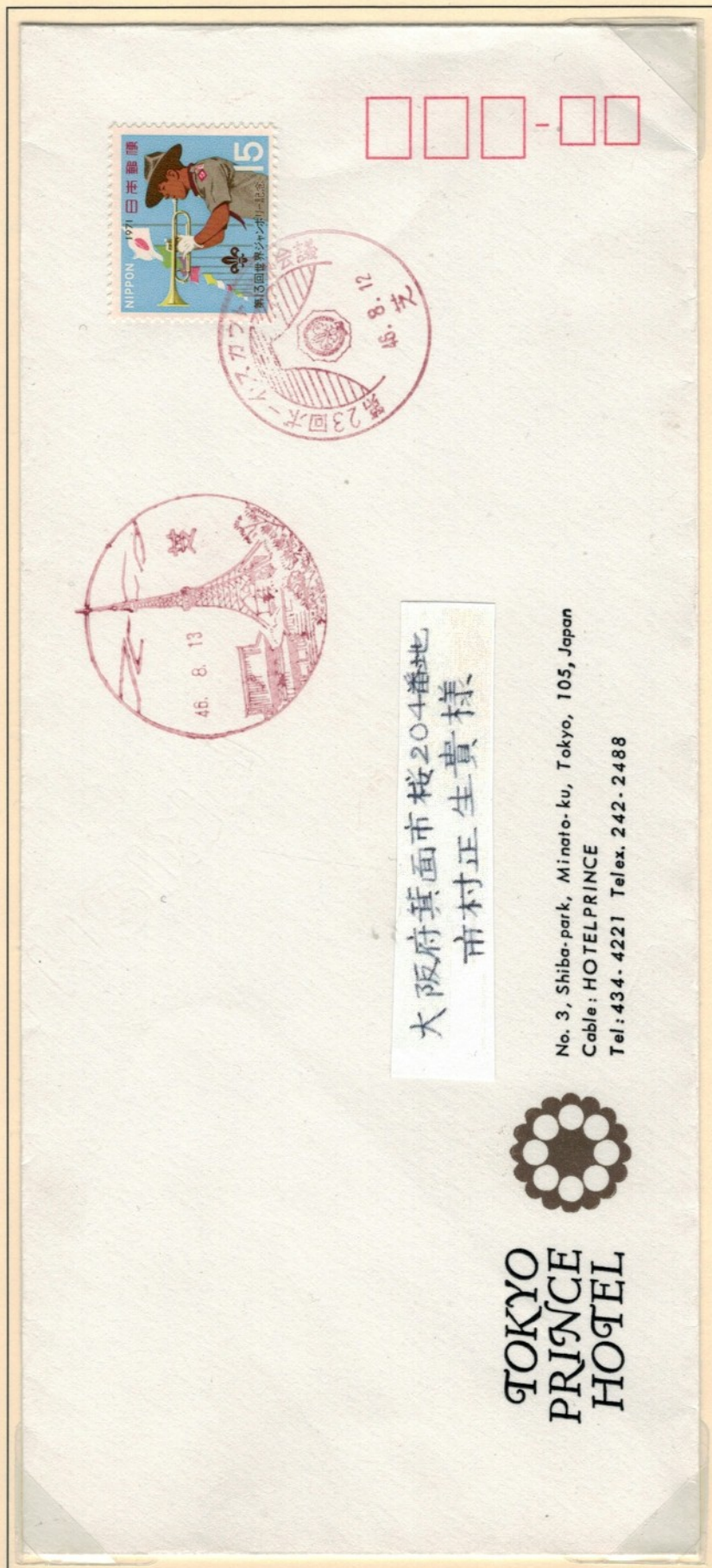
The 23rd World Scout Conference took place in Tokyo, Japan August 12-17 at the Tokyo Prince Hotel. 71 National Scout Organizations were represented.

The 1971 World Scout Conference resolved:

"Confirms the decision to hold the 14th World Jamboree and 25th World Scout Conference in Scandinavia, in 1975, and records its thanks to all the countries which offered to be hosts to these world events."

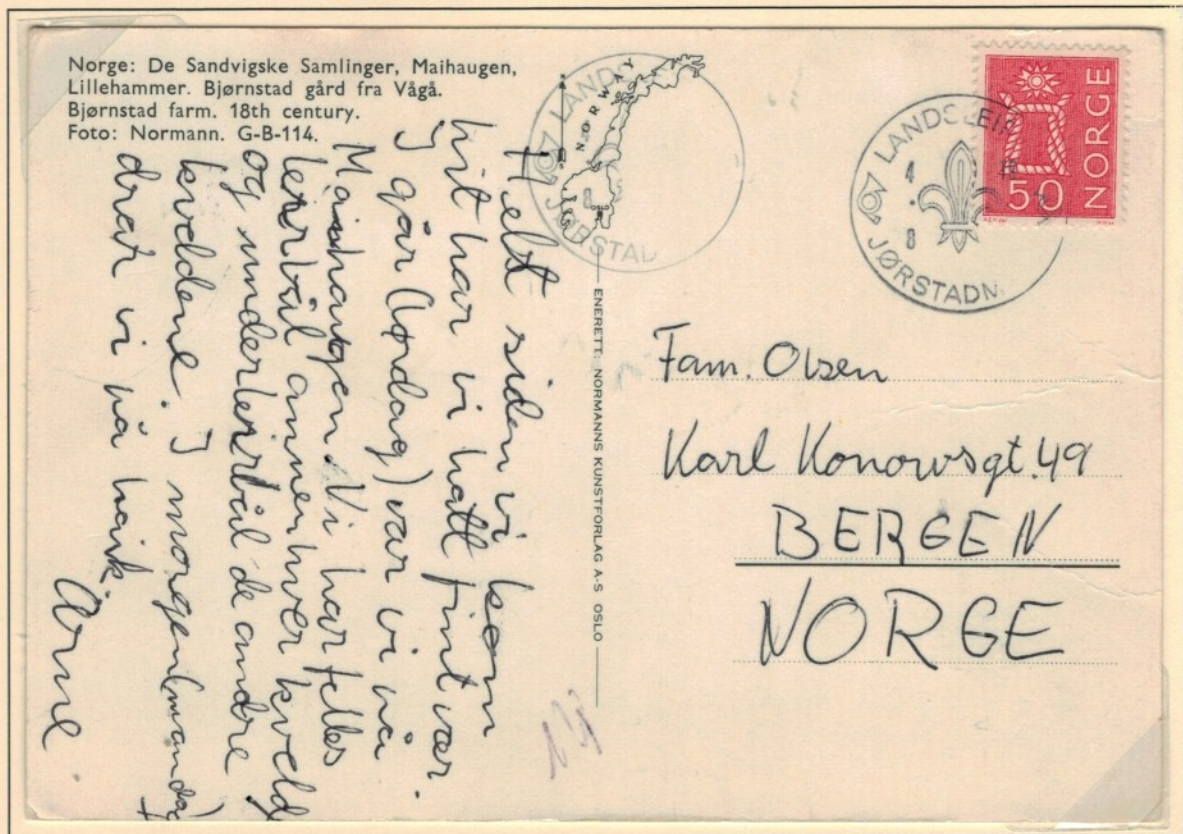

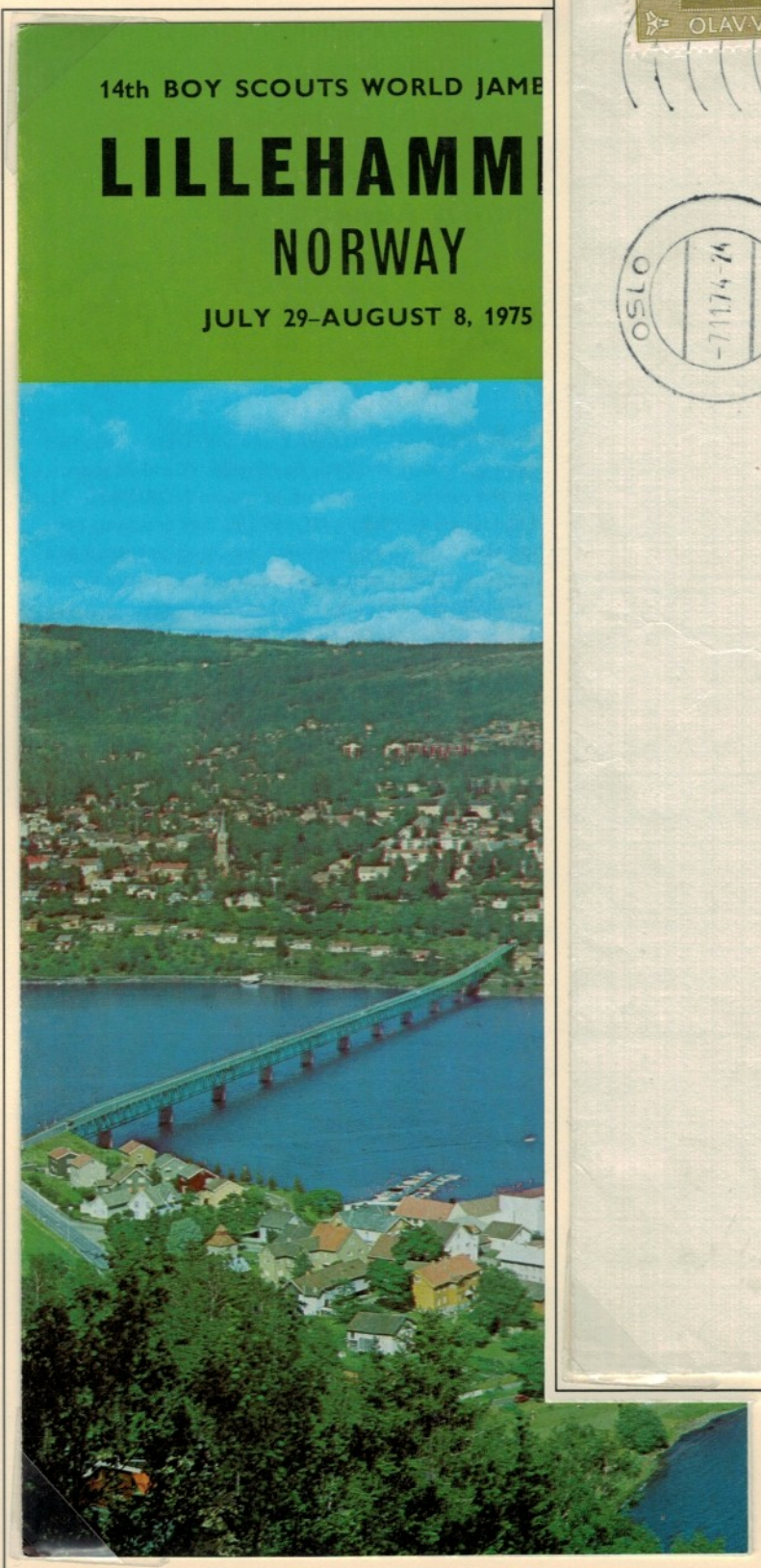

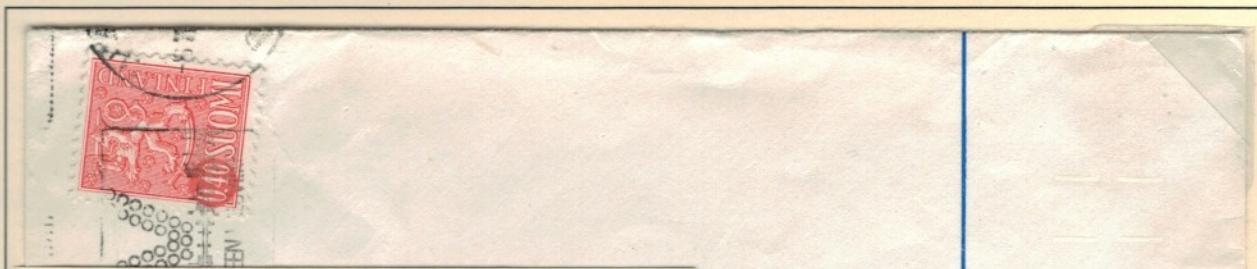

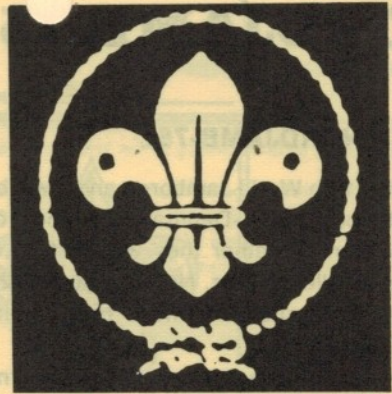

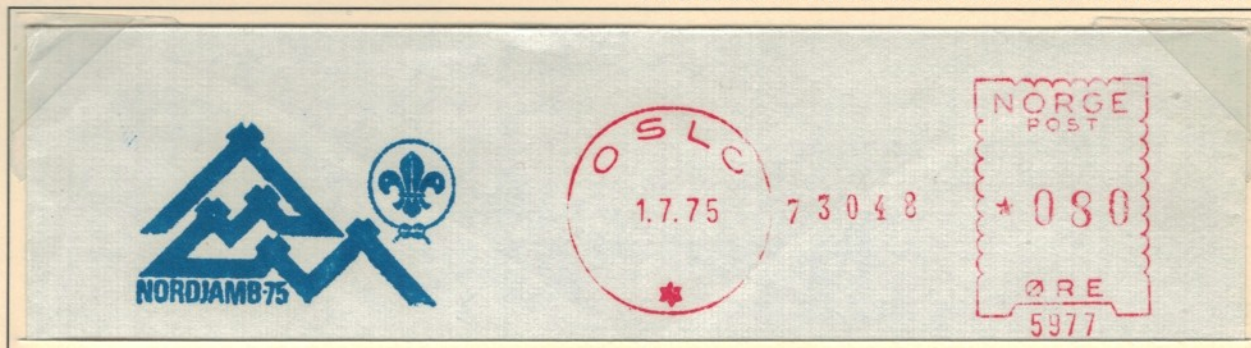

Companies and other mailers with some amount of mail often use meter marks for postage payment. Publicity, or advertising slogans are a good way of conveying information. The Norwegian Boy Scout Association (Norsk Speidergutt-Forbund (NSF)) used this slogan with the Nordjamb-75 logo in their Krag CA4 meter stamp machine in 1975. Bicoloured meter slogans are possible with vertical feeding of the mail through the machine.

The meter slogan was used from July 1 to October 3, 1975, and serial number 70893-73048 are recorded.



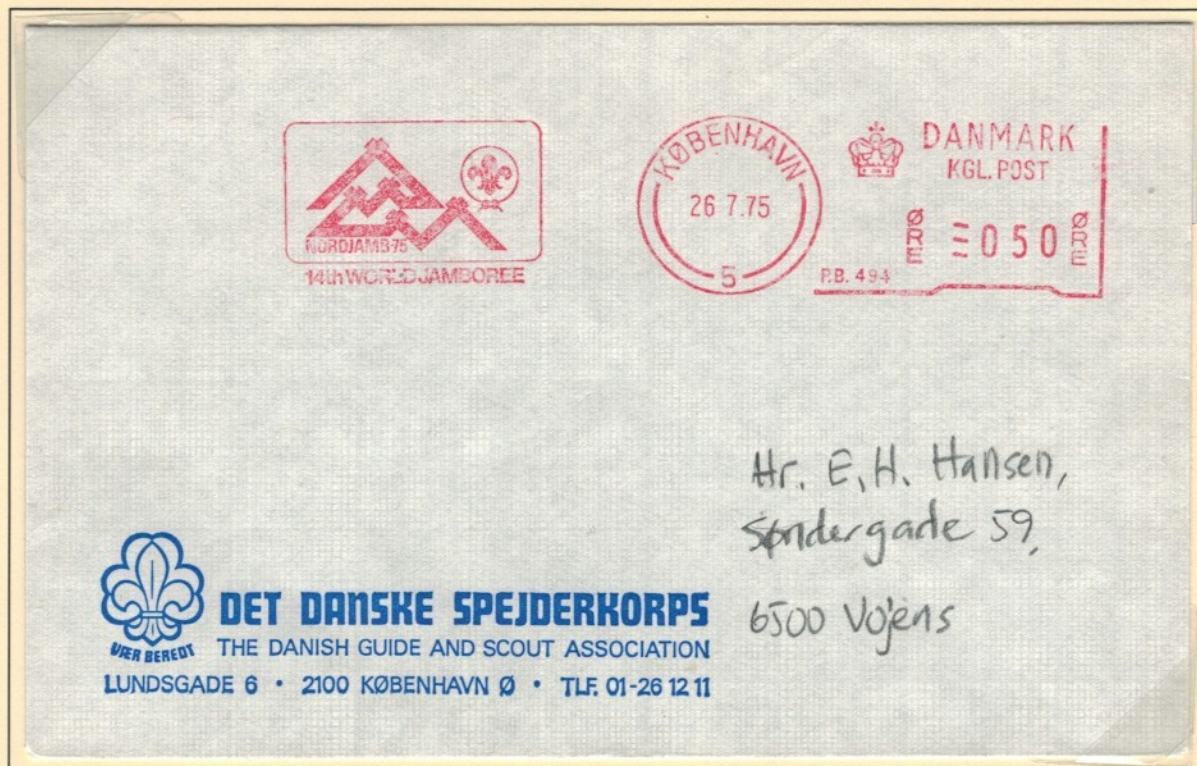

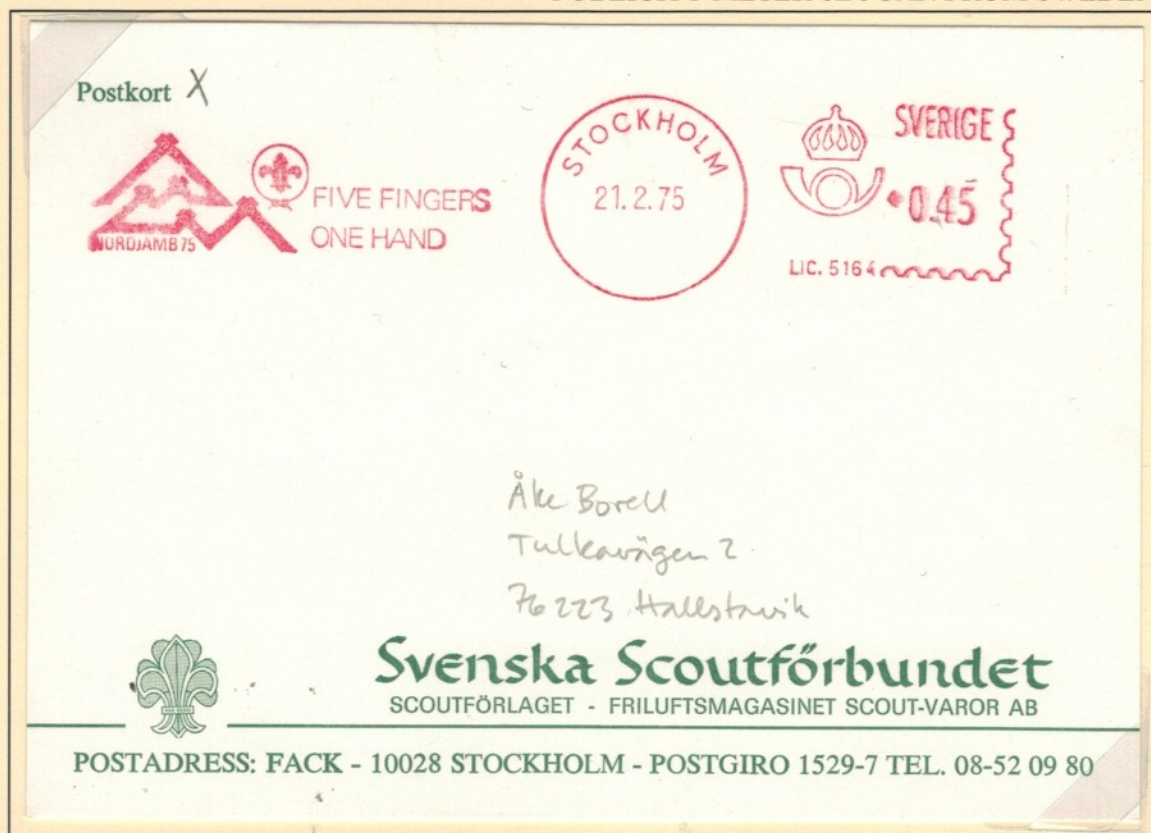

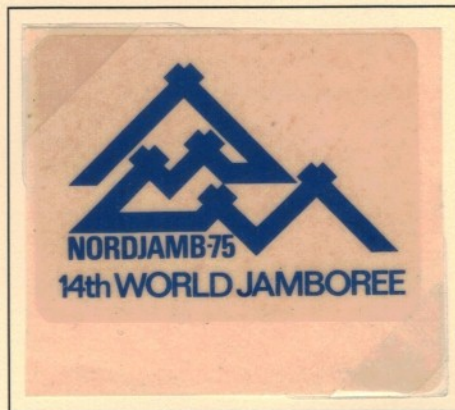

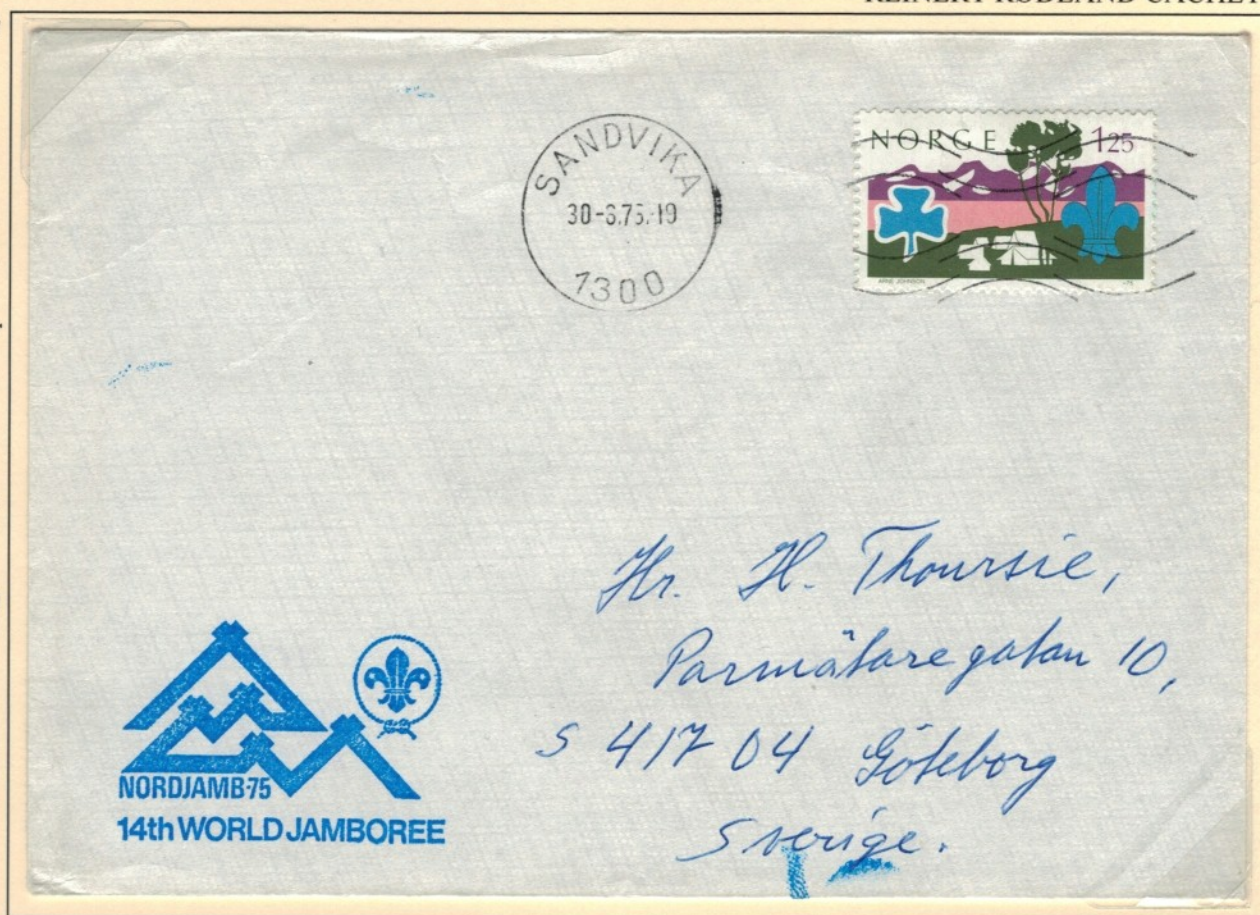

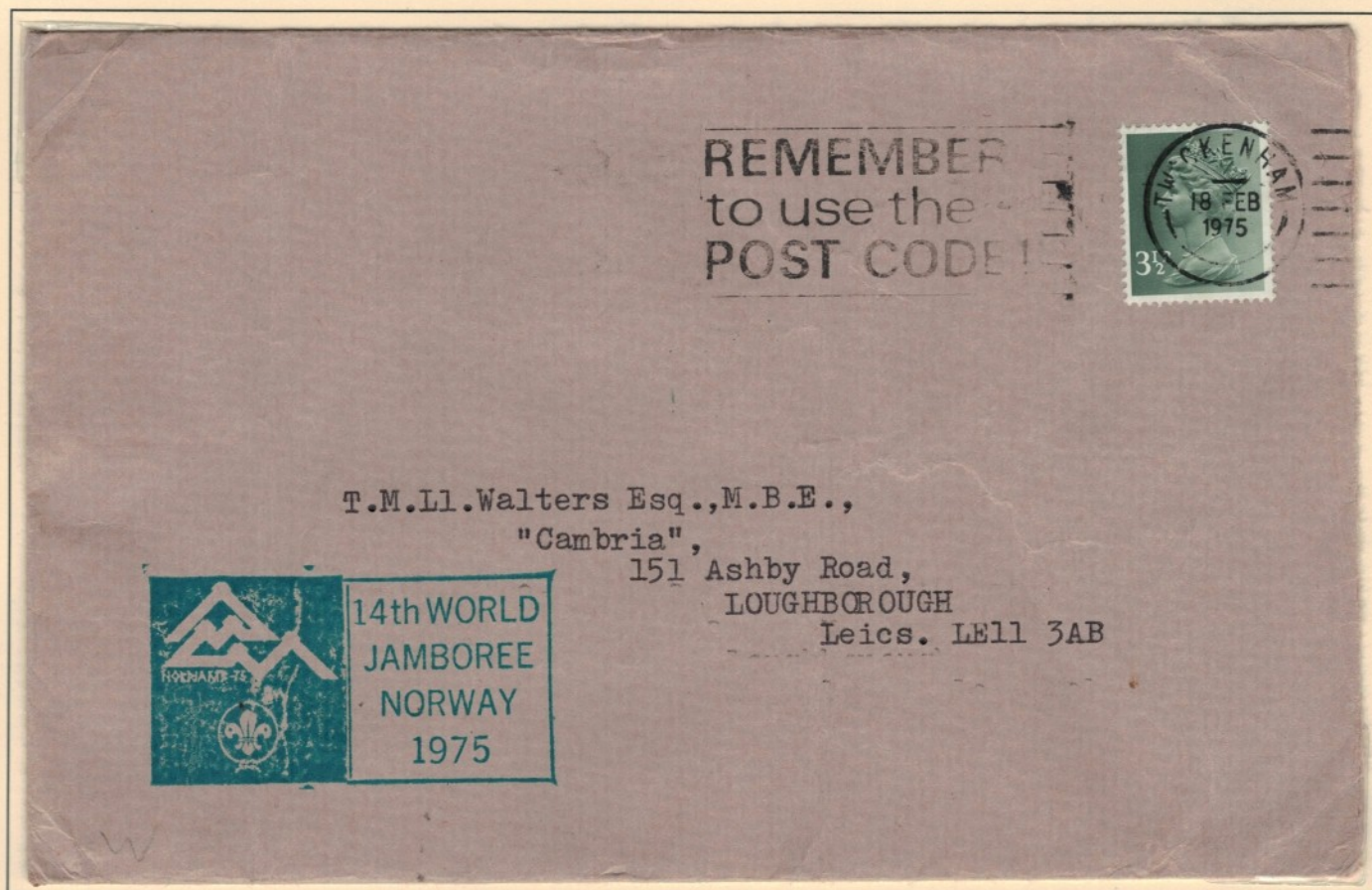

The Postage Stamps

The two stamps were issued on the occasion of the 14th World Jamboree, and the set was entitled "Homage to Scouting".

125 øre: Intended to satisfy the domestic and Norden first class letter rate, this value stamp represented Scouting in summer by means of seven small tents in the centre foreground, flanked by Girl and Boy Scout badges against a background of a fjord (coloured pink!) and distant mountains still showing signs of snow.

140 øre: Intended to satisfy the first class letter rate outside the Nordic countries, this higher value stamp represented Scouting in winter – four skiers flanked by the Girl and Boy Scout badges.

OFFICIAL PRESS PHOTO



A black-and-white photo on glossy paper was enclosed with the press release from Norway Post for the new stamps.

Both stamps were designed by Arne Johnson at the request of the Postal Authorities.

Printed in sheets of 50, in four colours on phosphorescent coated, unwatermarked paper supplied by Harrison & Sons Ltd of London. The printing was entrusted to Emil Moestue A/S of Oslo, who used multi-colour, high-speed offset presses.

The stamp dimension is 37.6mm x 21.1 mm with perforation 13.

6,875,000 stamps were printed of the 125 øre value and 1,825,000 of the 140 øre value..

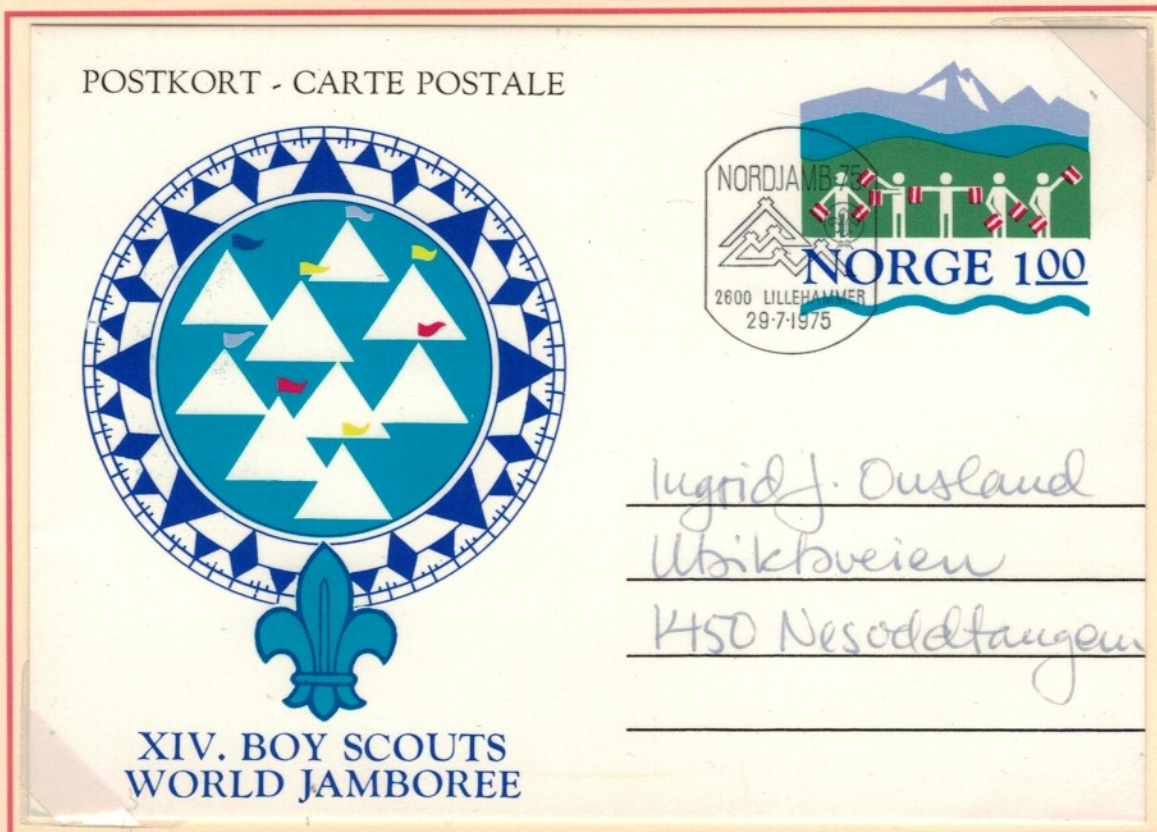

The Postal Card had a stamp imprint of 100 øre which at the time of issue paid the postcard rate to any destination domestic and abroad.

The card was designed by Ingrid Jangaard Ousland and was printed in multi-colour offset by Emil Moestue A/S of Oslo. Sheets of 32 cards were printed at a time on white, surface coated stock card, each sheet being printed three times – 2 colours per pass. The sheets were then cut to standard A6 size, 148x105 mm.

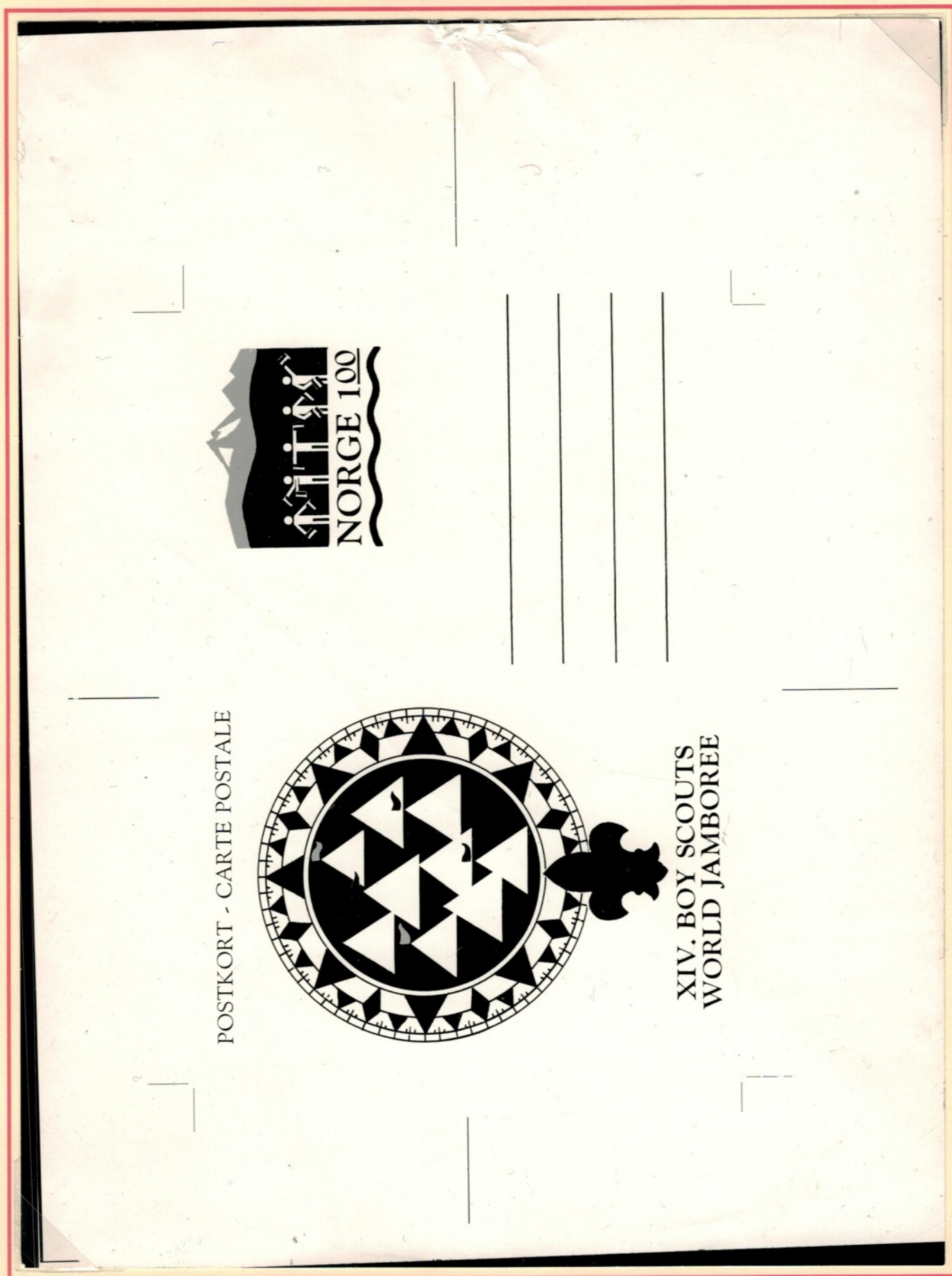
POSTAL CARD WITH THE DESIGNER'S HANDWRITING

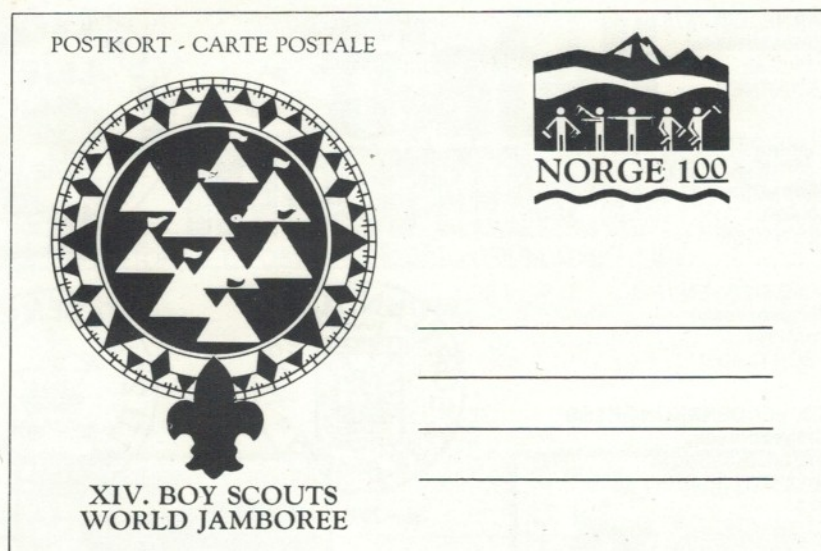

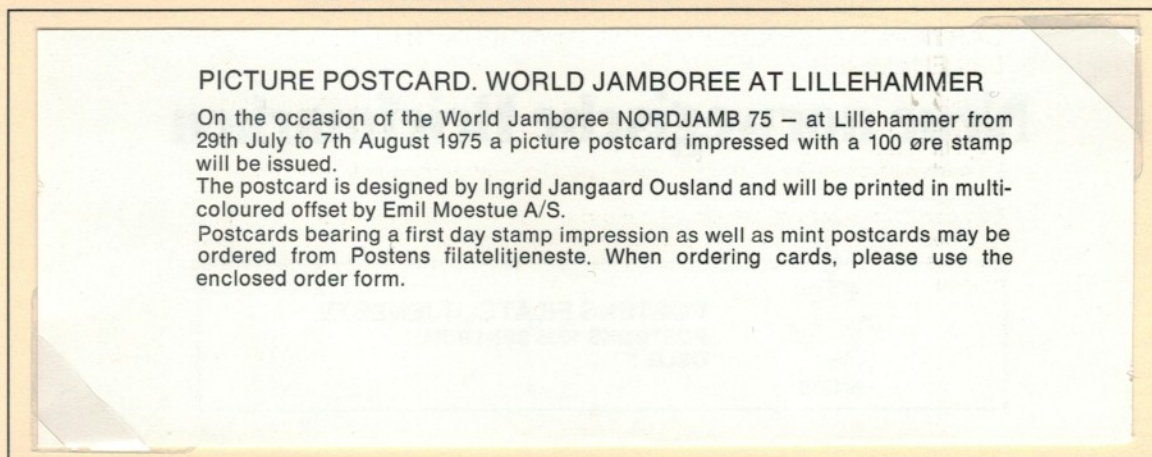

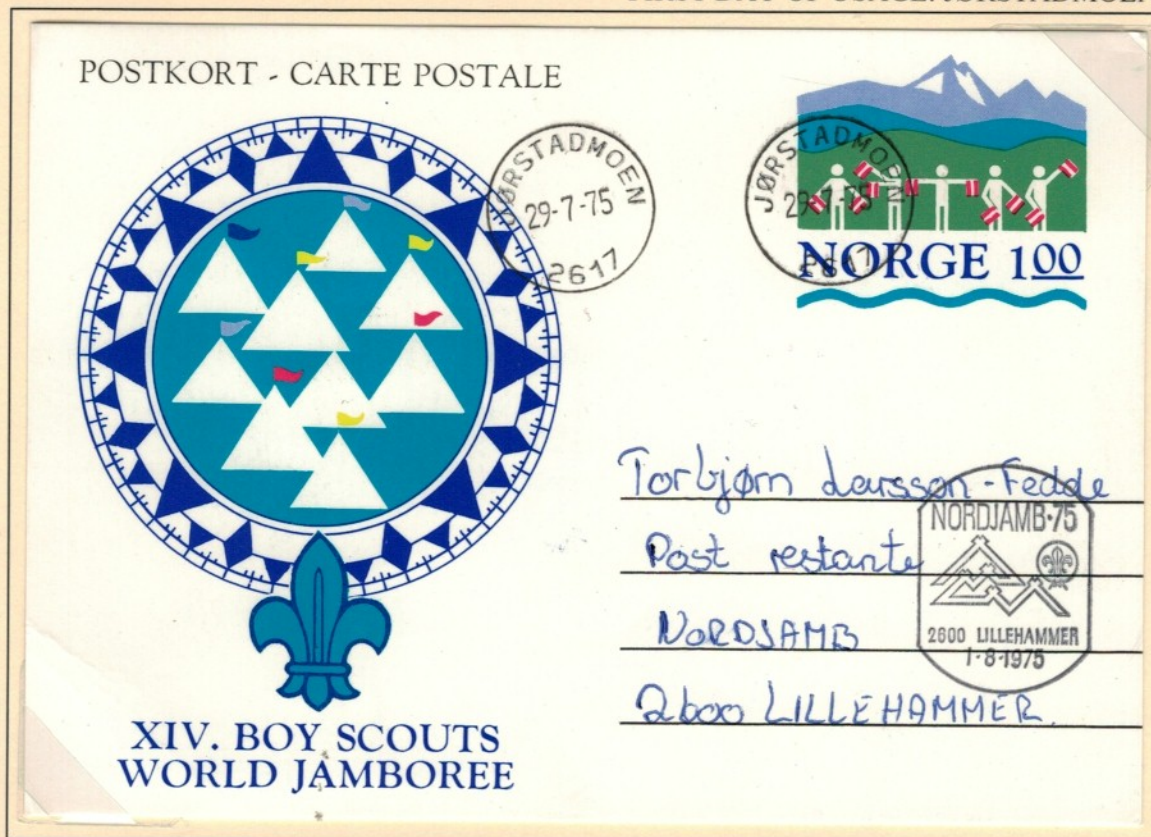

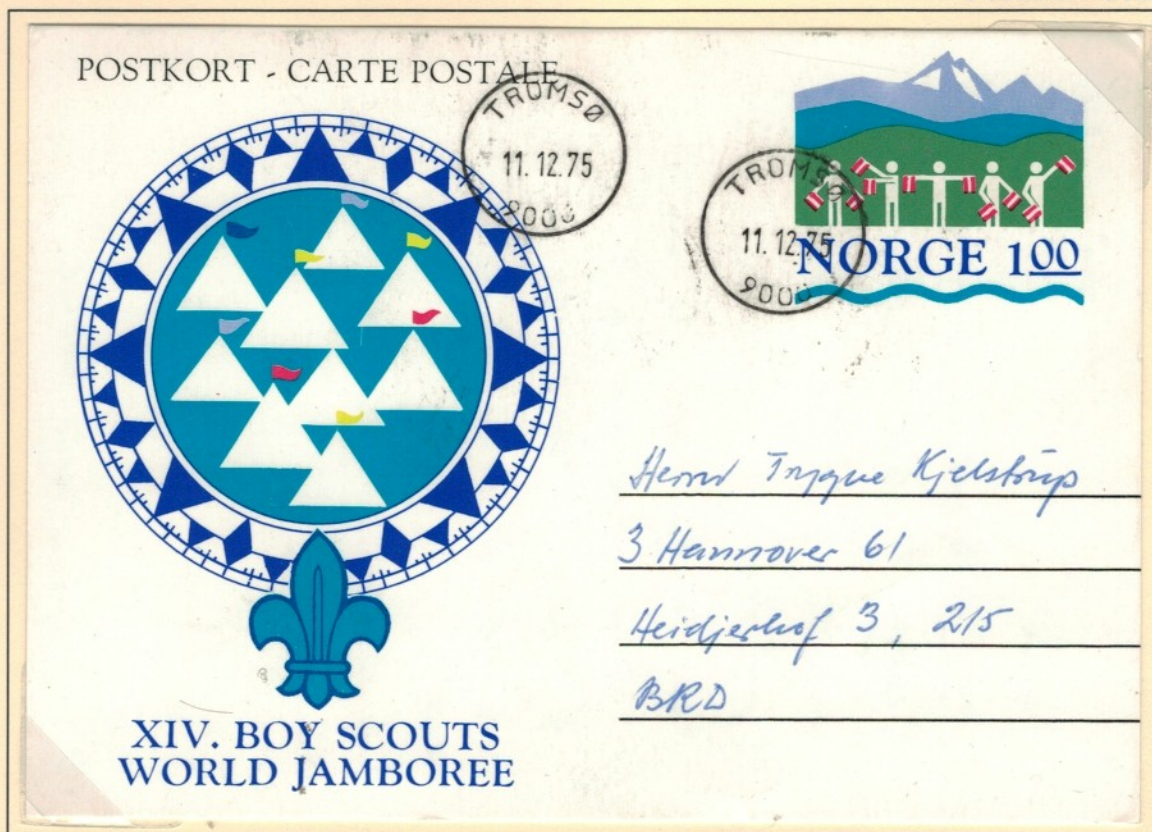

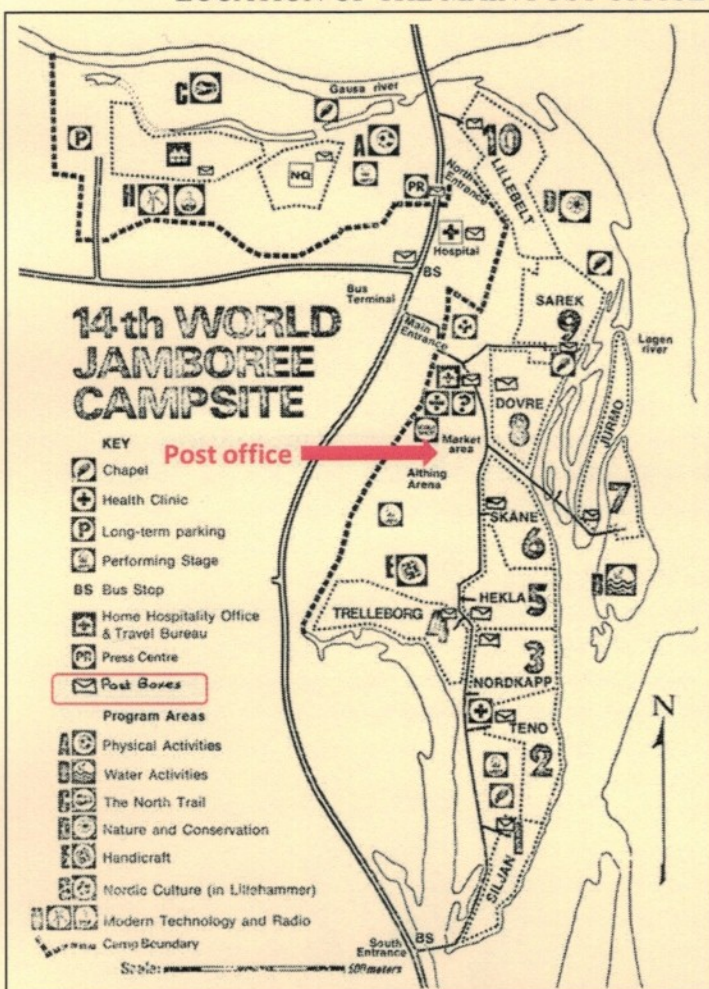
NORWAY POST ANNOUNCES THE JAMBOREE P.O.

Norway Post announced the Jamboree Post Office in Postal Circular No. 24/1975. *Original.*

World Jamboree are milestones in Scouting history. In a sense they are also milestones in postal history. Few other events pose a similar postal problem: To develop a system for effective mail collecting, receiving and distribution to serve a multi-national population which expands from nil to tens of thousands literally overnight and shrinks back to nil with equal rapidity after a week or so.

The Main Post Office was located in a large tent in the central Market Area. The post office comprised two sections; a post office, staffed by four counter clerks, and a philatelic sales bureau staffed by 2-3 ladies.

In addition to the main post office in the central Market Area, there were small sub-offices in each of the 10 sub-camps, the Senior Scout Camp and the National Headquarters area. The sub-offices sold stamps and postcards, weighed letters, maintained a posting box and handled sub-camp collections and deliveries. No actual postmarking was undertaken at the sub-camp offices.

There were postal collecting boxes at the main Jamboree office, in the 10 sub-camps, the Senior Scout Camp and at the National Headquarters, other boxes were situated in the Press Center and at the hospital, making a total of 15 in all. Mail posted in any of these boxes received the Nordjamb handstamp.

In Norway, many of the post offices were open from 09:00 hrs to 15:00 hrs with no break for lunch. On July 29, the opening day and the day of issue for the postal card, this early closing caught many campers by surprise. Therefore, the camp offices were reopened from 16:00 hrs to 18:00 hrs by kind co-operation of the Postmaster and his staff.

Thereafter the offices were open daily from 09:00-12:30 hrs and from 14:00-16:30 hrs except on Sunday Aug 4, when the main office only was open 14:00-16:30 hrs and then only for the sale of stamps and postcards.



POST OFFICE – There is a branch office in each Sub-camp Administration Centre. Here you can buy stamps and have your letters weighed. General postal services are available at the Camp Post Office near the main Jamboree entrance. Incoming mail will be delivered to your troop campsite.

P.O. Bulletin no. 8/1975 (Norwegian version) announced the Nordjamb-75 postmark. Collectors could send in pre-stamped letters, postcards and printed matter to the Norway Post Philatelic Services Bureau in Oslo and have them postmarked with the Nordjamb-75 postmark.

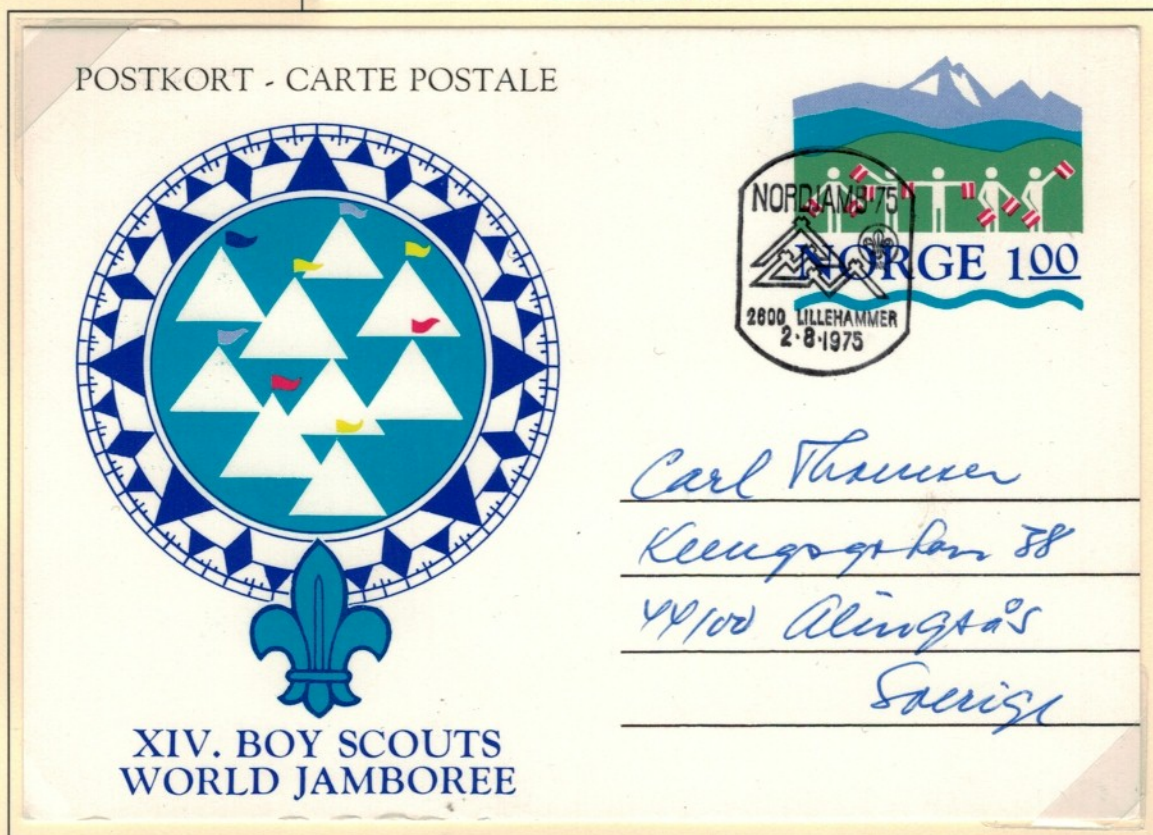

The Postmarks

The postmark was designed by Arne Johnson who also had designed the postage stamps. It shows the "Tent Village" which became the Jamboree emblem: five inter-twined tents and the World Scout badge. A fixed date rubber type of handstamp was used. A total of 16 Nordjamb handstamps were delivered to the Jamboree Main Office by Norway Post. 8 of these were subsequently transferred to Lillehammer post office to cope with postal requests for first day and other covers and also to service first day mail from the Jamboree which the Jamboree staff were unable to handle on the Tuesday evening. There were also a further 12, identical handstamps retained for use at the Philatelic Bureau in Oslo.

The postmark date was not adjustable, and the entire rubber segment was changed every day. Slight differences in day and month digits are observed. The postmark is invariably struck in black colour (one red strike is from non-postal use).

It is estimated that a total of 160,000 postcards and 35,000 letters were sent from Nordjamb-75.

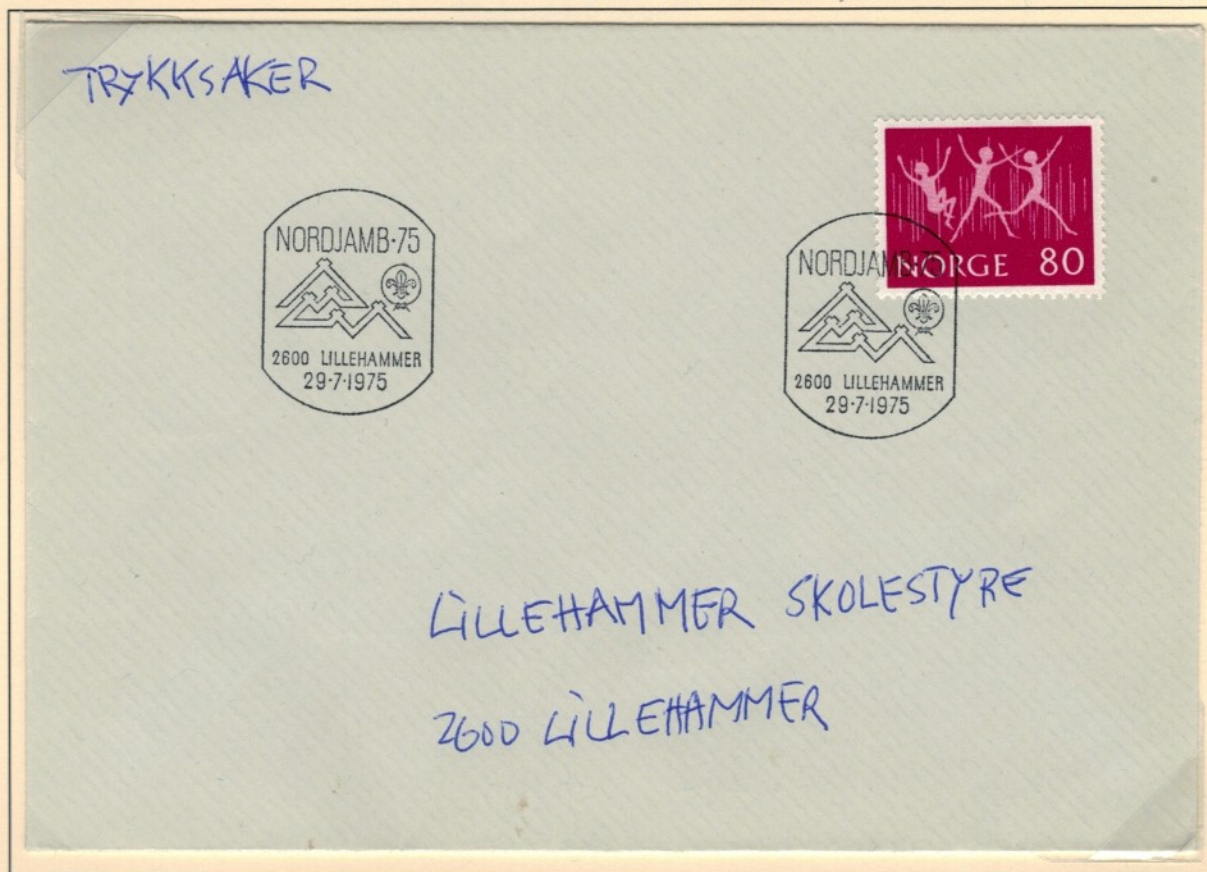

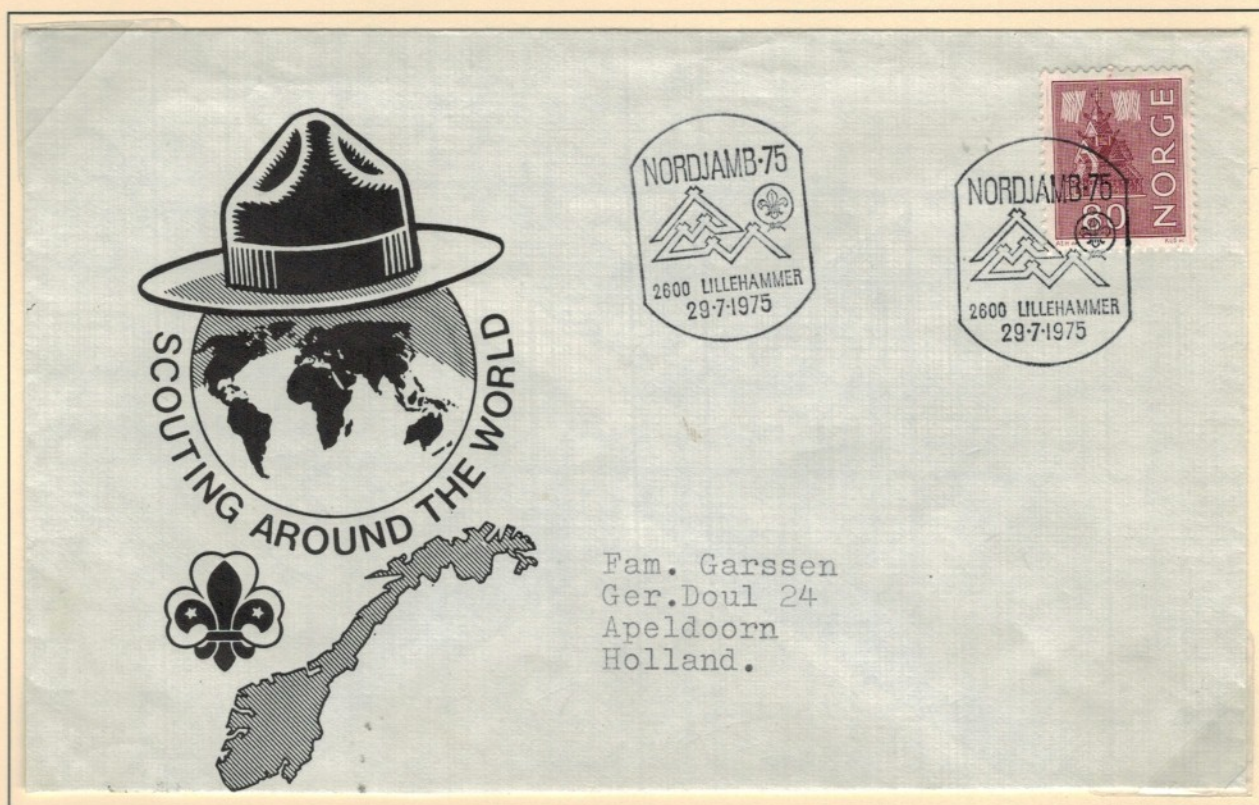

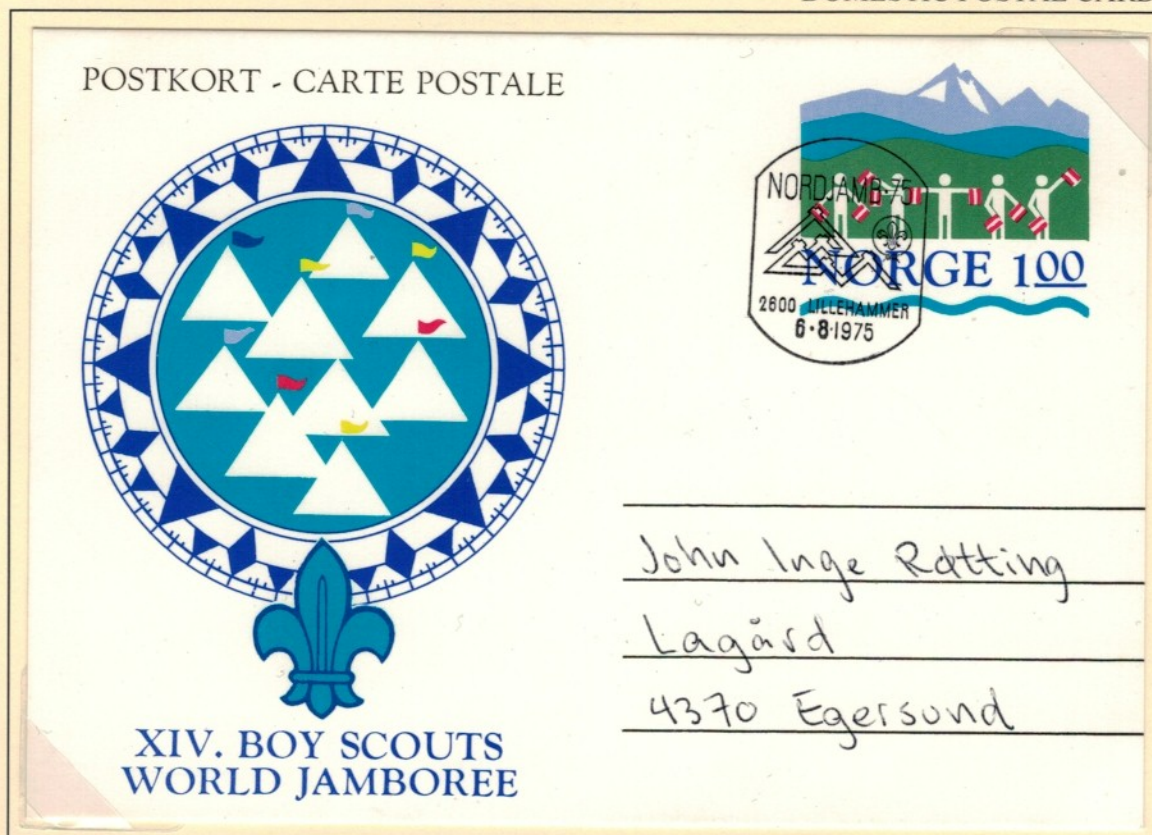

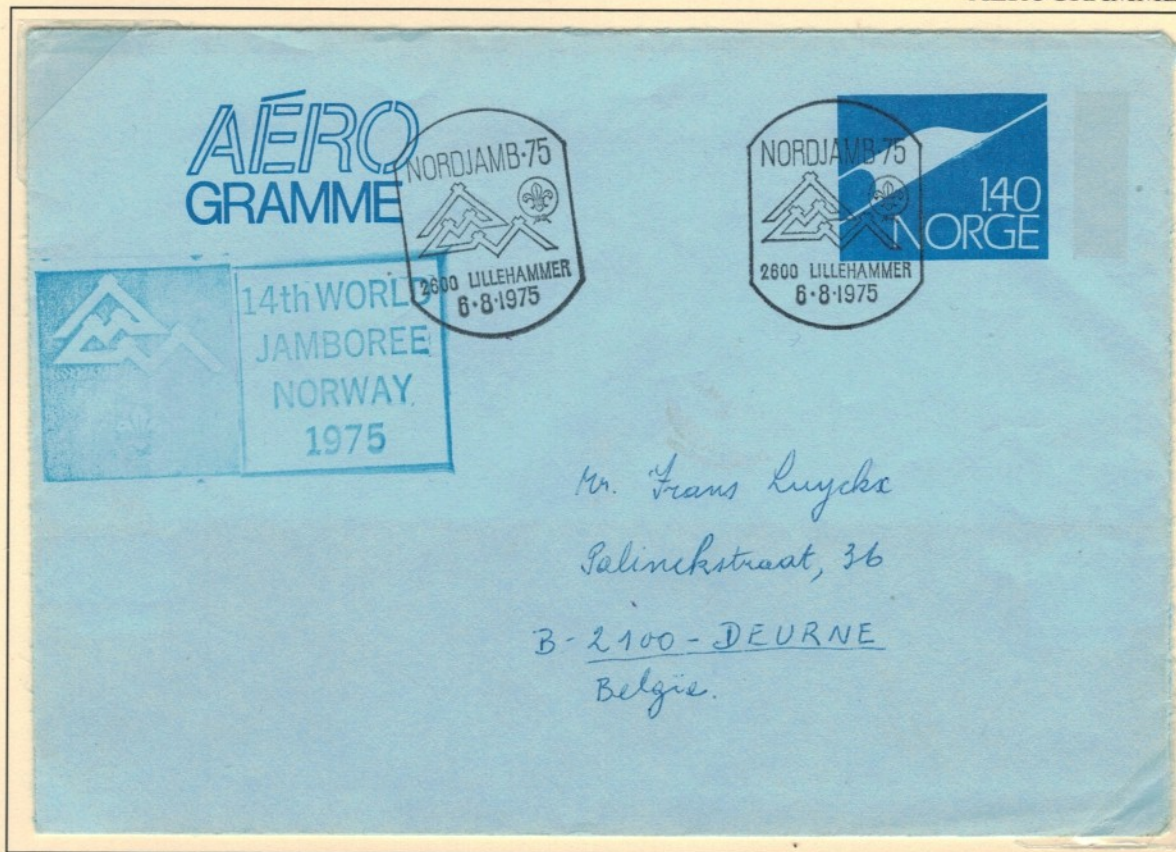

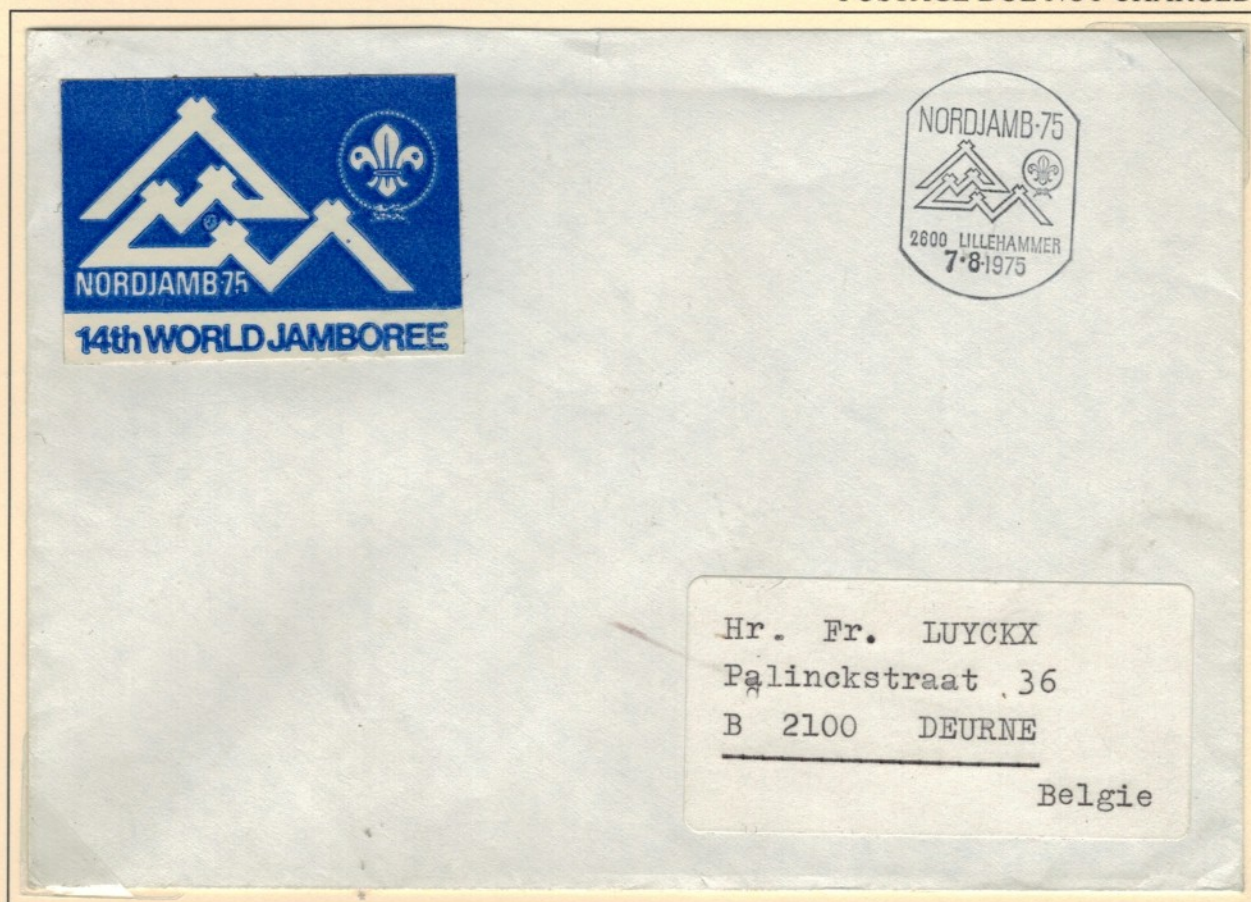
IRC SOLD AT NORDJAMB-75

The vast majority of mail posted at Nordjamb-75 was correctly franked. The Jamboree Postmaster commented that this was quite remarkable since most of the campers were working in a strange currency. Postage due tax marks were not applied on outgoing underpaid mail. It seems quite clear that the Jamboree post office staff was hard pressed most of the time and simply turned a blind eye on such misdemeanours.

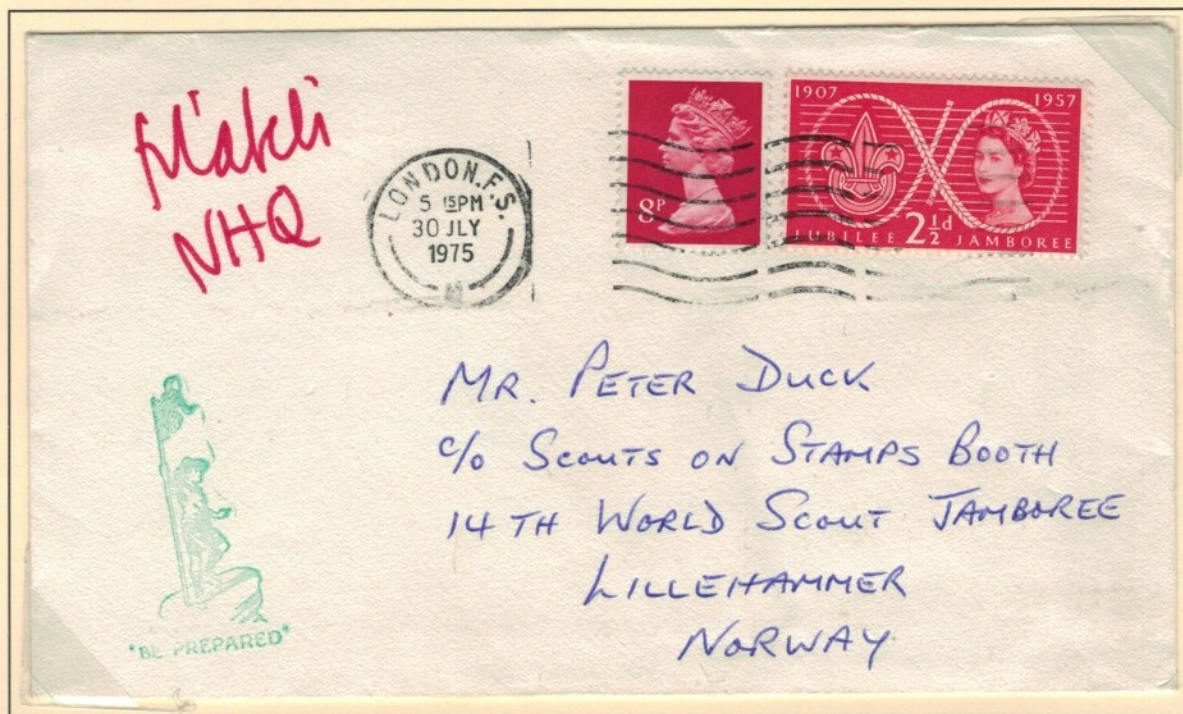
Unfranked letter to Belgium from Nordjamb-75 7-8-1975. No postage due markings.

Postage due is the term used for mail sent with insufficient postage. A postage due stamp is a stamp added to an underpaid piece of mail to indicate the extra postage due. In 1975, the fee was twice the insufficient postage.

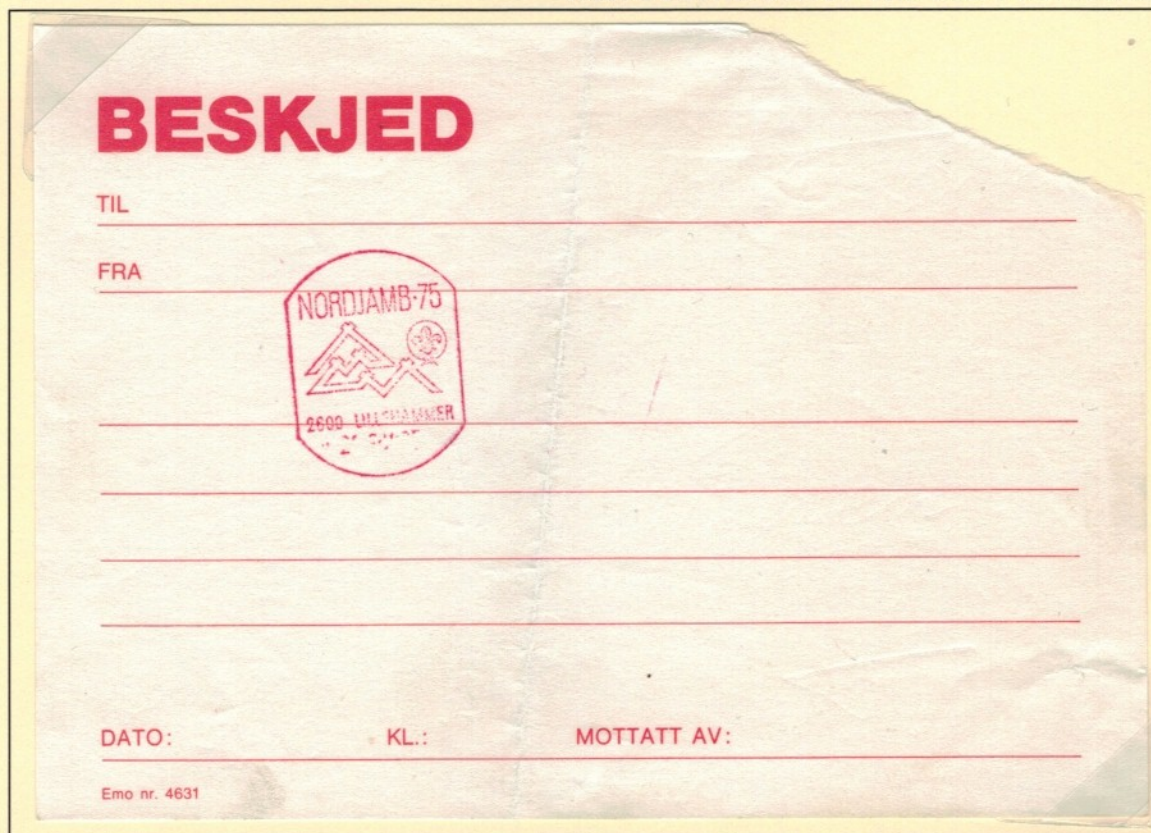

The Red Postmark

The postmark is invariably struck in black. One red mark has been recorded, impressed on unused non-descript stationery. It appears that in the Home Hospitality tent next door to the Jamboree Post Office a rubber handstamp of the official design was in use on July 29 which was the opening day. Thereafter the date was defaced or cut away. As the only colour ink pad in the tent was red that was the colour used. It is thus clear that the use of the red postmark is non-postal.

The only recorded copy of the postmark struck in red.

Nordjamb-75 was before the mobile phone era. In each of the subcamps two public phone boxes were installed from which international direct dial calls could be made. The Press Center was well serviced with telephone, telegraph and telex facilities.

Telegrams could be sent by telephone from the subcamps or by orthodox means from the telegraph office situated above the press office.

Telephone, telegraph and telex are not postal services in Norway.

3. The Jamboree Postal Arrangements Post Office Savings Bank

The Norwegian Post Office Savings Bank (Norges Postsparebank) was founded 1948 after a major political battle, with the goal to encourage savings. The bank offered its services through all Norwegian post offices.

41 deposits were made at Nordjamb-75, and there were 338 withdrawals from Norwegian accounts. There were 168 withdrawals from Swedish accounts and 5 from Finnish accounts.

Outgoing Parcels to abroad

178 parcels to abroad were sent from Nordjamb-75. Numbers to each country were not recorded.

PARCEL TO THE UNITED STATES

For parcels to the United States, a buff coloured, tie-on label (form Bl.181) had to be completed and affixed to the parcel, stating the contents and value and instructions for disposition of the parcel if not deliverable as addressed.

The twin-language Norwegian and English label and its rouletted stub were poststamped with the Nordjamb postmark, the stub being detached and retained by the exchange post office.

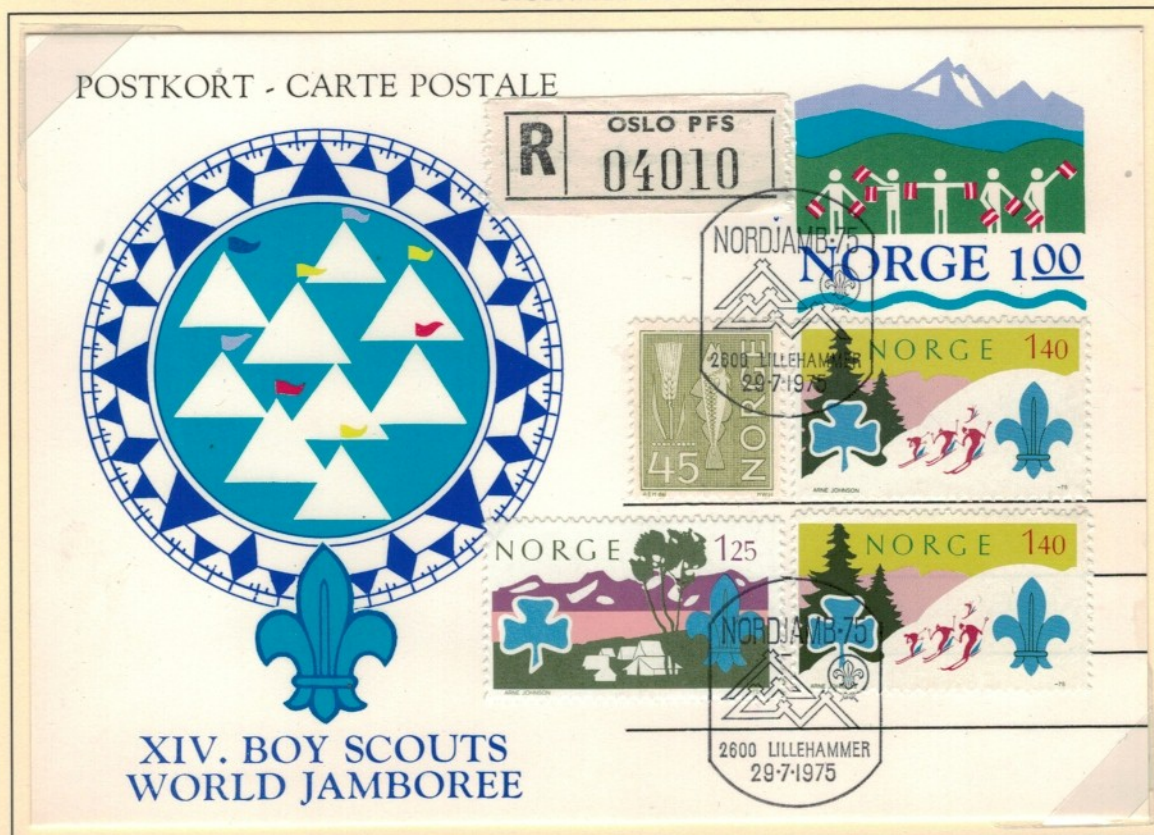

The registration fee during Nordjamb-75 was 450 øre to any destination, in addition to regular postage. A special registration label was used at Nordjamb-75, and the labels were used in numerical order. A total of 522 registered items got the special Nordjamb-75 registration labels. In addition, registered covers could be ordered from Norway Post Philatelic Services, Oslo.

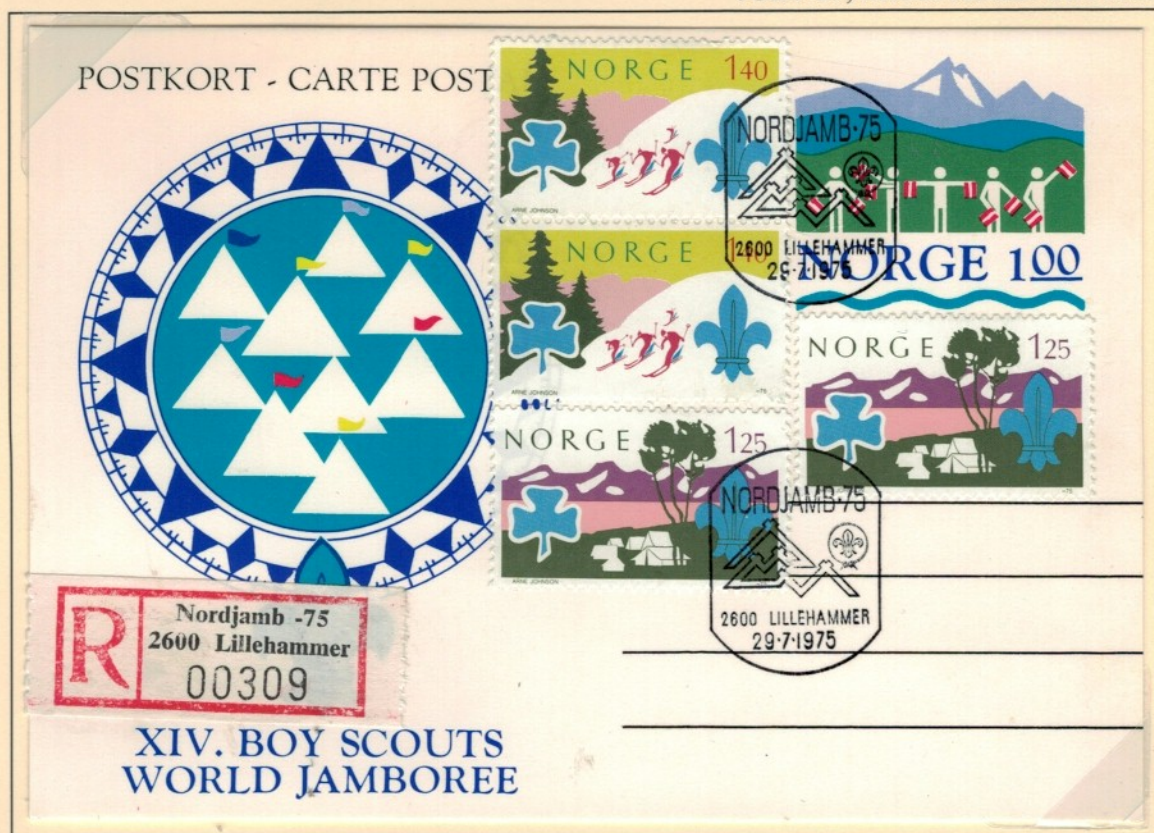

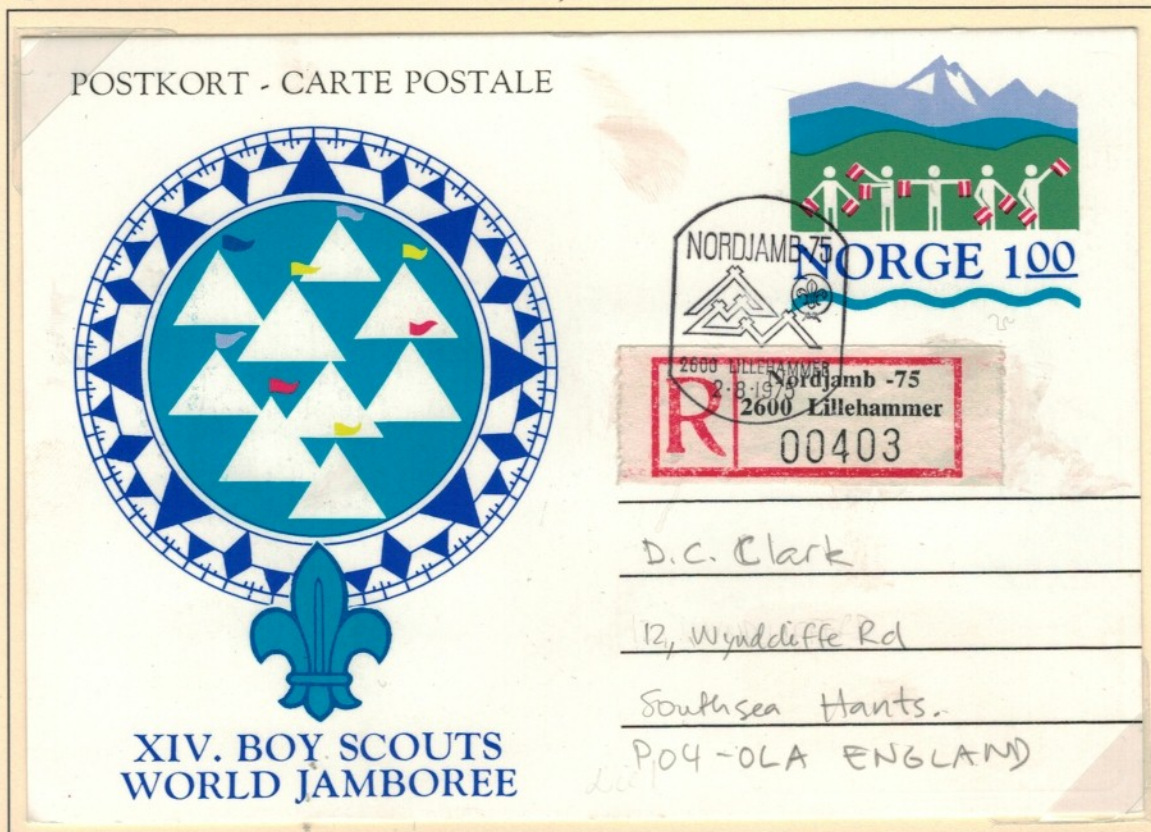

4. The Philatelic Arrangements

Overview

Philatelic traces can be found from the Jamboree Committee and Jamboree staff by way of covers, cachets etc. The Jamboree Post Office provided various free handouts, and had, in addition to the regular post office services, a philatelic sales bureau. Camp shops had postcards etc. for sale.

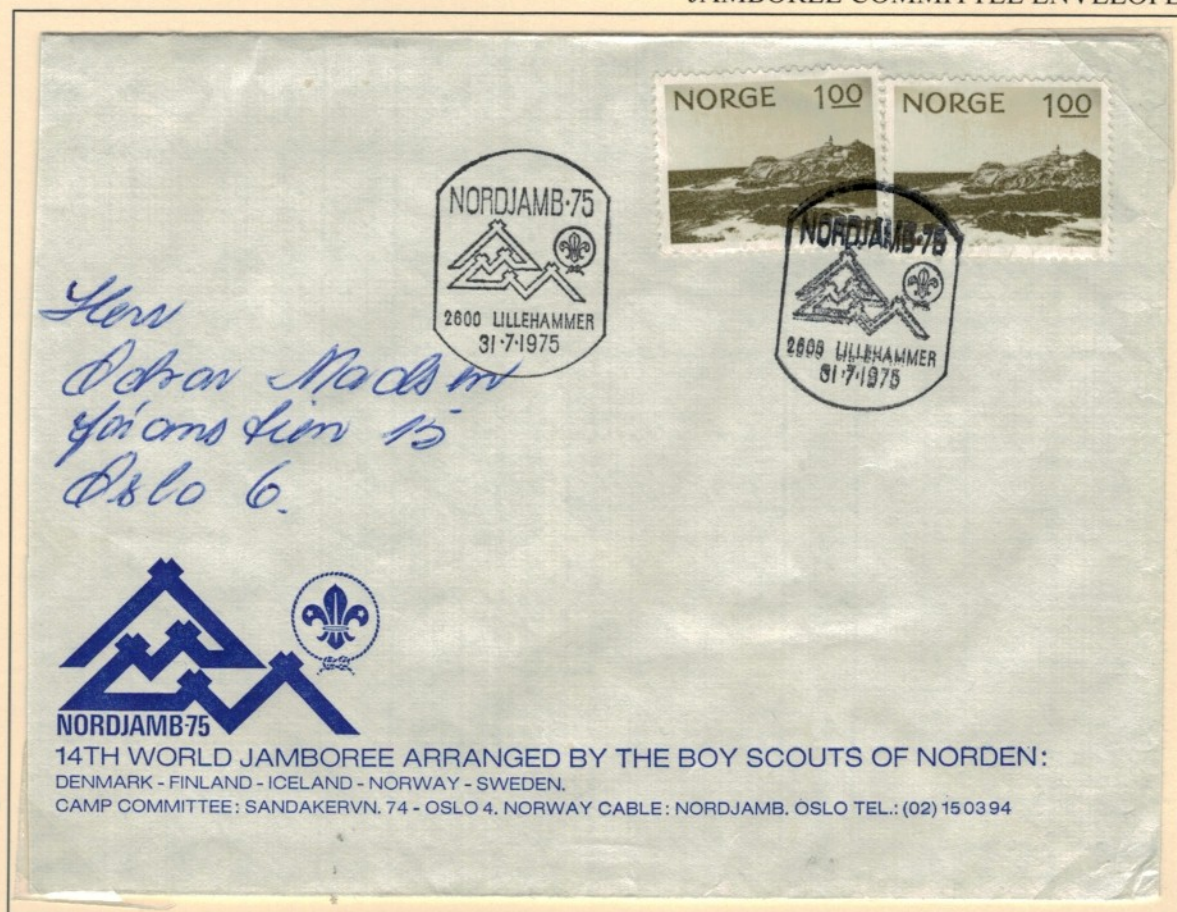
In the central Market Area adjacent to the Jamboree Post Office, a focus for philatelic interest was provided in the form of a marquee or large tent entitled Scout "U" Bank. The Scout "U" Bank gathers stamps of the world from donors for resale to collectors with all profits going to aid disabled Scouts.

The Scout "U" Bank tent housed a series of booths – all but one having philatelic interest:

- The Scout "U" Bank. Every Jamboree attendee was requested to bring 30 used stamps with him as a donation to the stamp bank. This booth was extremely well patronized because the material on offer had universal appeal
- Norwegian Scout Stamp Collectors; offering Norwegian FDC's, the Jamboree card cancelled on the day of issue, the Norwegian Scout HQ meter slogan and the two Austrian meter slogans
- The Swedish Scout Union, taking orders for the forthcoming issue of Swedish Scout stamps including FDCs, and Swedish Scout meter slogans
- The Danish Scout Stamp Collectors Club; offering Danish and Greenland Scout covers
- The Benelux Scout Stamp Club; offering Benelux Scout covers together with the Swiss meter slogan
- SSCC, the Scout Stamp Collectors Club (U.K.); offering Scout stamps & Scout covers of the world
- SOSSI, Scouts On Stamps Society International (U.S.A.); offering Scout covers
- The Badger's Club offered badges and patches not for sale but rather for trading; one patch in the pot for every one extracted

Finally, there are covers which private individuals have mailed from Nordjamb-75.

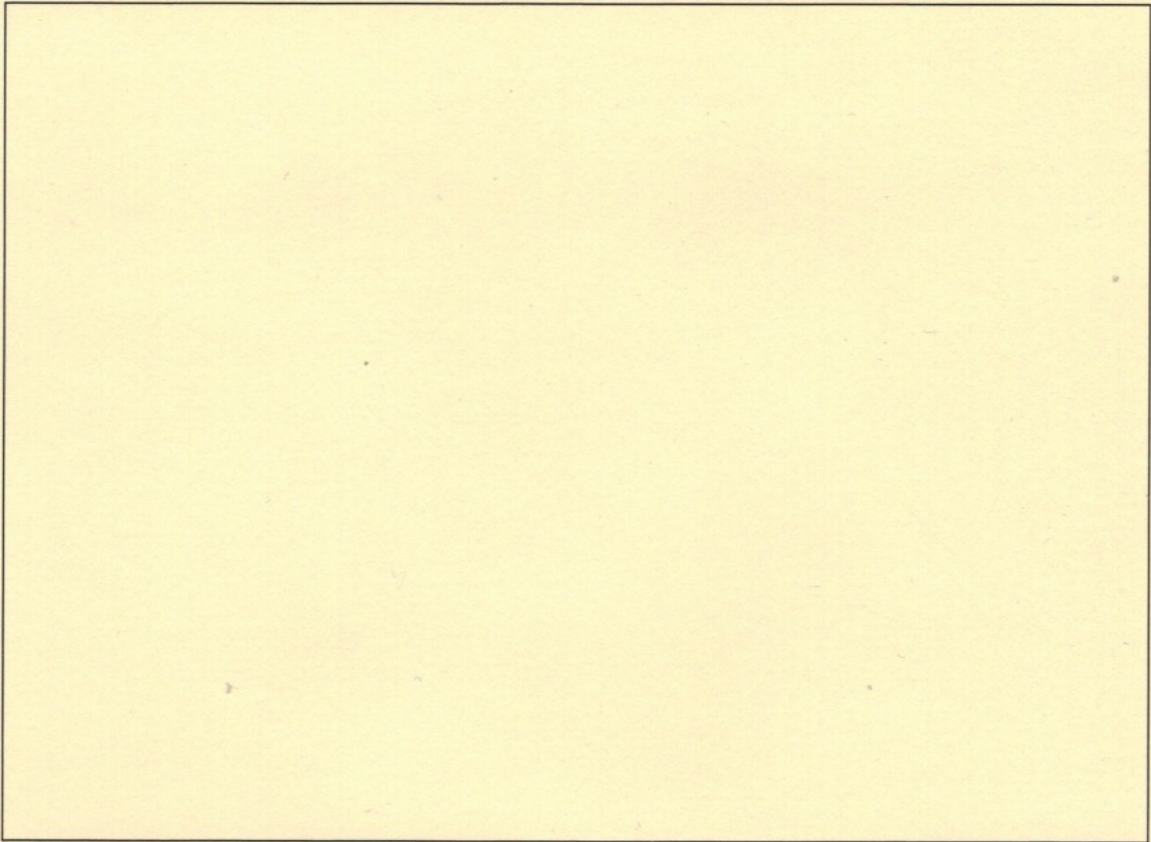
JAMBOREE COMMITTEE ENVELOPE



Letter to Oslo from Nordjamb-75 31-7-1975.

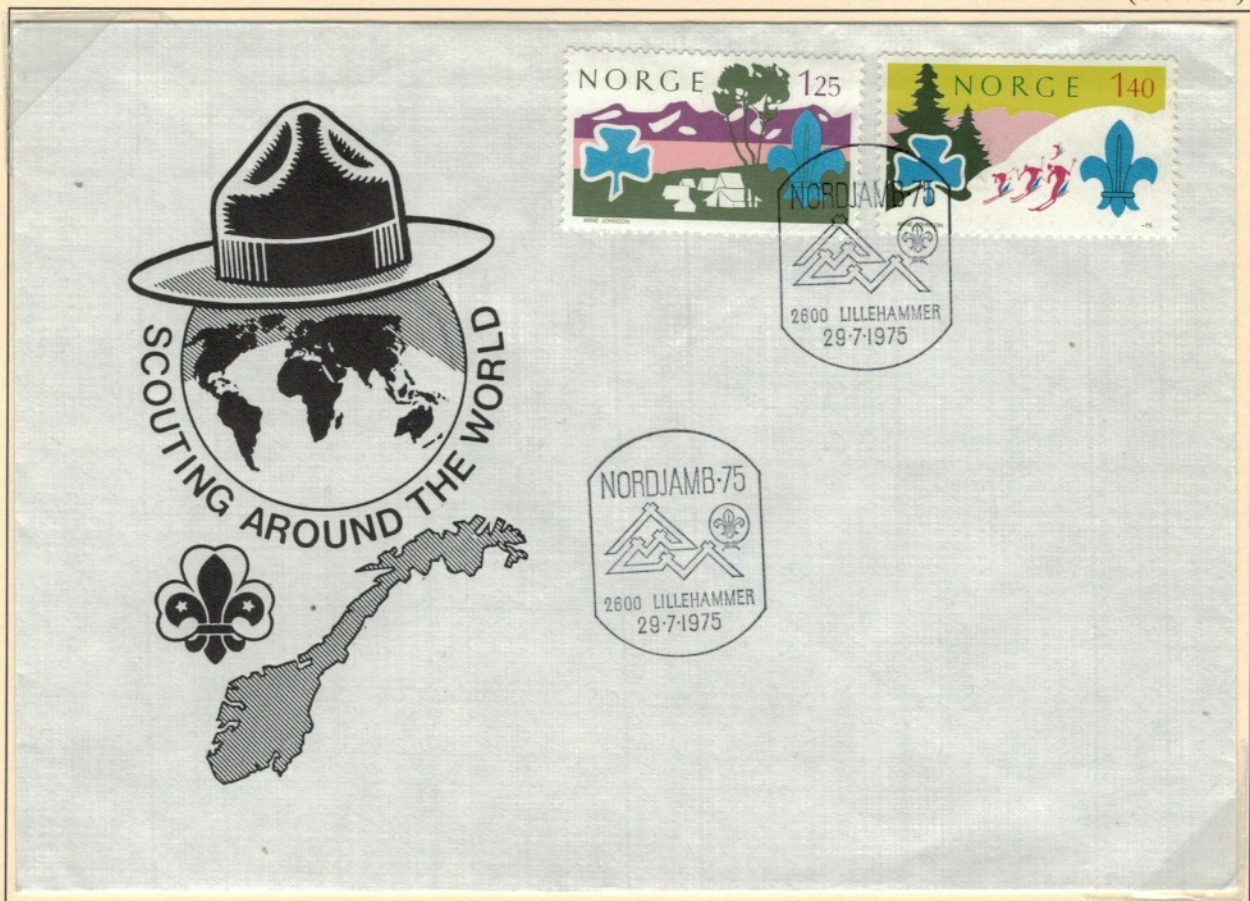

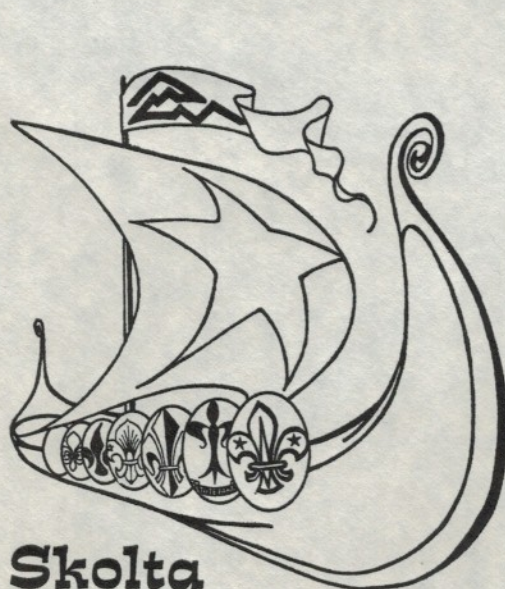

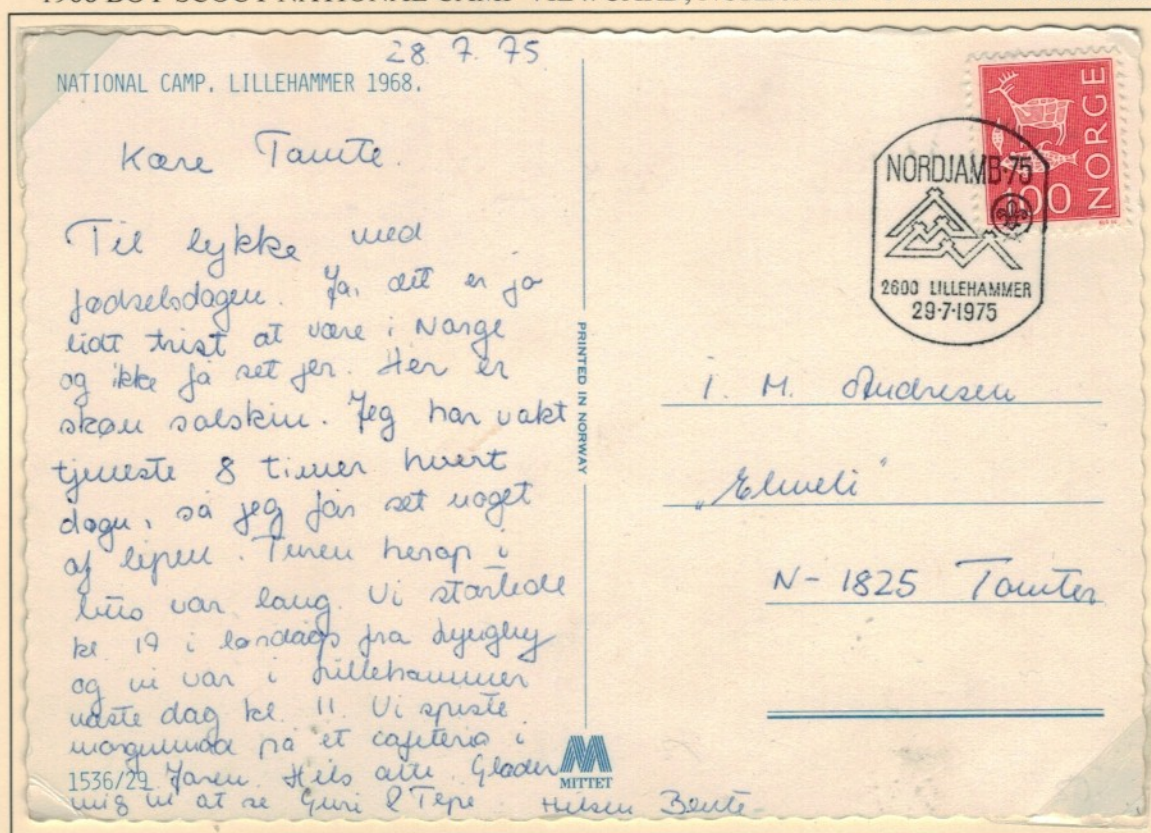

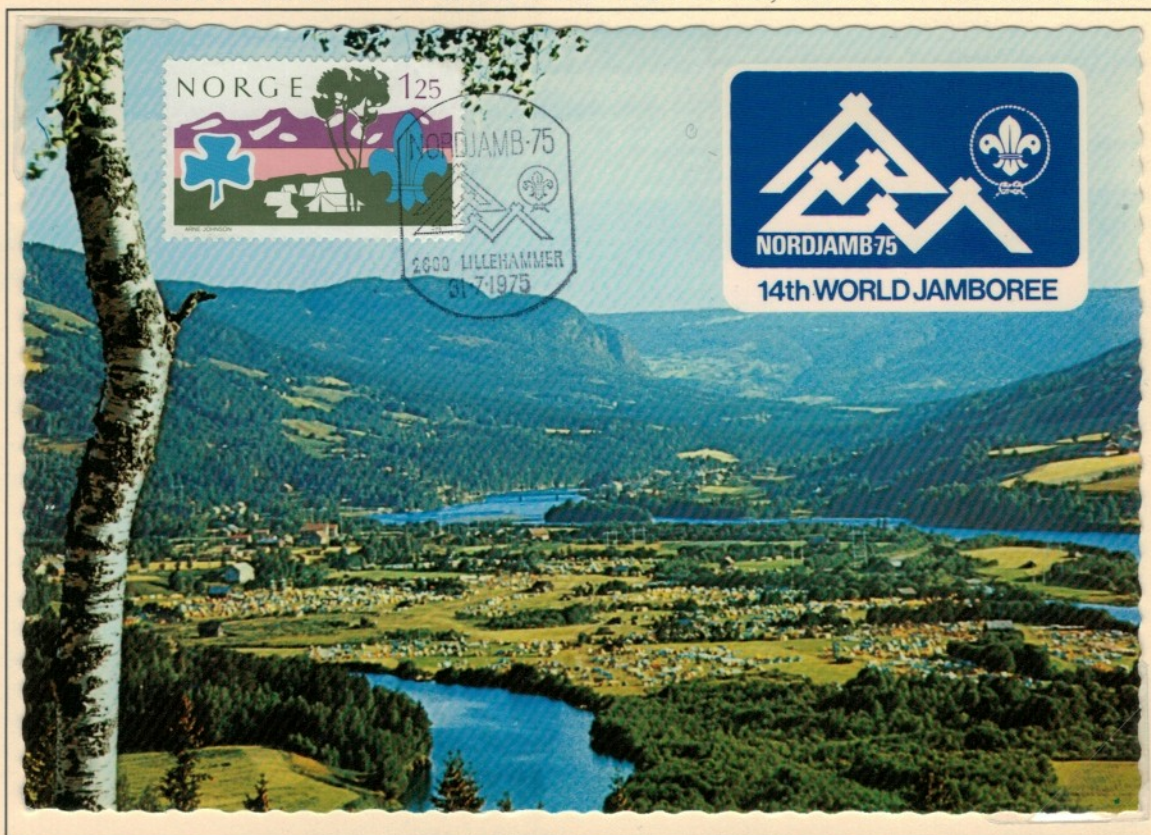

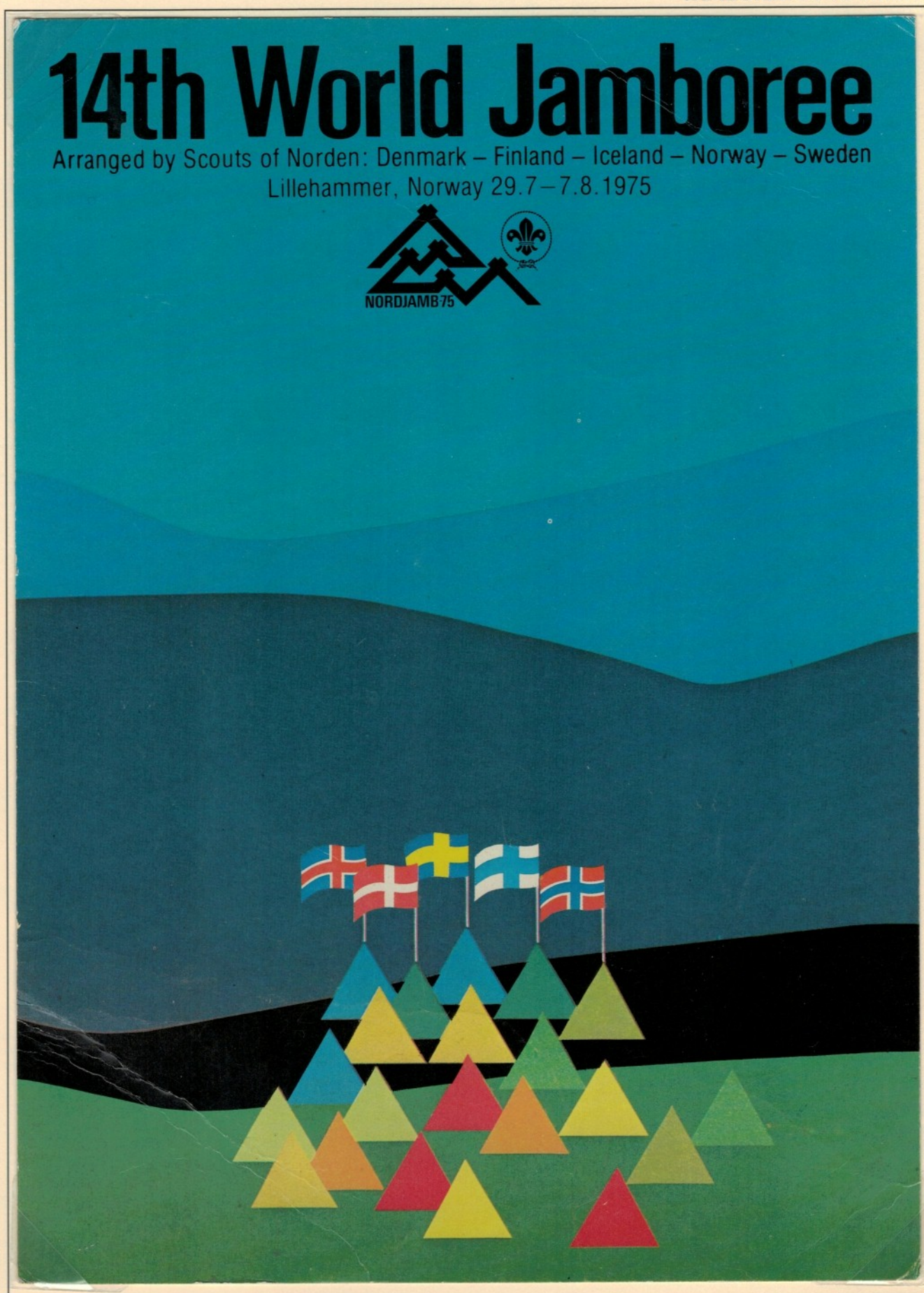

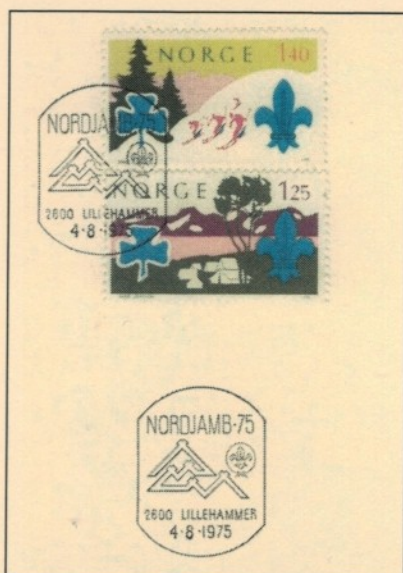

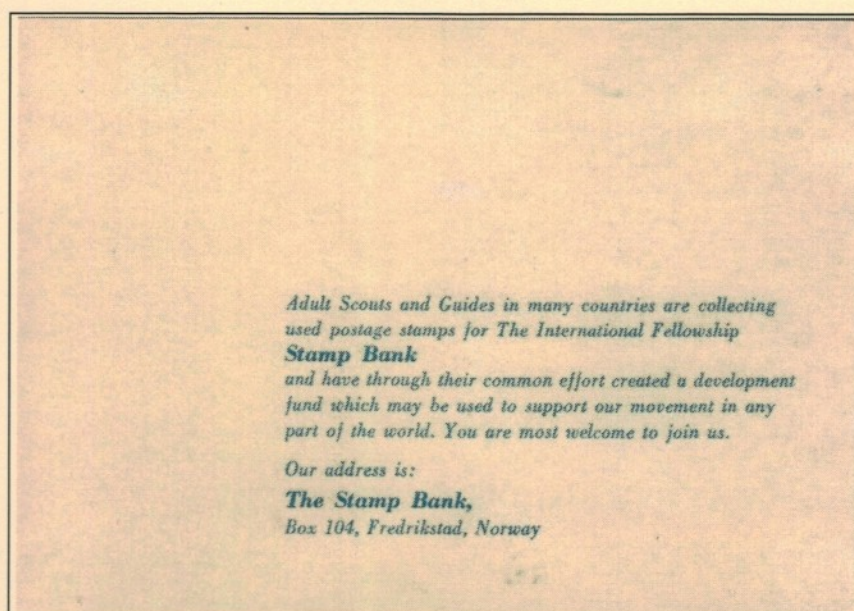

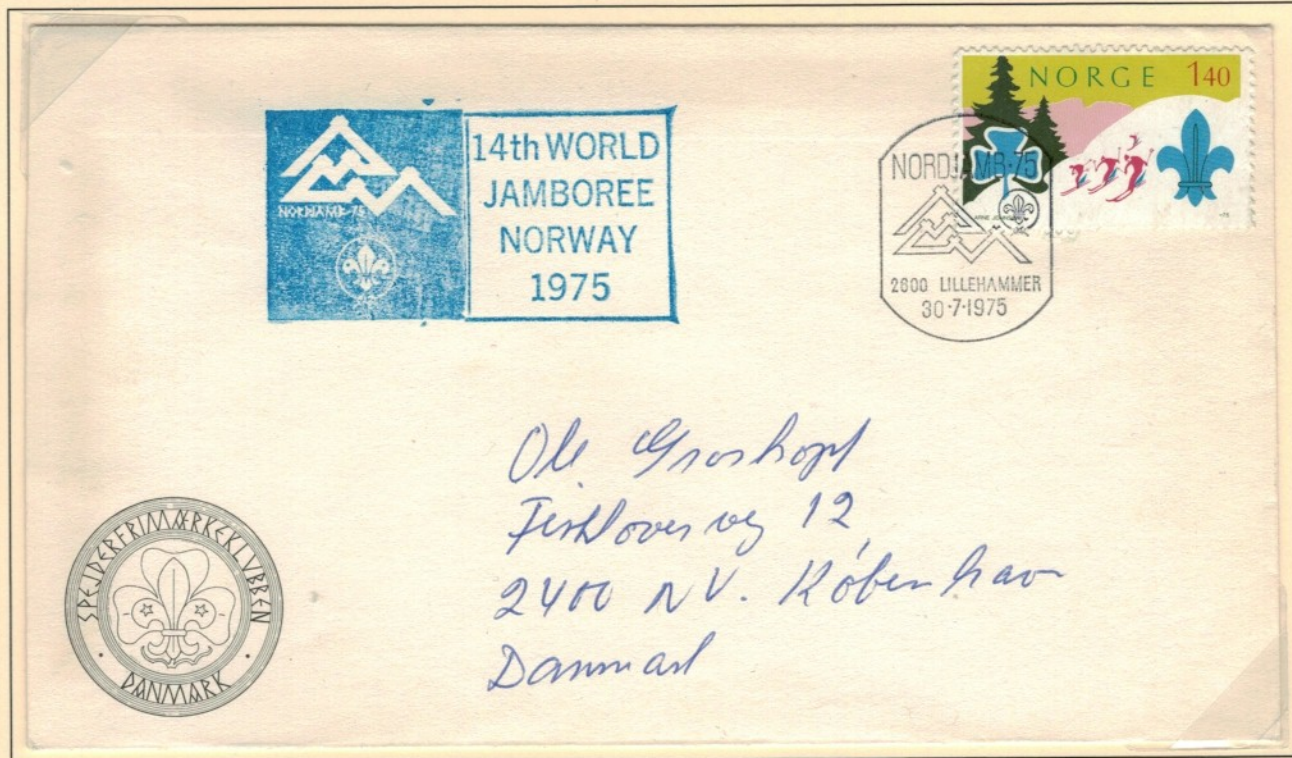

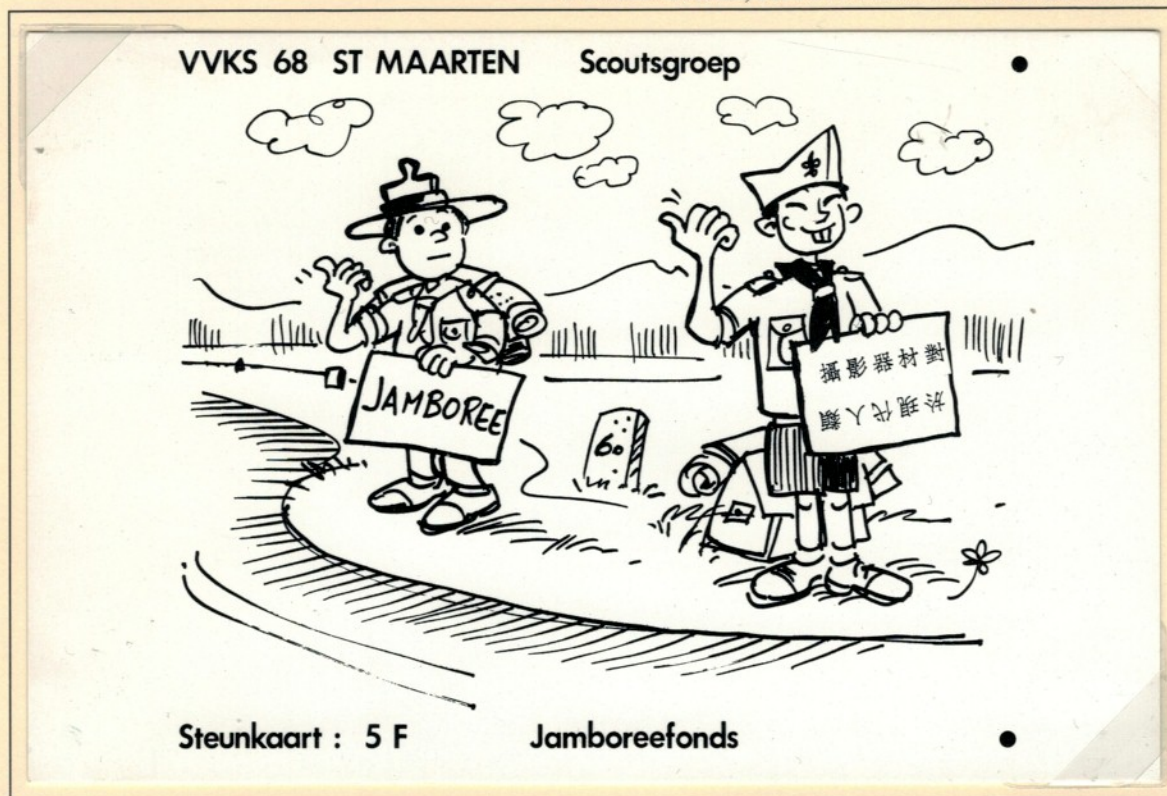

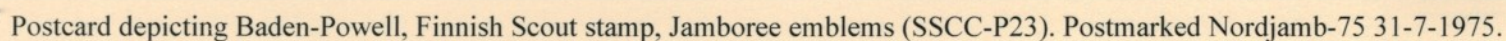

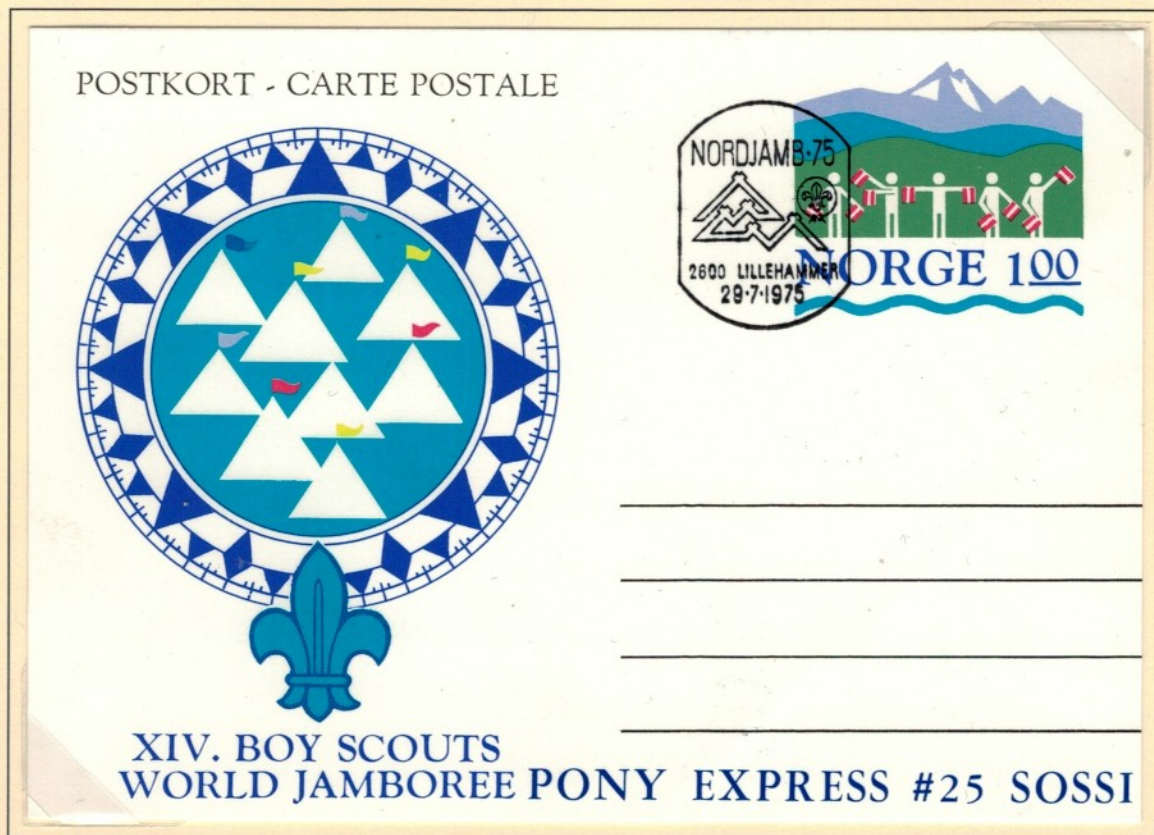

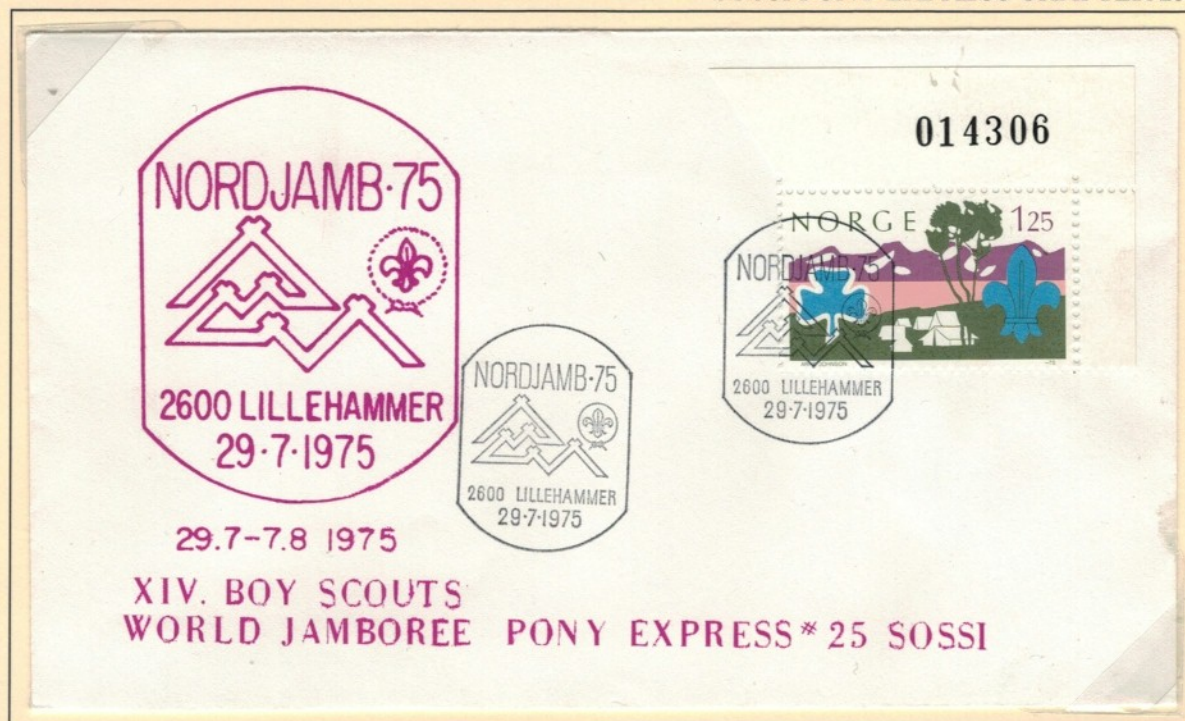

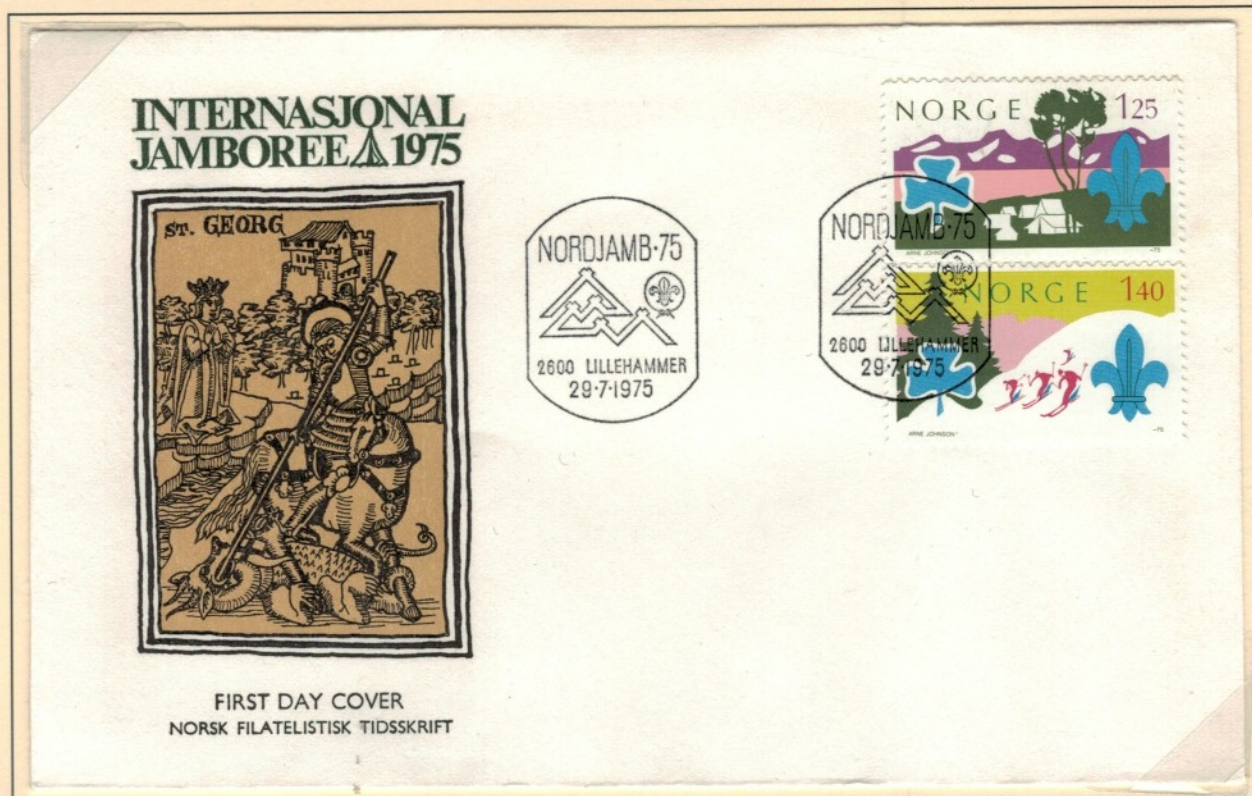

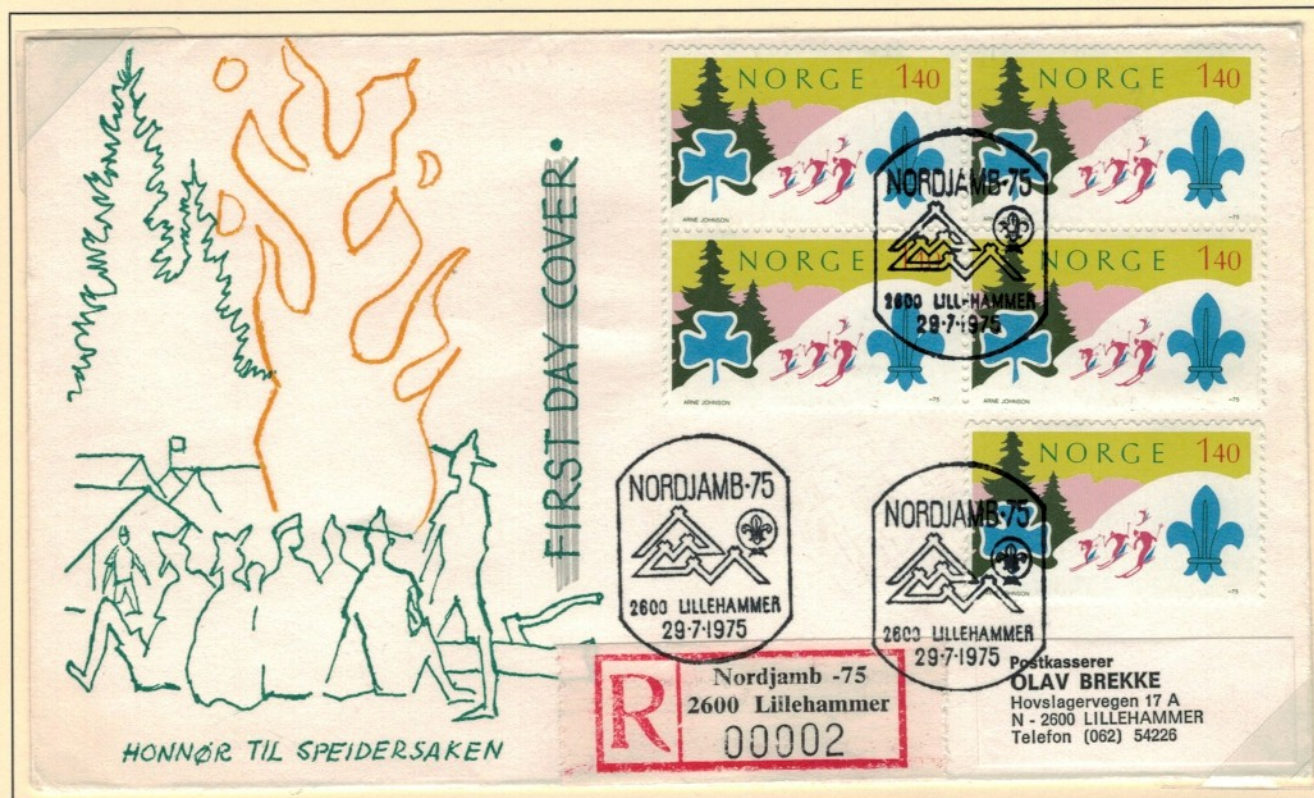

Overview

The contingents with Scouts and leaders were clustered into 10 subcamps which were run and staffed by the different Nordic countries and the major camp activities took place on a subcamp basis. The only activities that took place en mass were the opening and closing ceremonies and the Sunday religious services.

The Main Post Office was located in a large tent in the central Market area. The post office comprised two sections; a post office, staffed by four counter clerks, and a philatelic sales bureau staffed by 2-3 ladies.



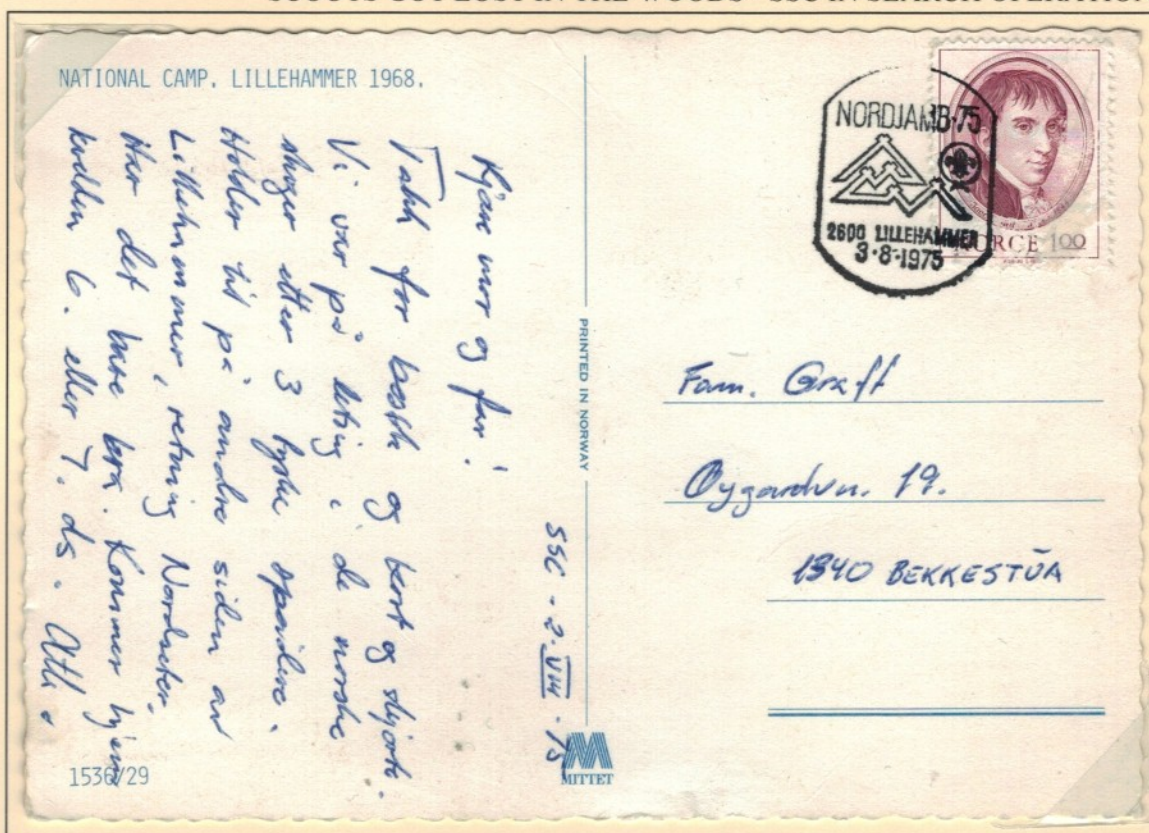

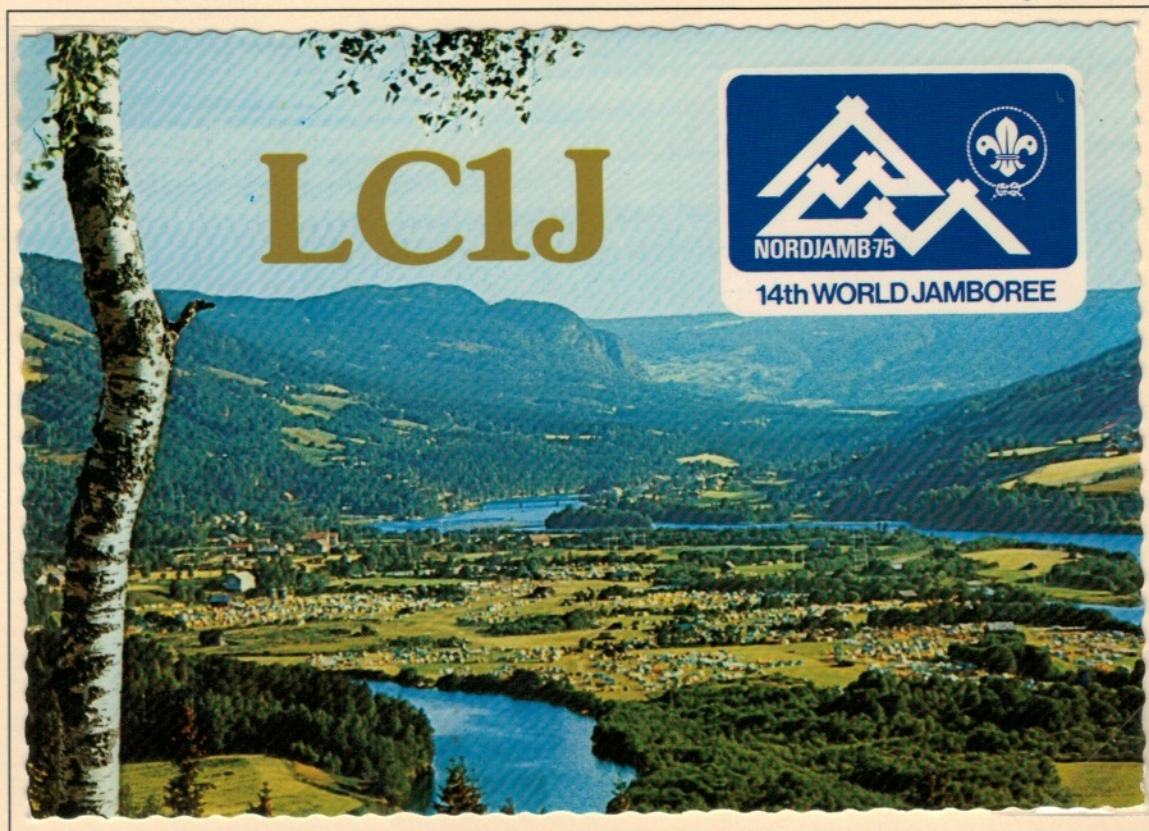

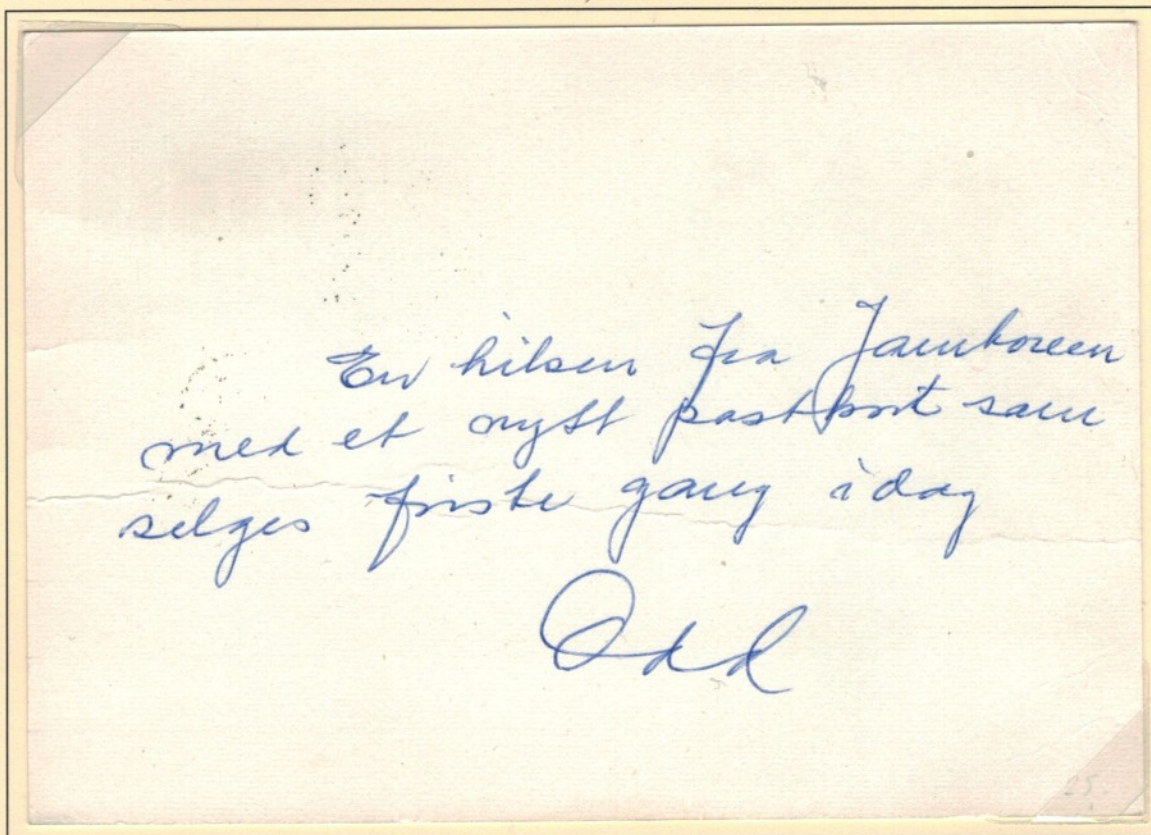

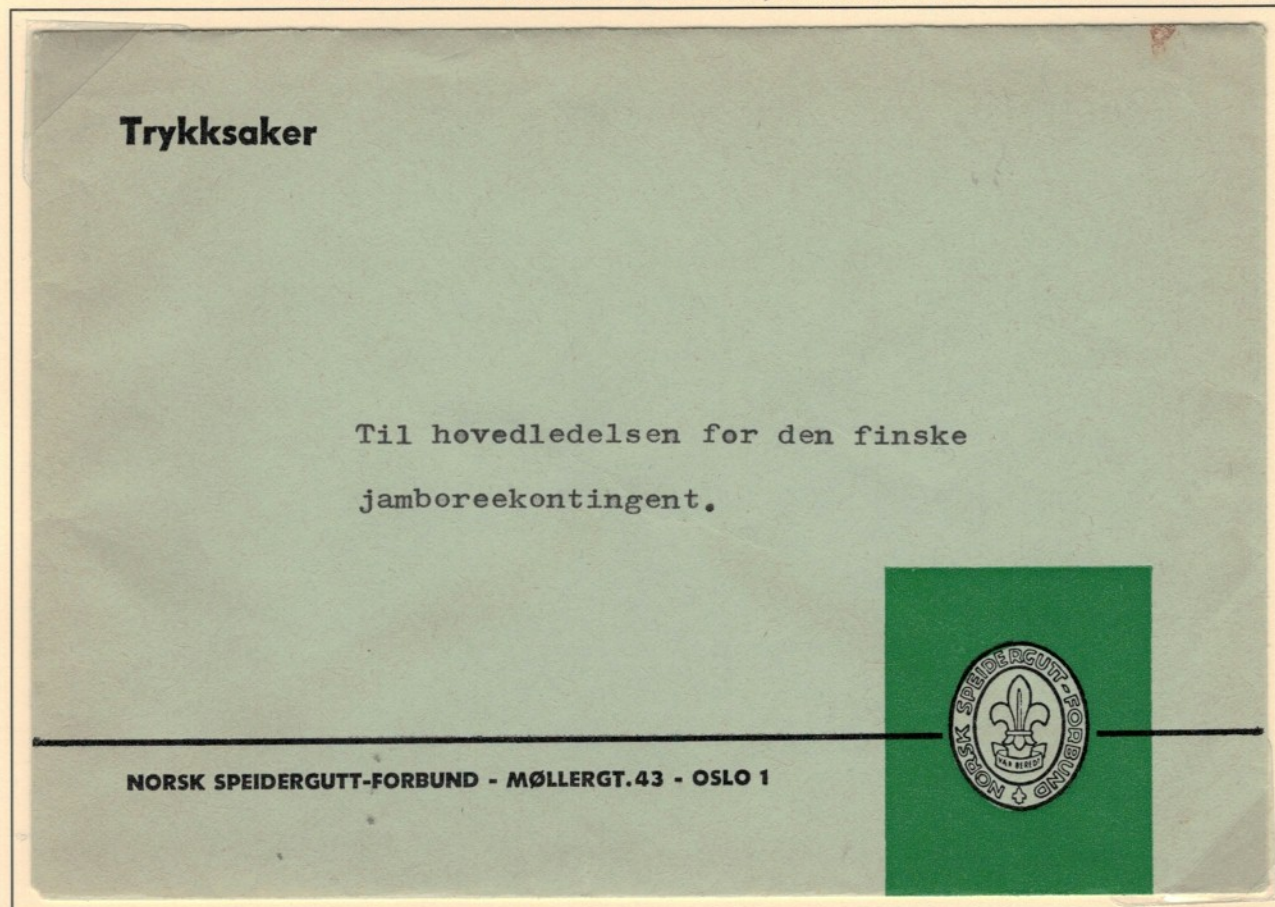

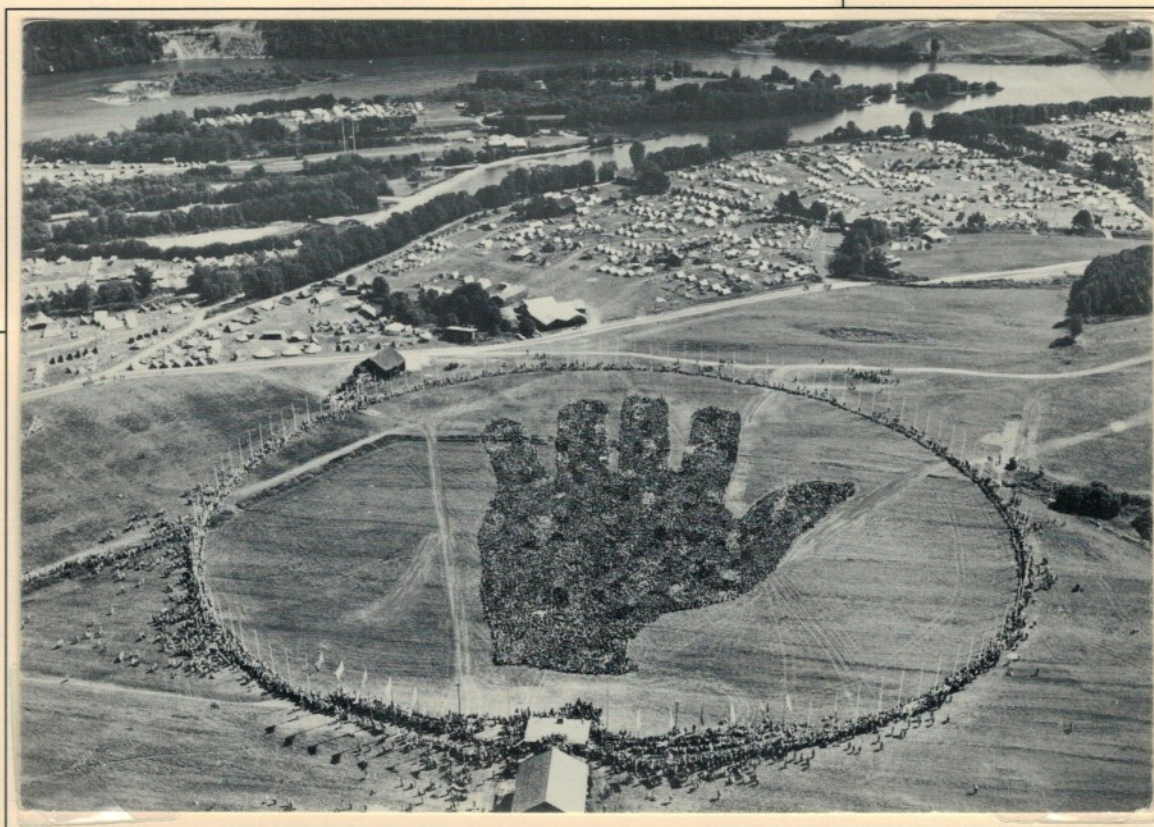

Each patrol was led by an experienced Scout from one of the Scandinavian countries.

The resulting 1,500 patrols were sent out to their starting point by bus, 750 on each day. 235 different routes varying from 12 to 25 km were in the surrounding mountains, mostly above the tree line of about 1,000 metres.

There were no tents provided for the overnight stop, but each patrol was provided with a large plastic sheet to serve as a bivouac shelter.

A safety team consisted of 100 members of the Norwegian Army with a helicopter available.

Special maps were made, as well as a leaflet that told what the scouts could expect in the Norwegian mountains. The hike was extremely successful, and gave good team spirit in the patrols.

The hike patrols re-joined at the Jamboree closing ceremony.

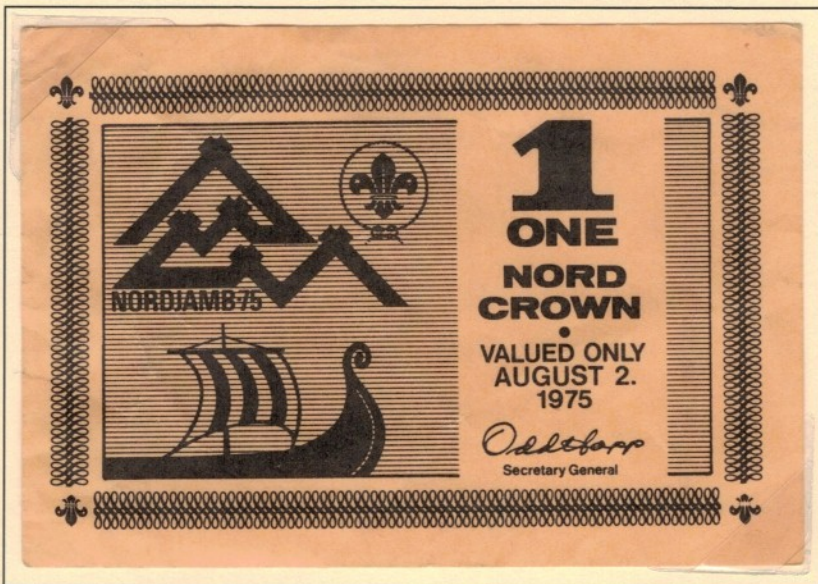

"I have many memories of the my time at the jamboree. From hiking in the mountains in international patrols, a visit to Maihaugen cultural museum, to all the fun of the Saturday Jamboree Country Fair. The King of Norway opened the Jamboree, along with visits by the King of Sweden and the Crown Prince of Morocco.

As a troop we experienced all of these, plus more. I have vivid memories of waking up the first morning at the campsite to find that right next door was an encampment containing girls. I was pleasantly surprised, but it was really fun to watch the boys in my troop [mostly aged 15 or 16] try and impress our neighbors.

That same day, or rather that evening, we all discovered the camp canteen. Much to my suprise, for the small sum of 2 kroner anyone could buy a bottle of official jamboree beer, complete with the international scouting symbol. The next morning we had a bunch of 15 and 16 year old scouts experiencing their first hangover which was further aggravated by breakfast consisting of hardbread, cheese, and pickled kippers. It was a sight to behold watching the boys."

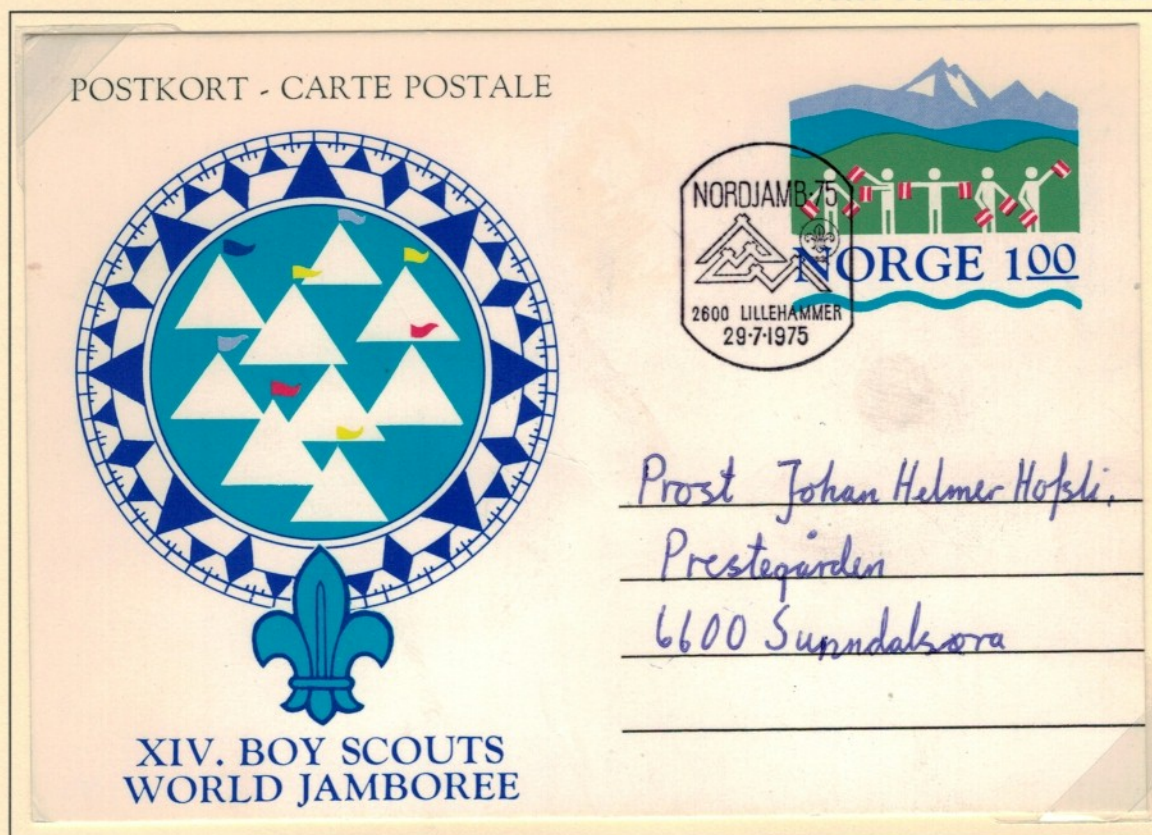

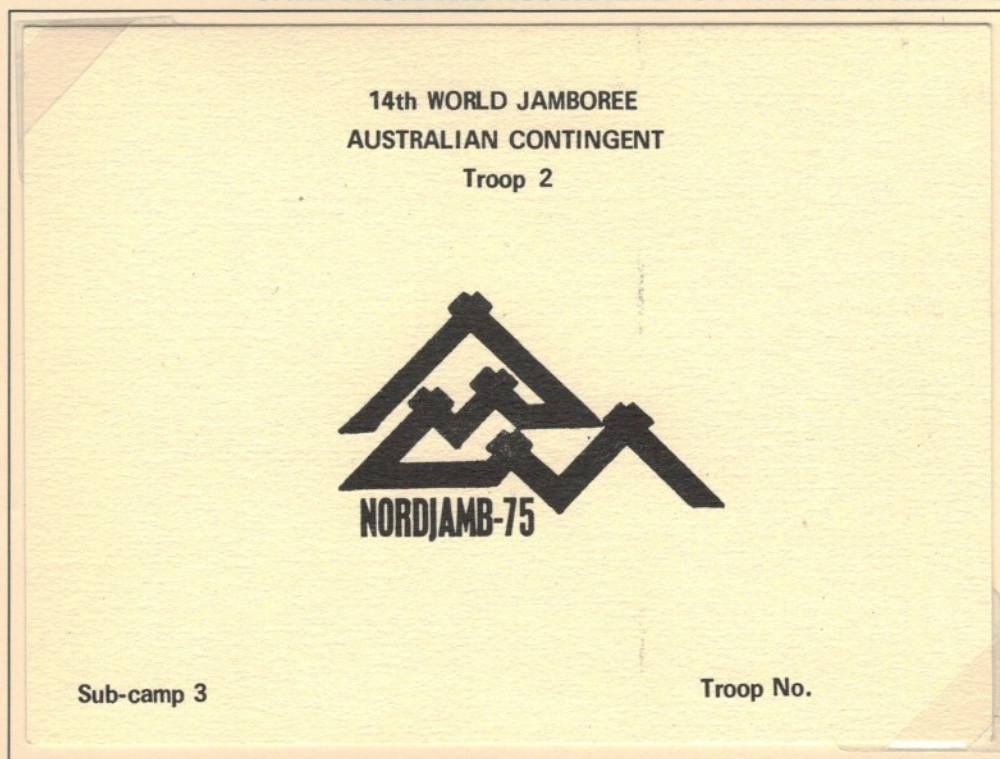

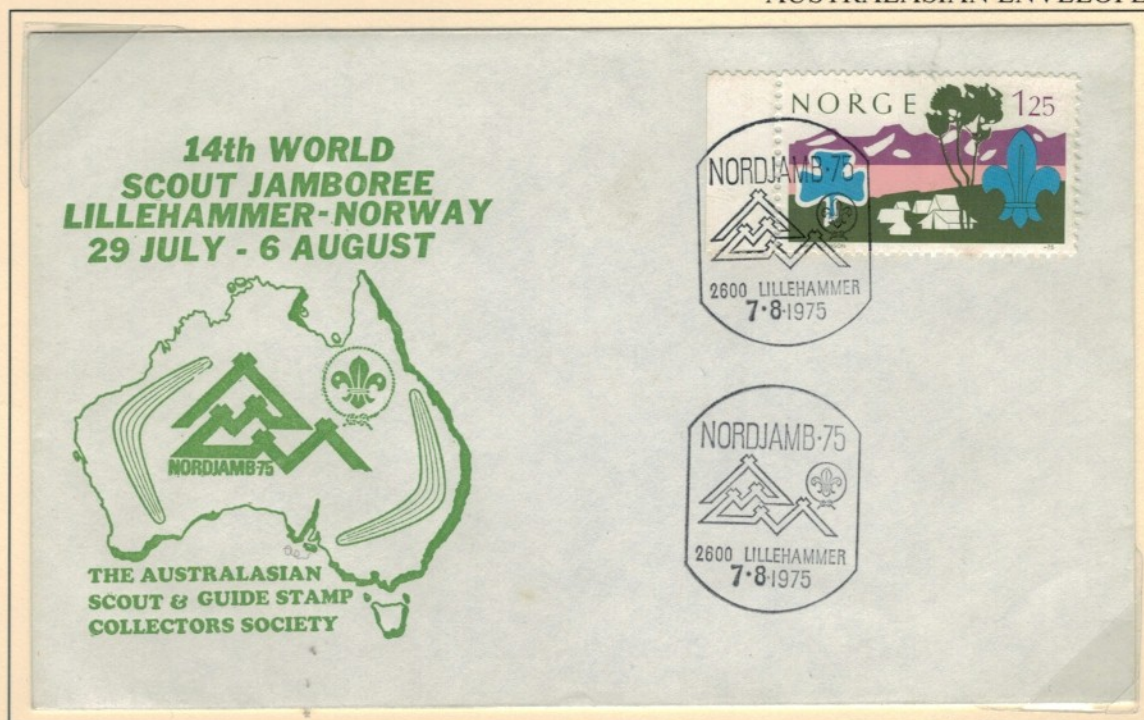

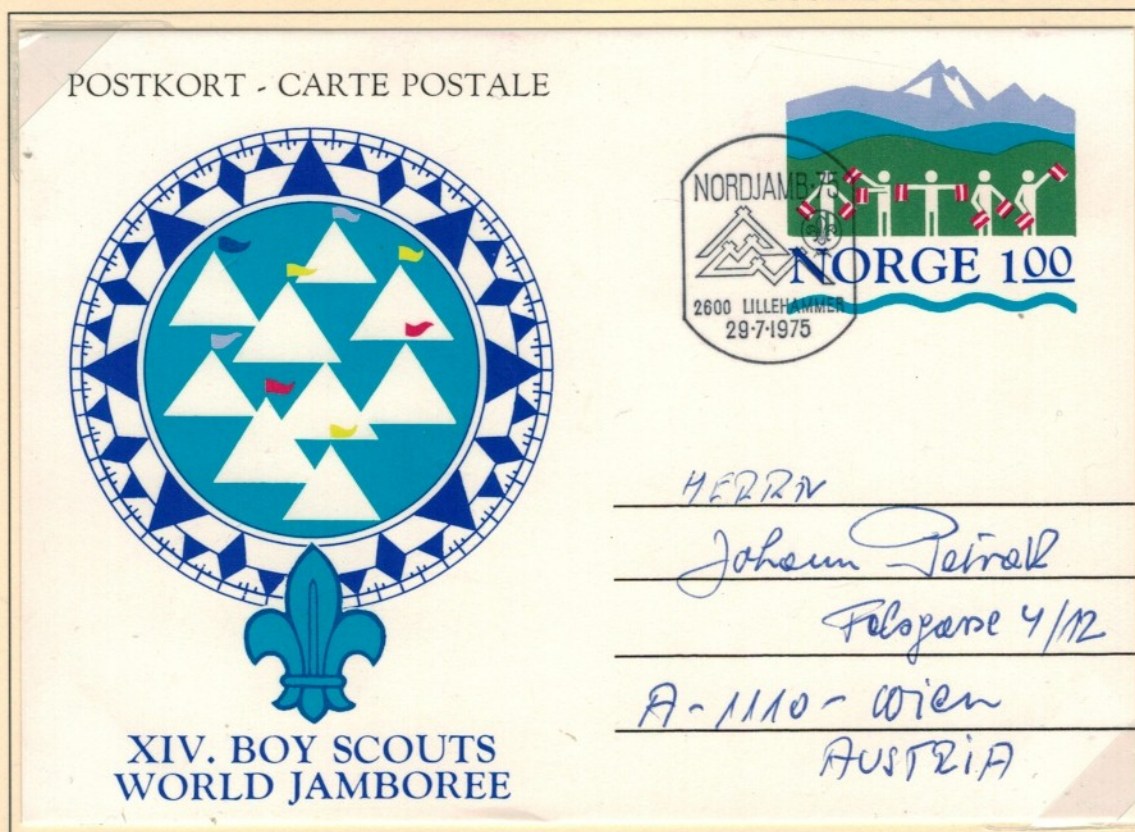

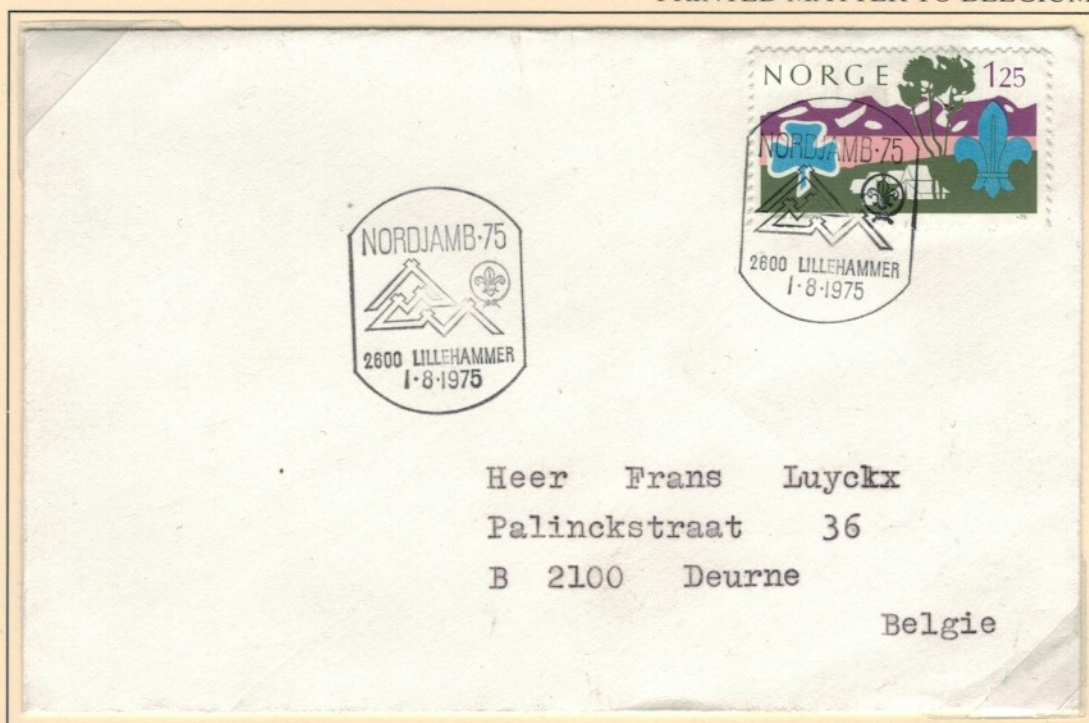

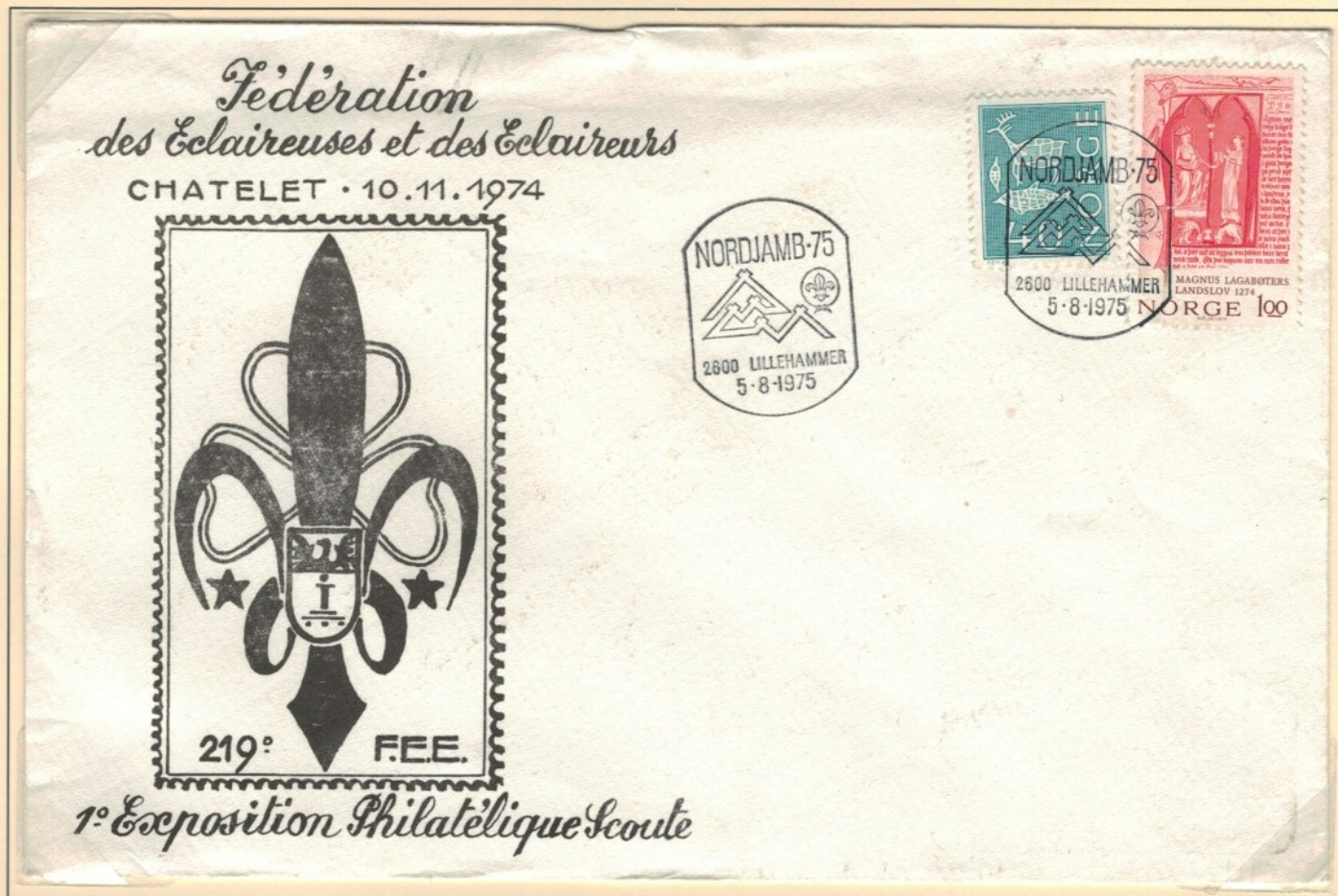

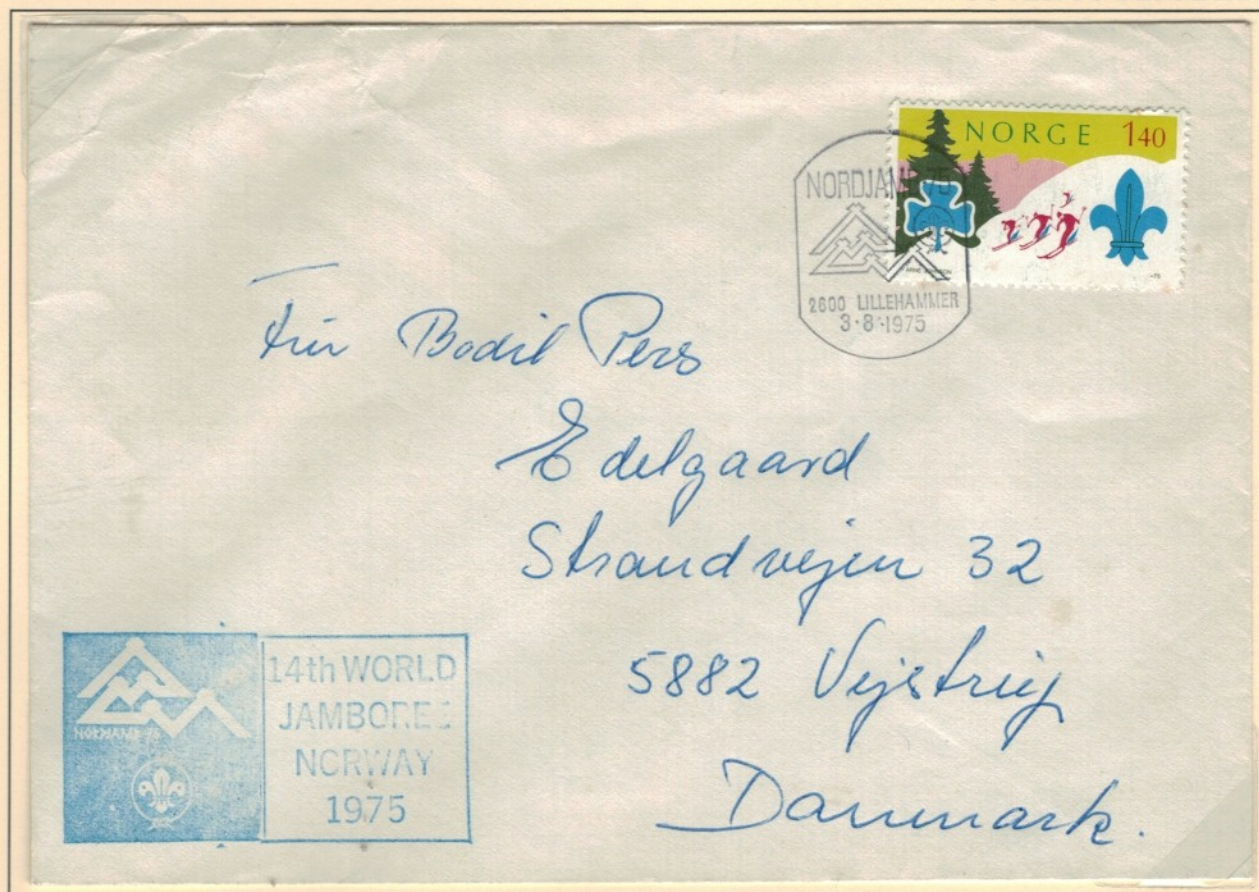

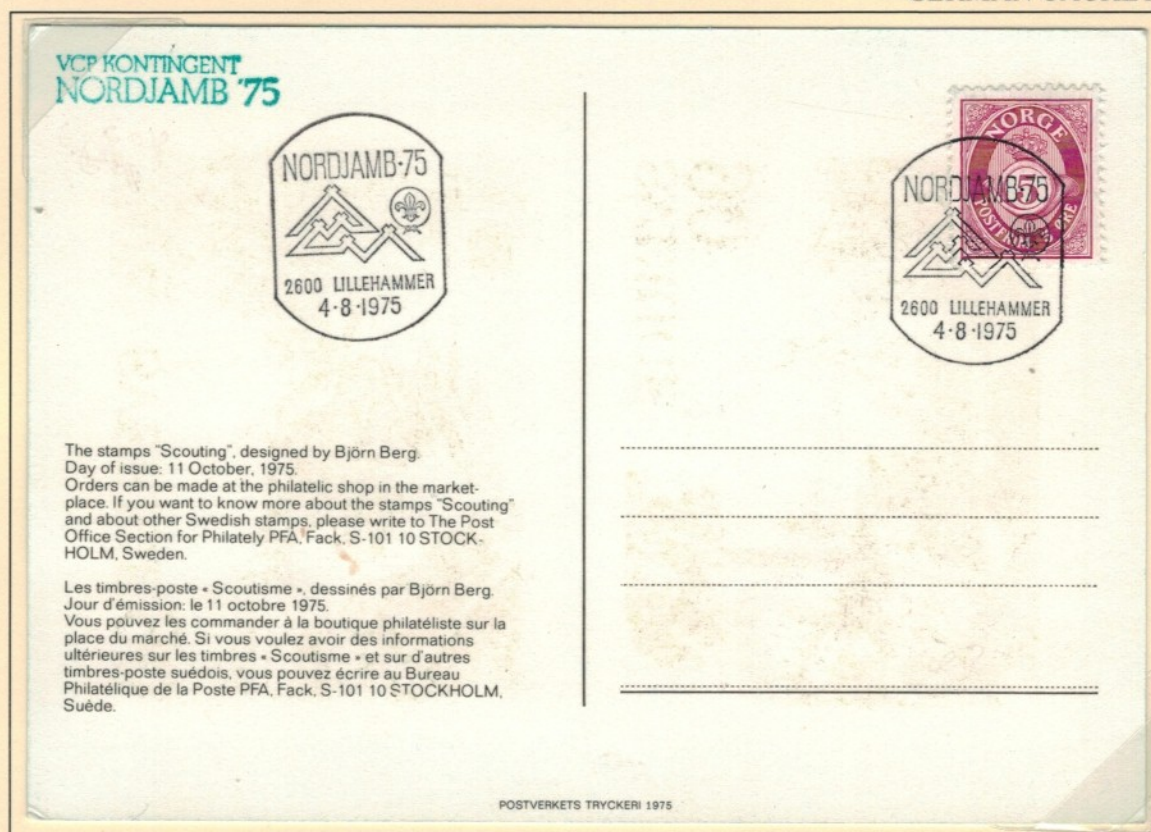

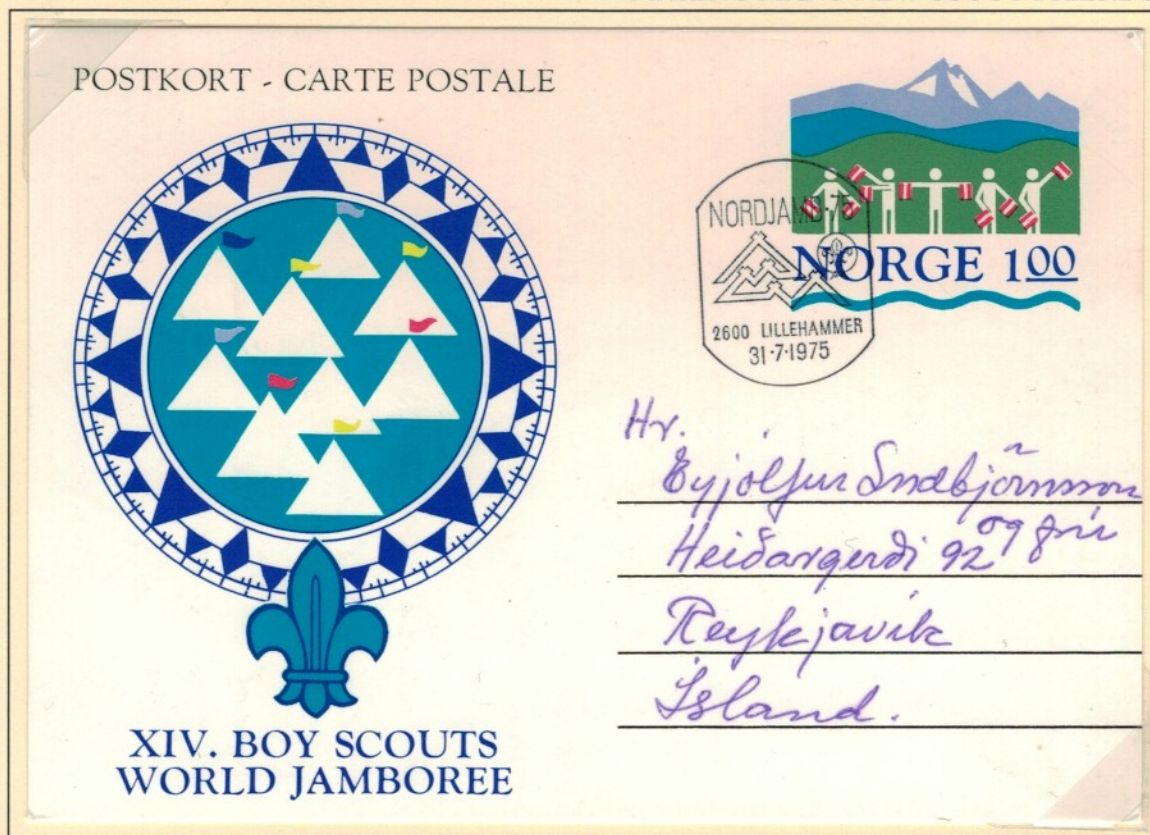

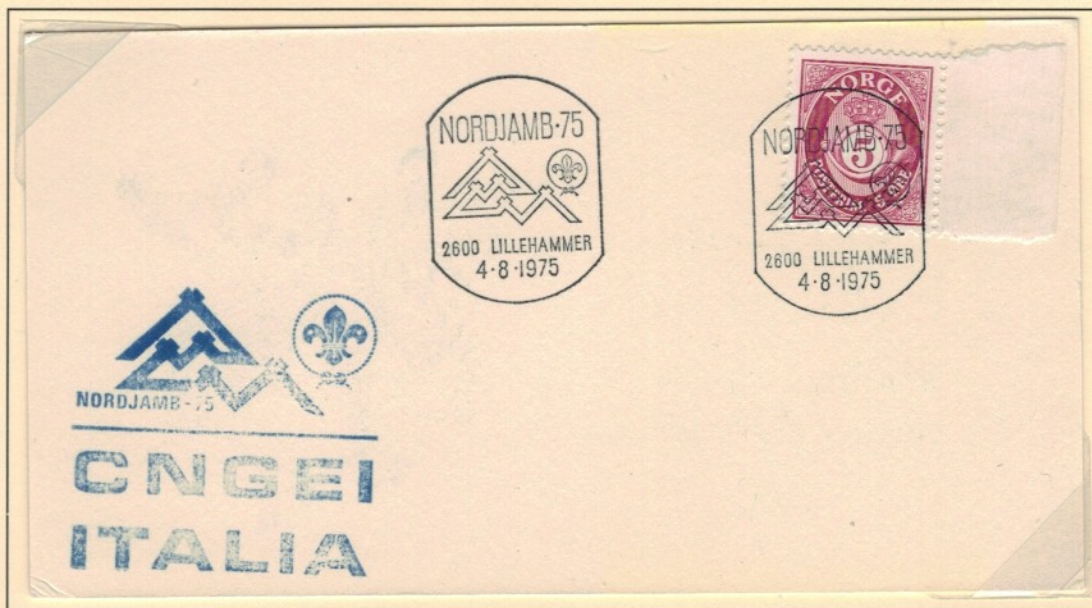

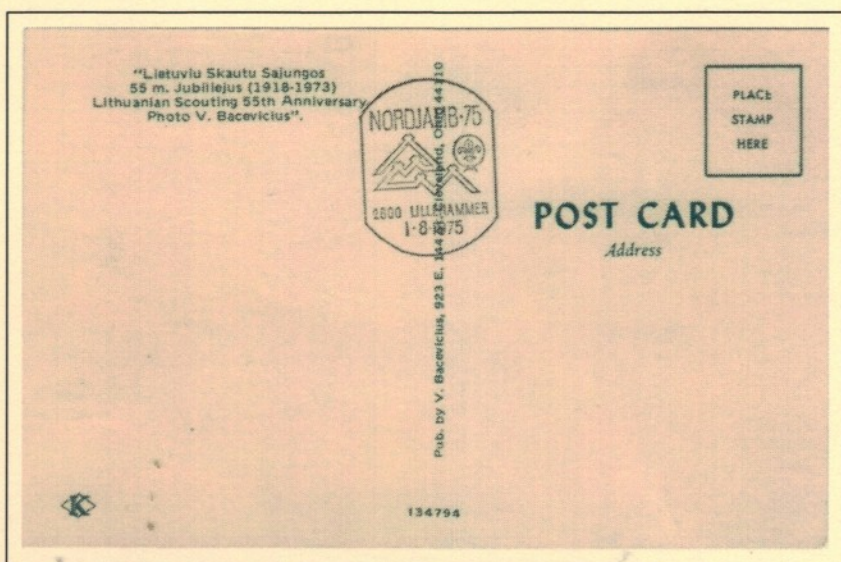
Lithuania

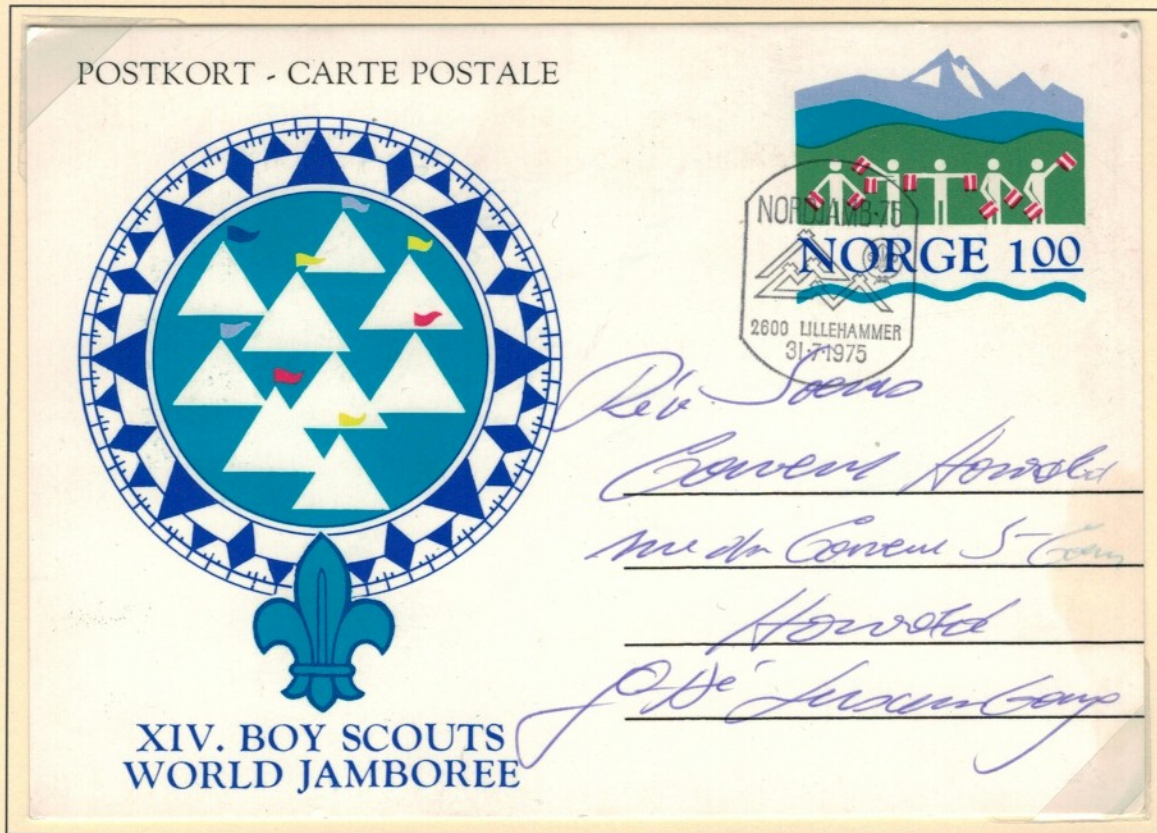

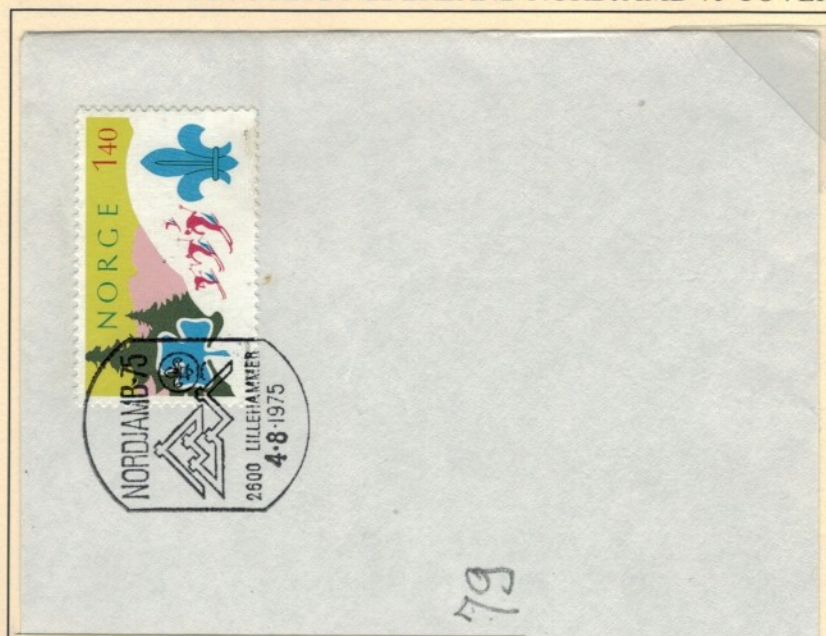

The Philippines Contingent used an official Filipino special postmark at the Jamboree on August 4 to celebrate Philippines Day. 1000 covers (SSCC-E18) were prepared with a pair of the 1973 Philippines Golden Jubilee of Scouting stamps and postmarked. **These were not accepted to be sent through the Norwegian mail.** The covers were sold unaddressed by the Contingent for NOK 5 and later in the Scout Stamp Bank Tent for NOK 6 to raise funds for the Philippines Contingent.

The covers with the Philippines franking and postmark were not accepted as legally prepaid by Norway Post. **Covers that nevertheless were addressed and posted received a small "T in circle" postage due mark.** Postmarked Nordjamb-75 6-8-1975 and T in circle handstamp, but no evidence of postage due paid by the addressee.

South Africa

The first Scout troops appeared in South Africa in 1908. South Africa has long been associated with the origins of Scouting and has contributed many traditions and symbols to World Scouting. 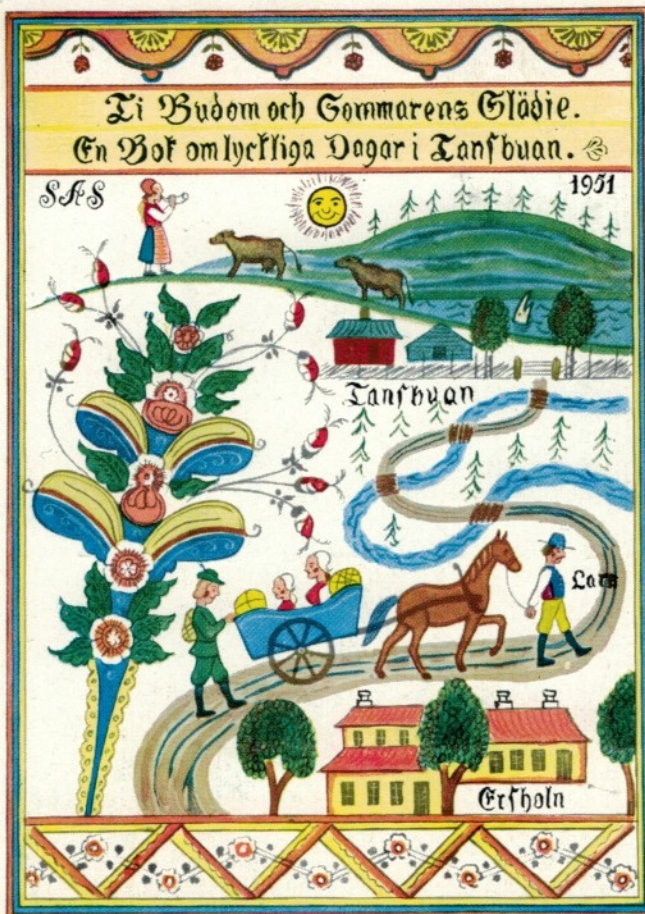

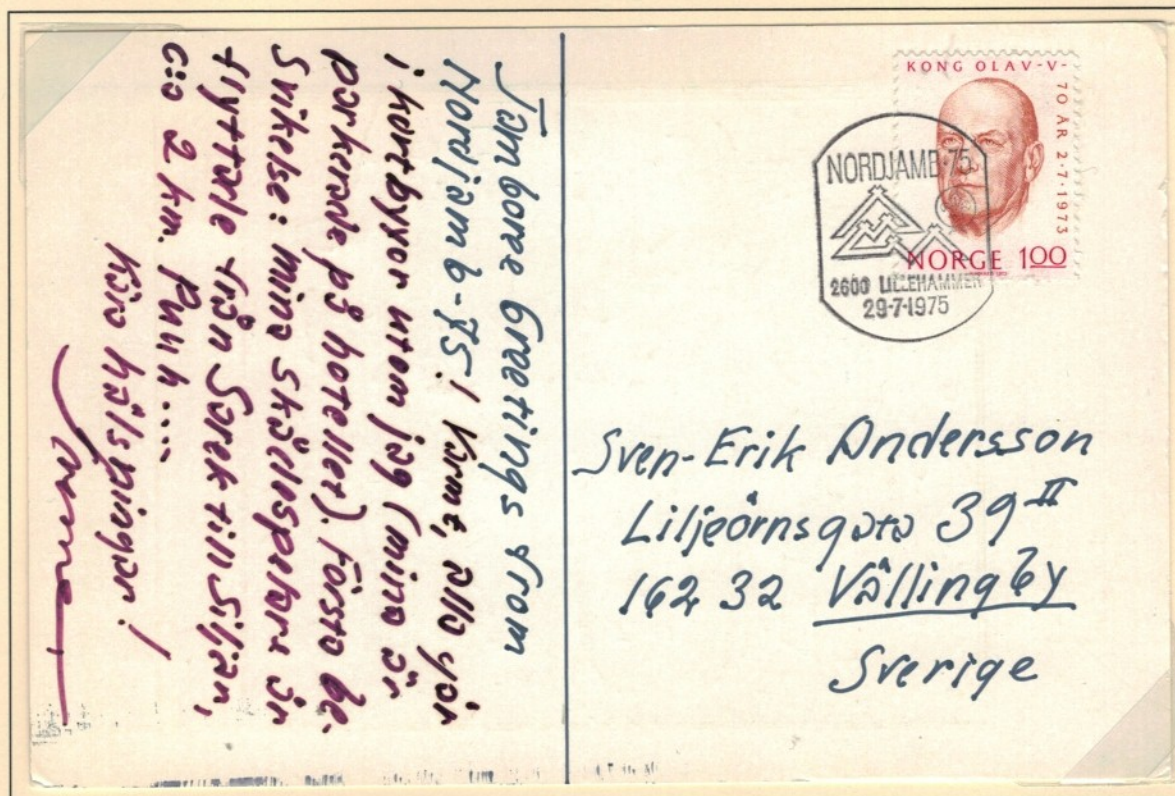

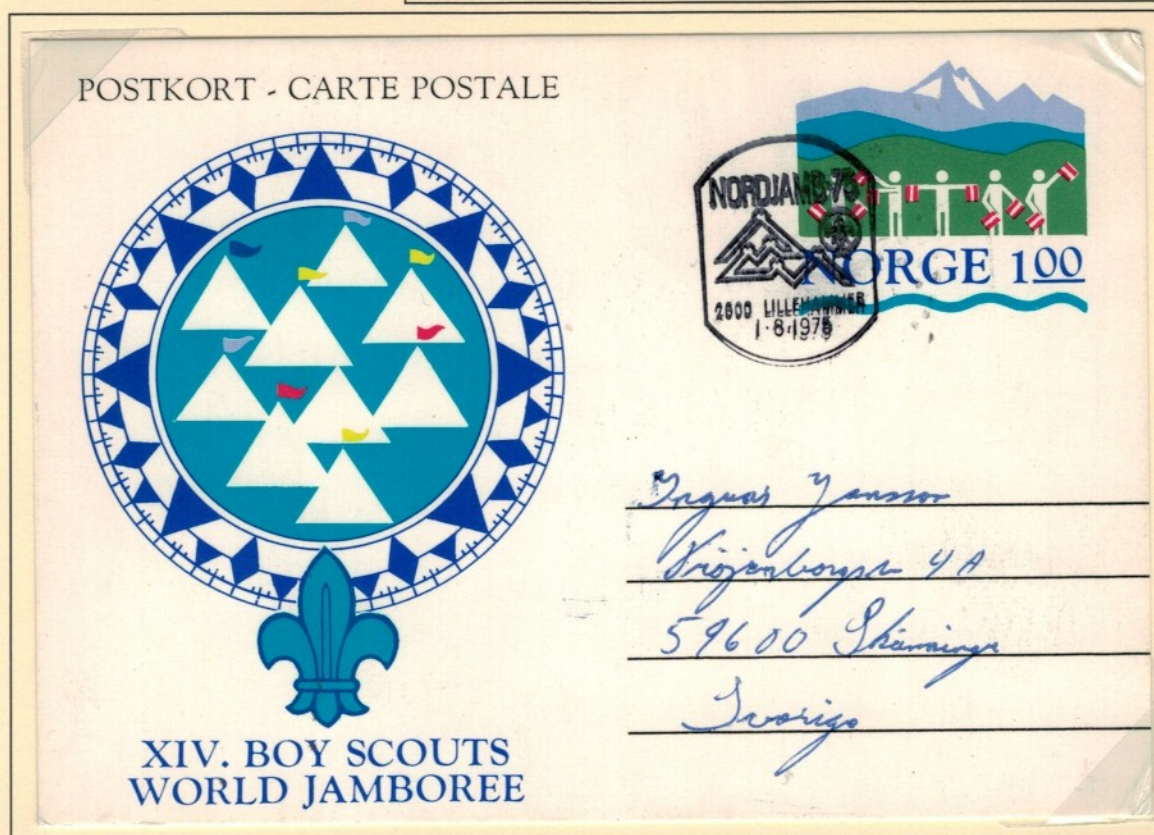

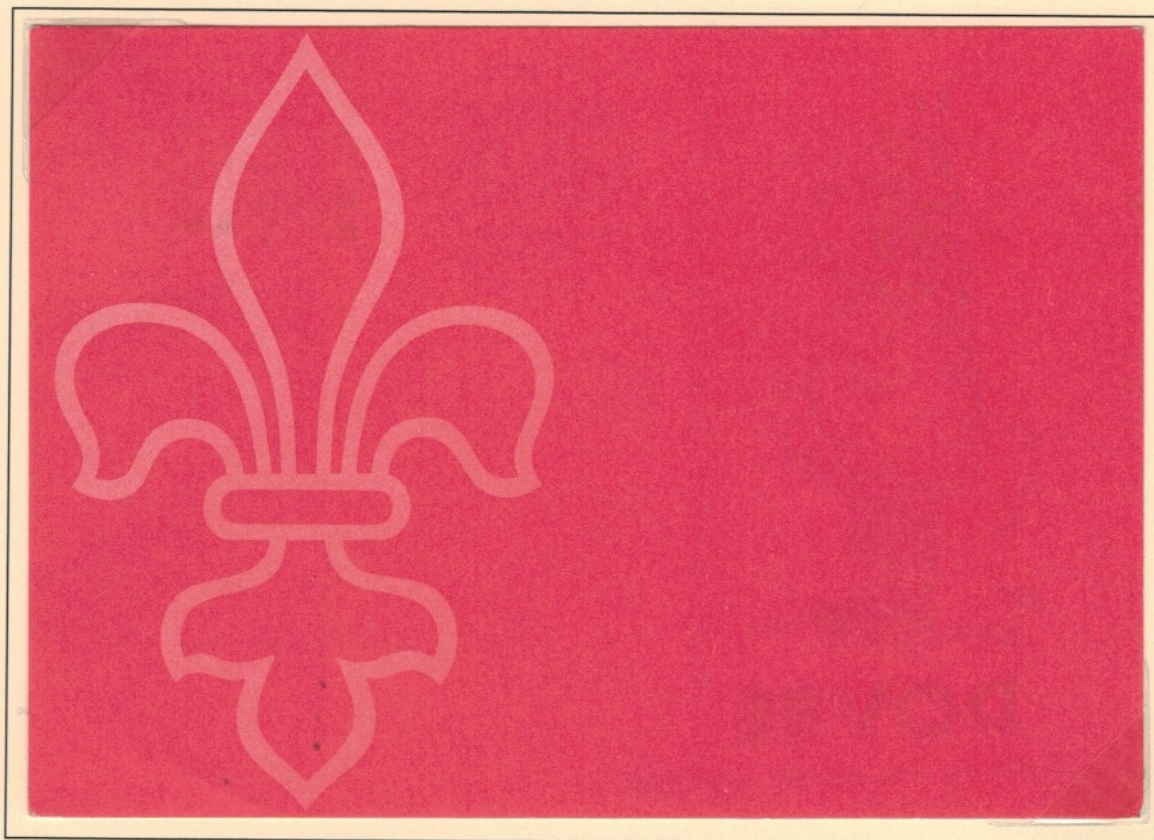

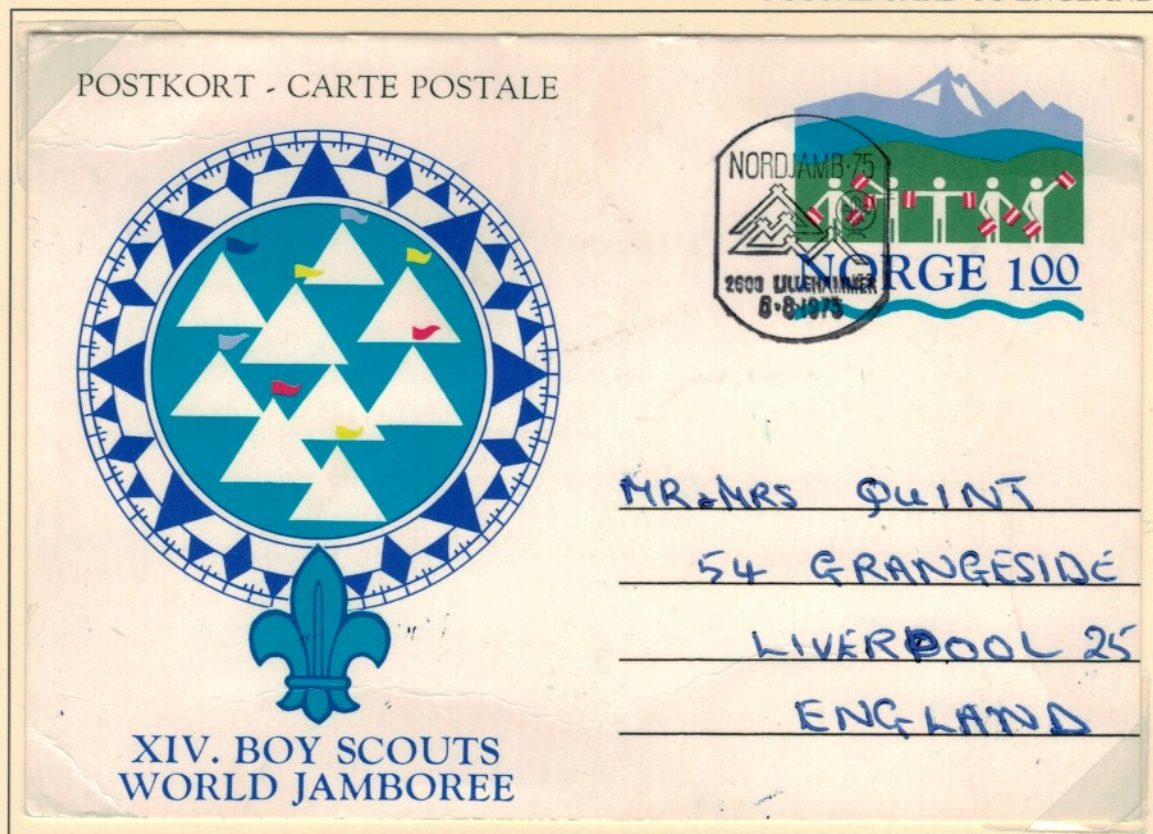

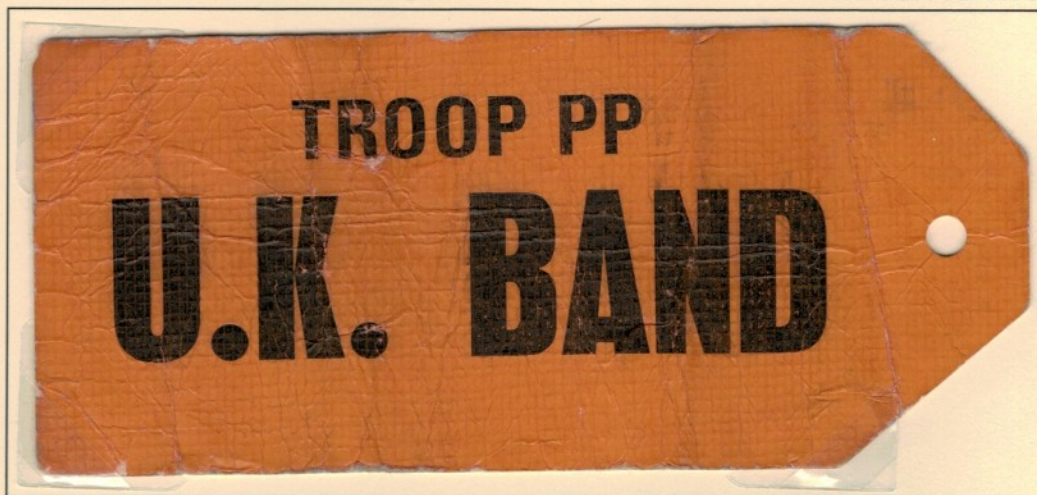

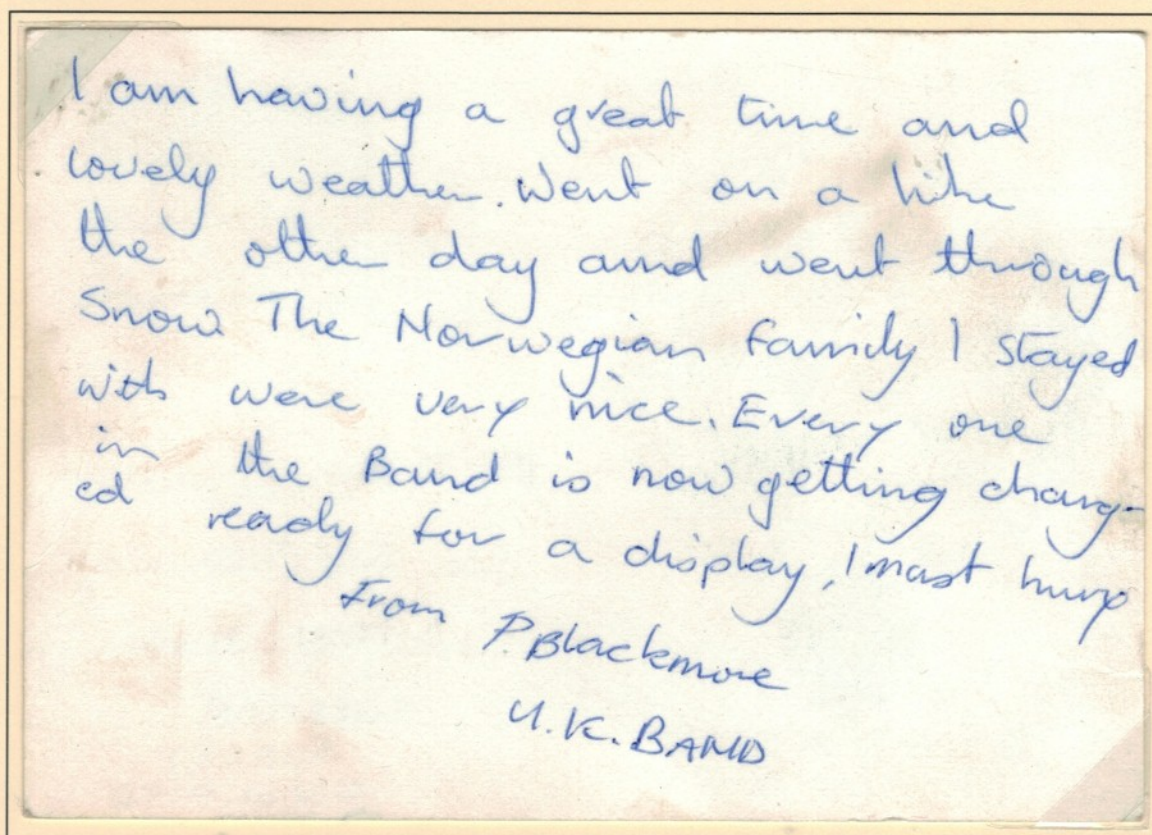

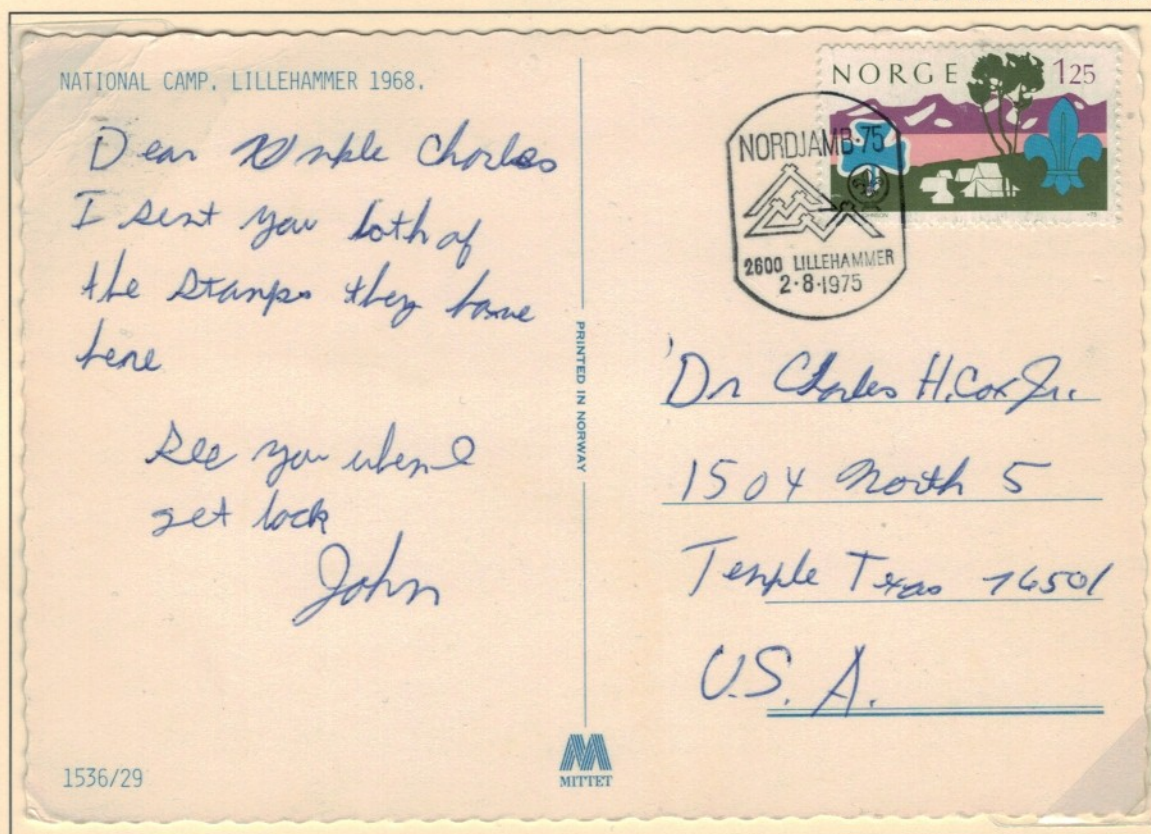

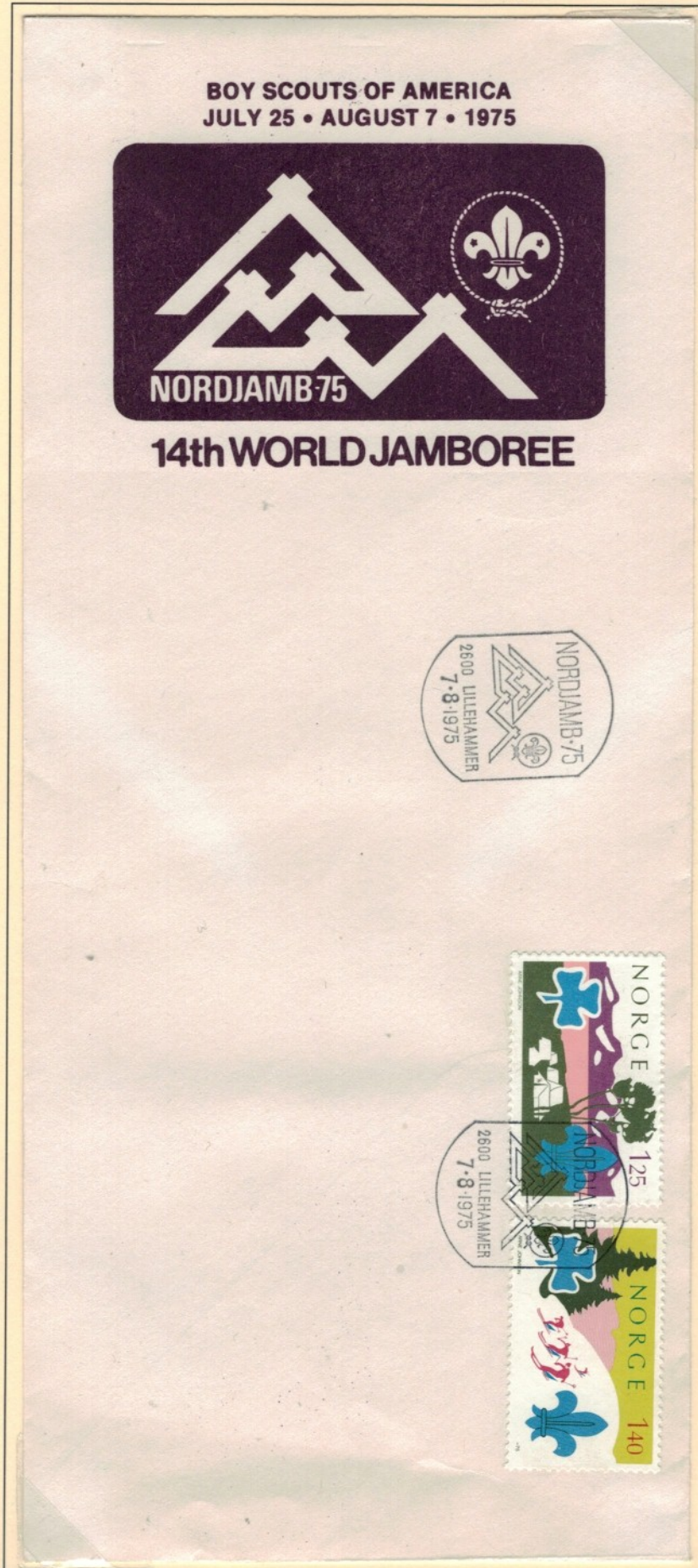

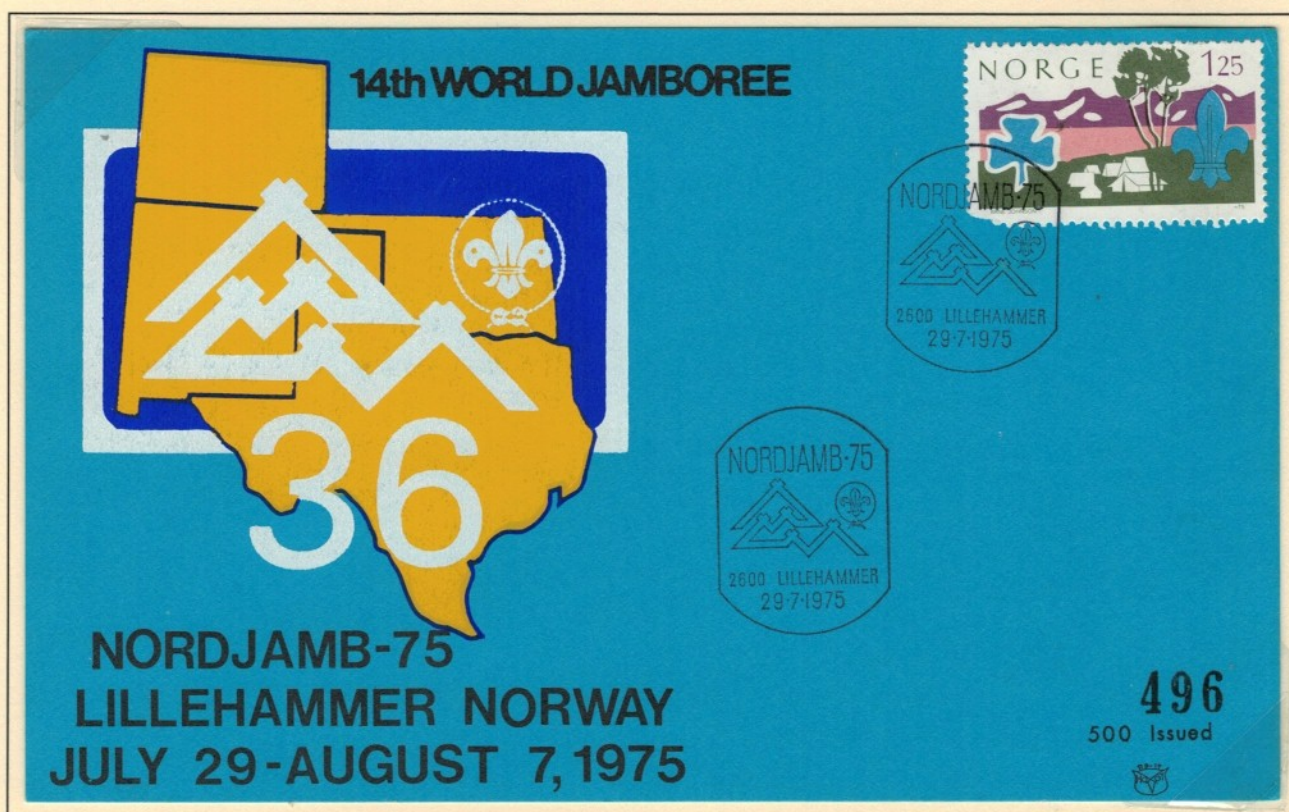

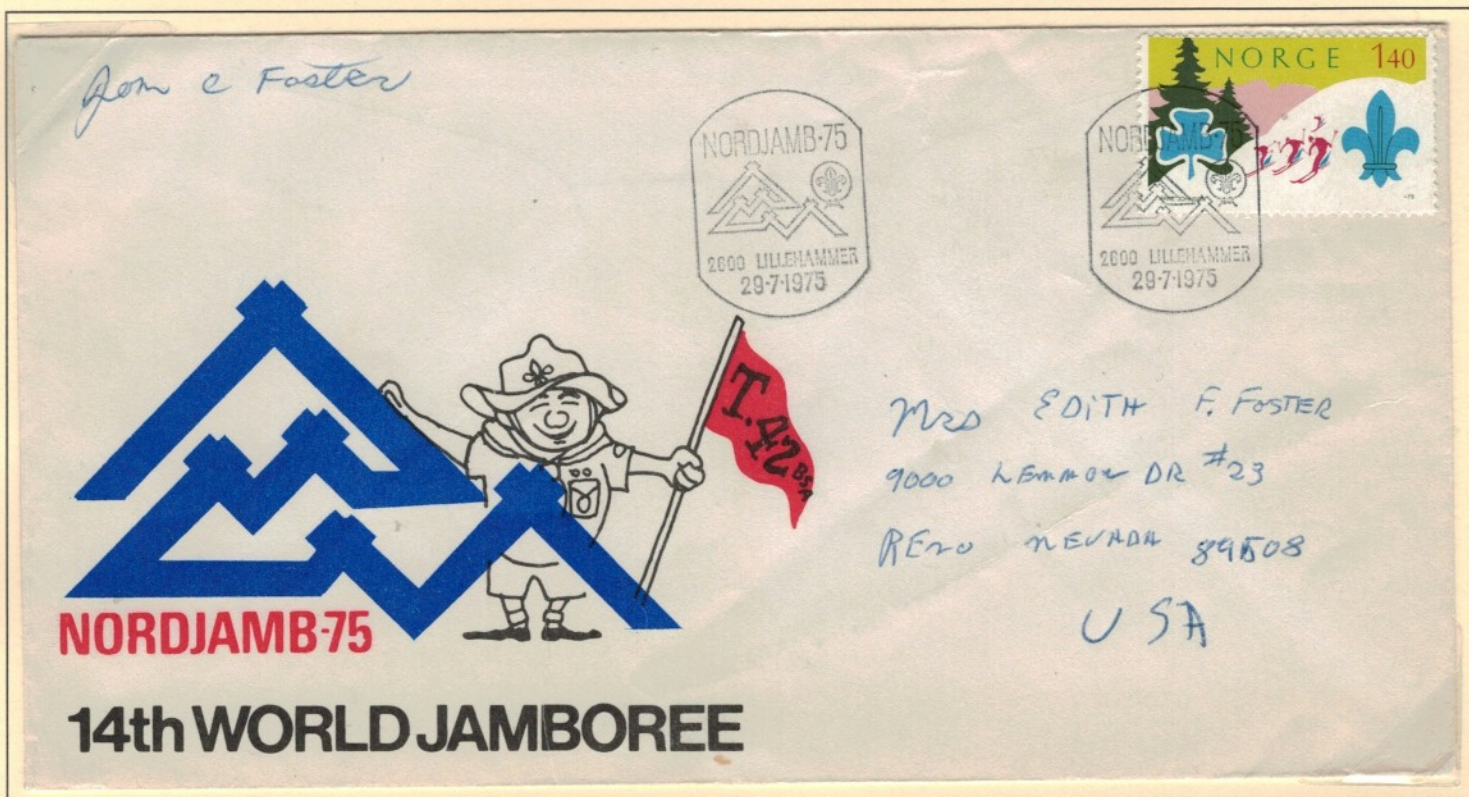

When Baden-Powell created the first Scouting program in 1907, he used elements of Setons' work in his Scouting for Boys. Several small local Scouting programs started in the U.S. soon after. U.S.A. hosted the 12th World Scout Jamboree in 1967. 2492 Scouts from the United States attended Nordjamb-75 and this was the largest contingent at the Jamboree.

DIET etc.

If for religious or medical reasons you need special food, etc. you should tell your hostfamily. This fact also applies in case you are allergic to anything you might come into contact with.

HOME-HOSPITALITY CARD

You have received a home-hospitality card. This card will be of help to you if you should get lost when you are out by yourself. Please ask immediately your host-family for help to fill in the information missing on the card. Please always bring the card with you during your home-hospitality stay.

FOLLOW-UP

It would be nice if you would write to your host-family when you come back home again. It is always pleasant to maintain contacts in a foreign country.

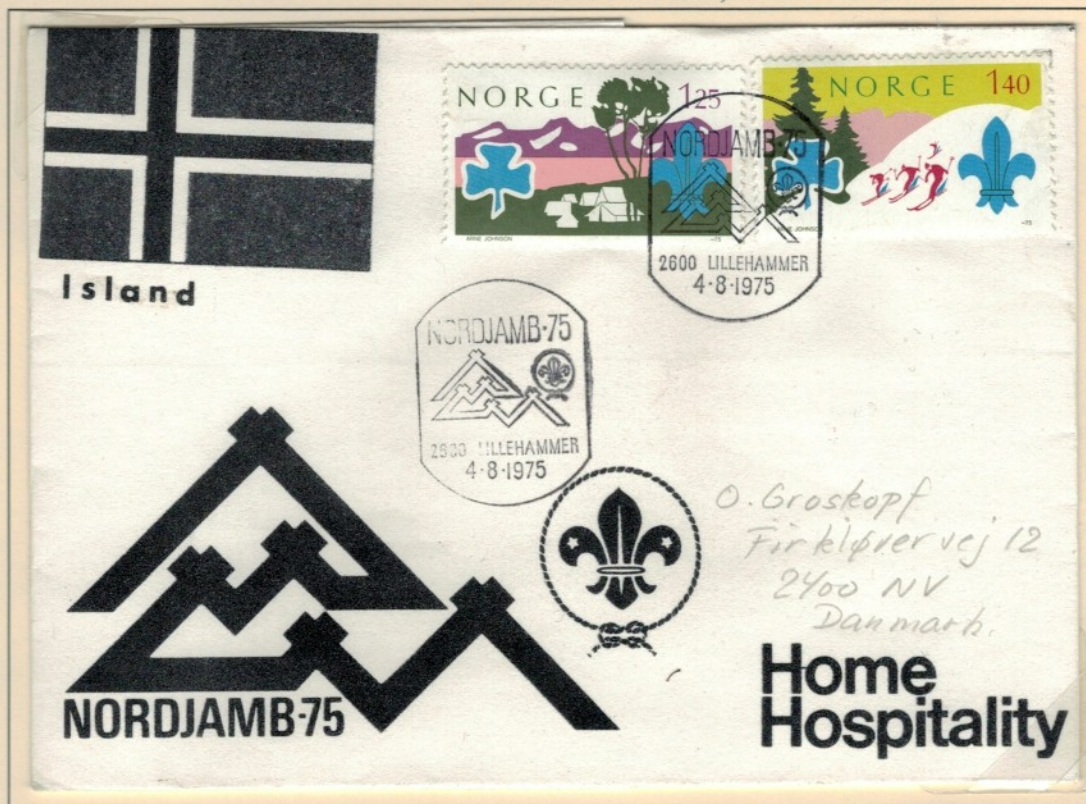

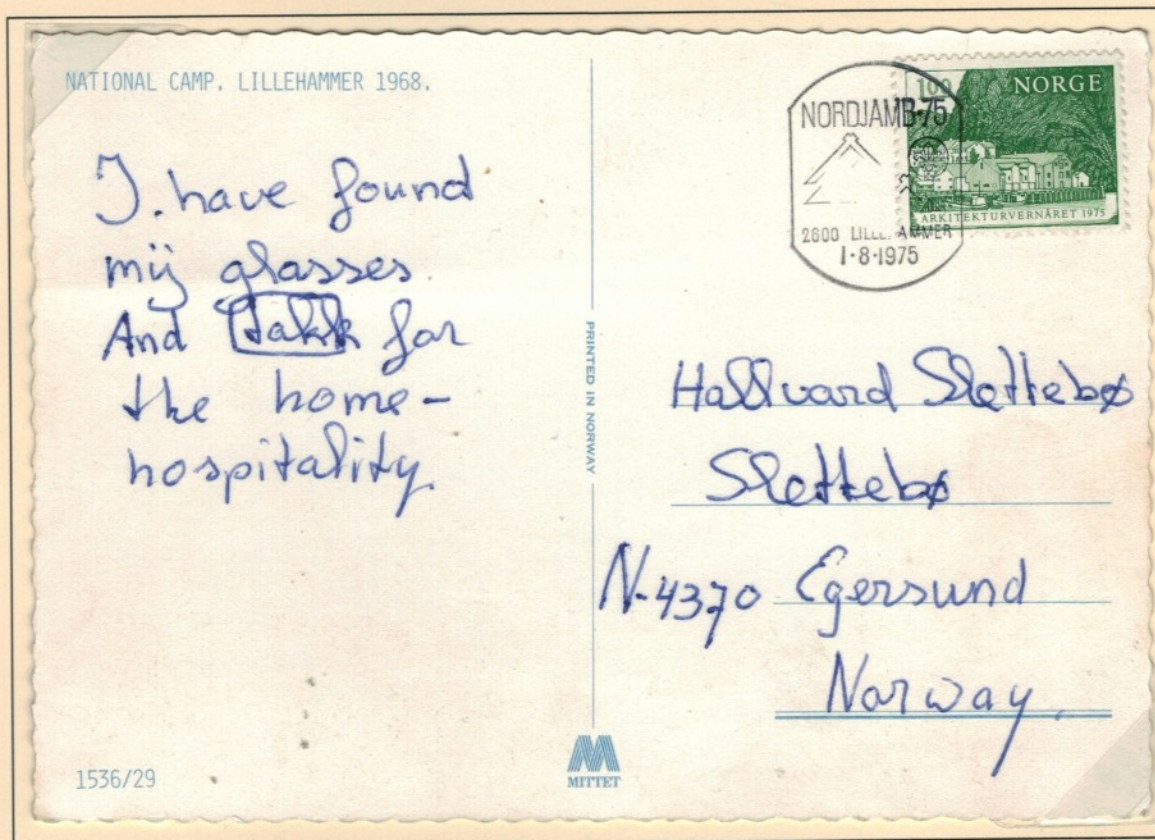

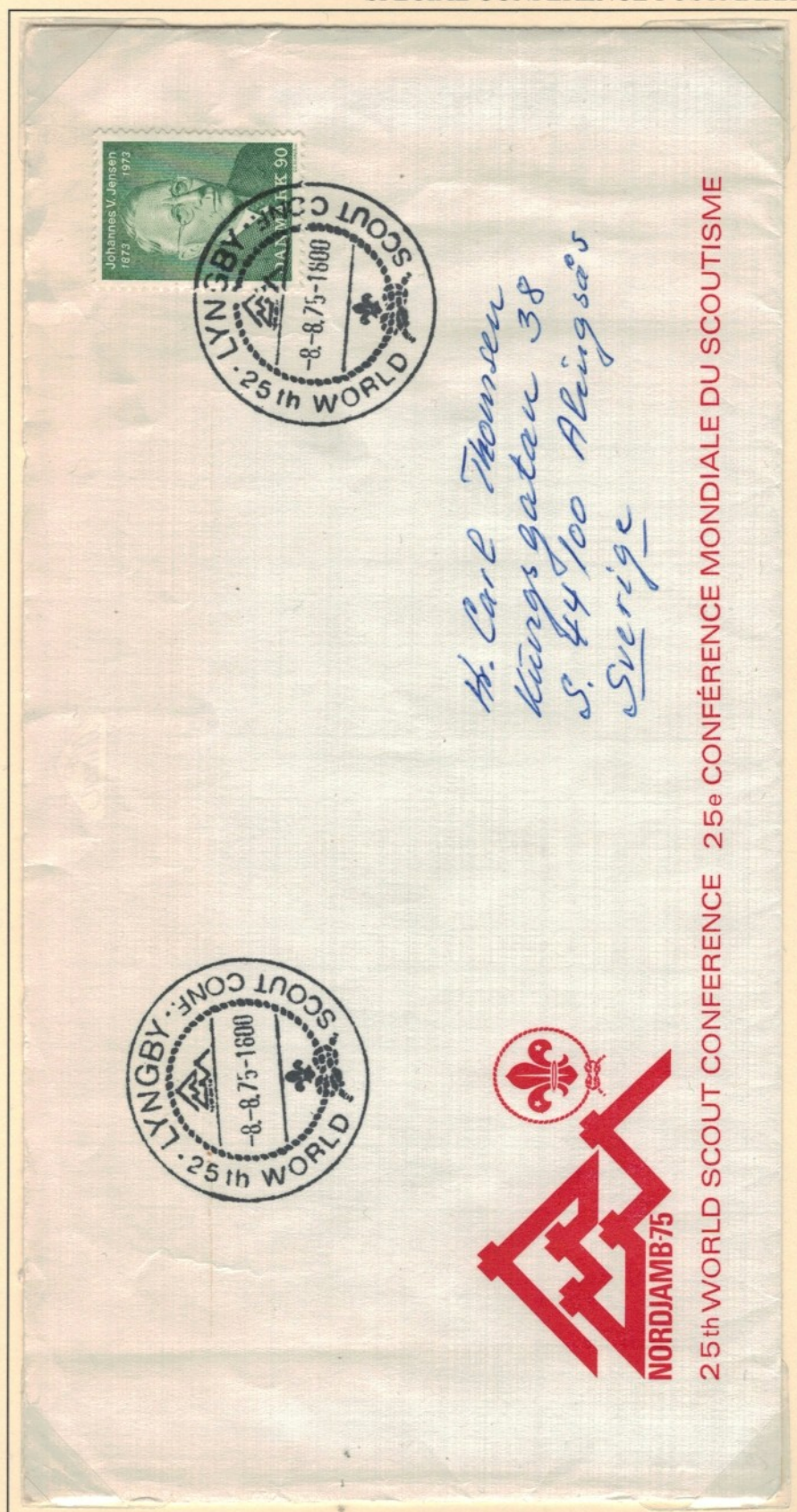

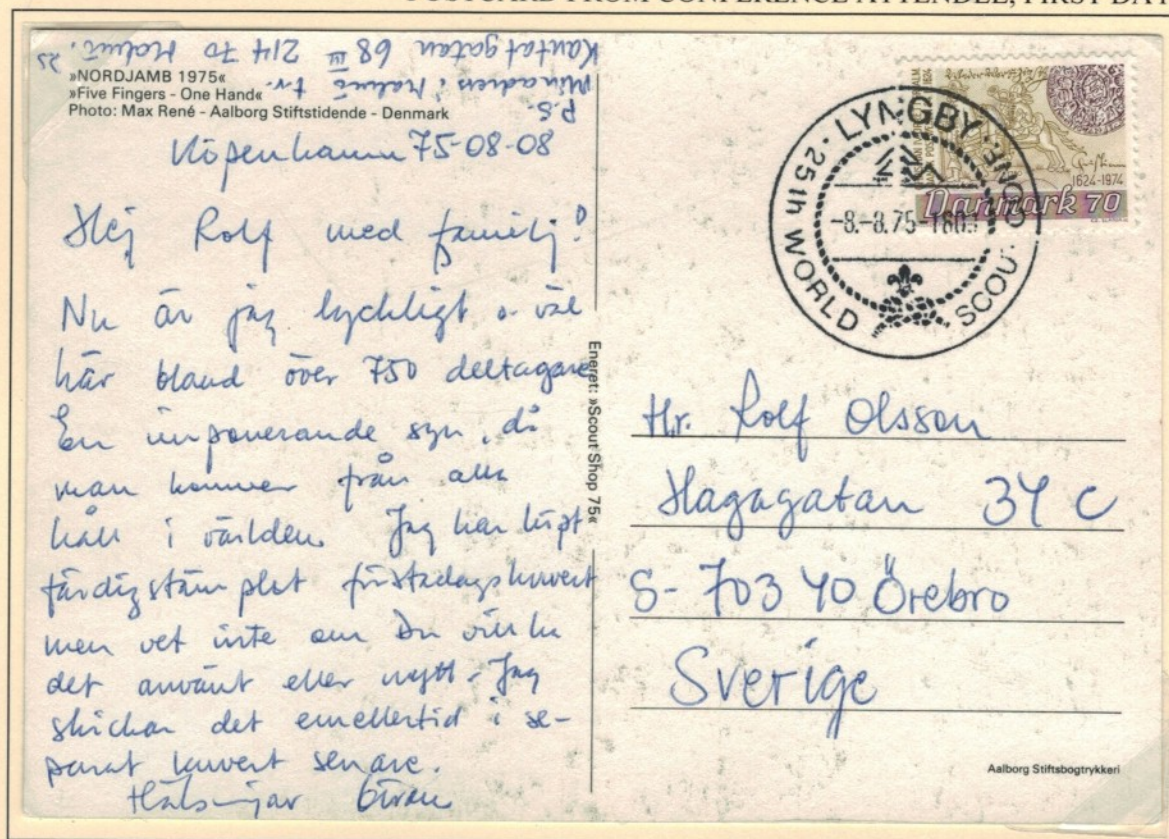

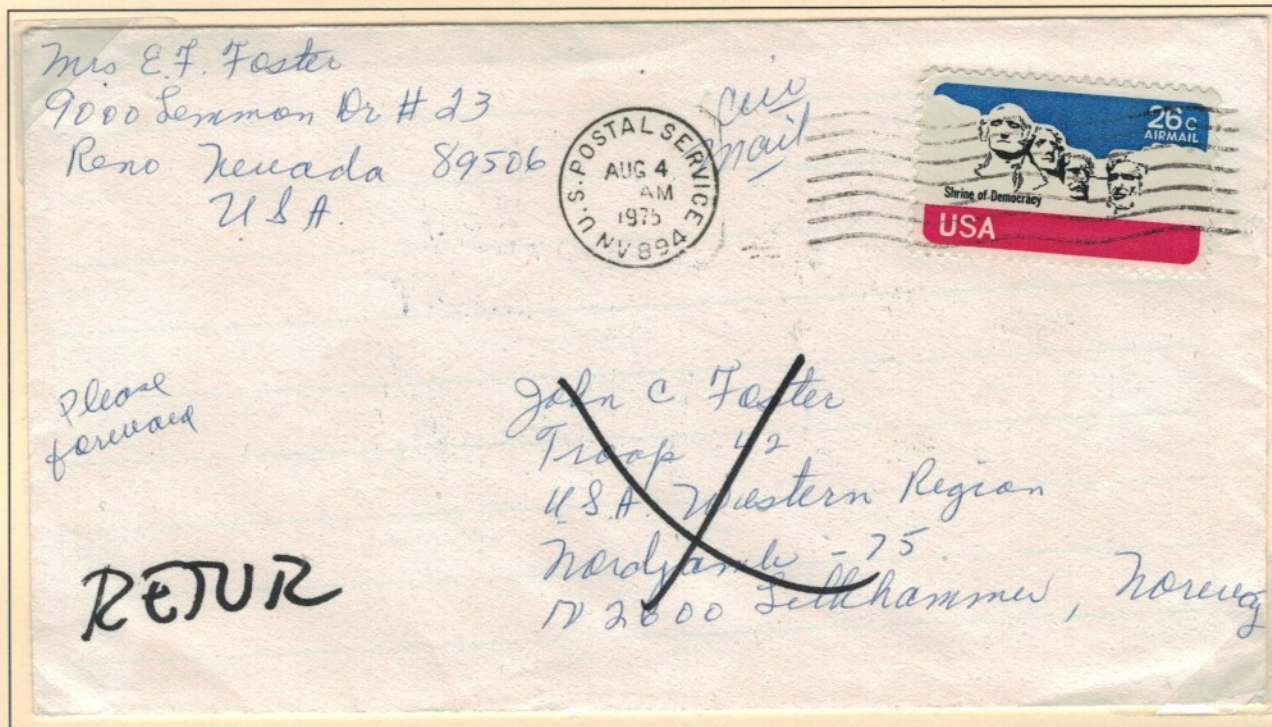

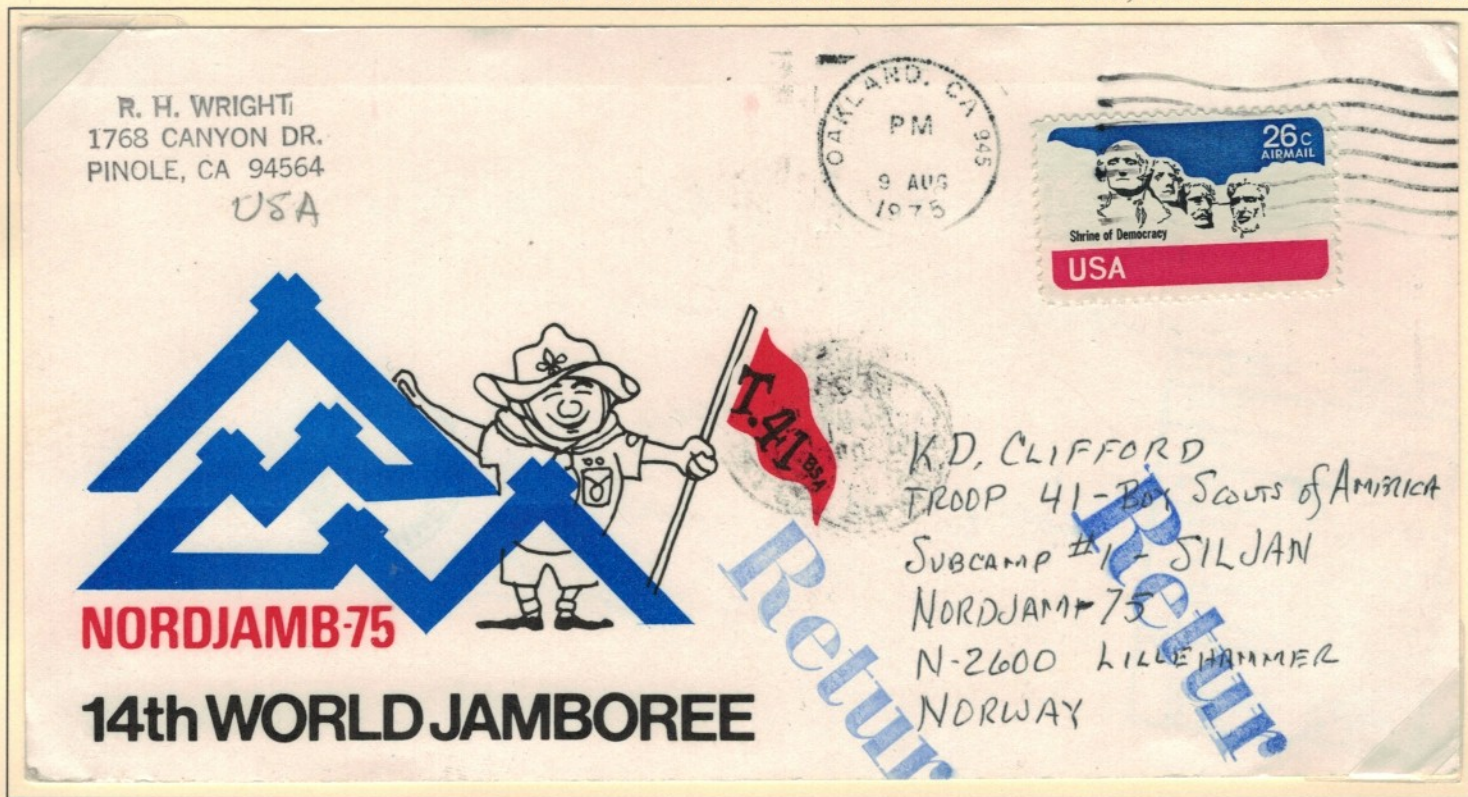

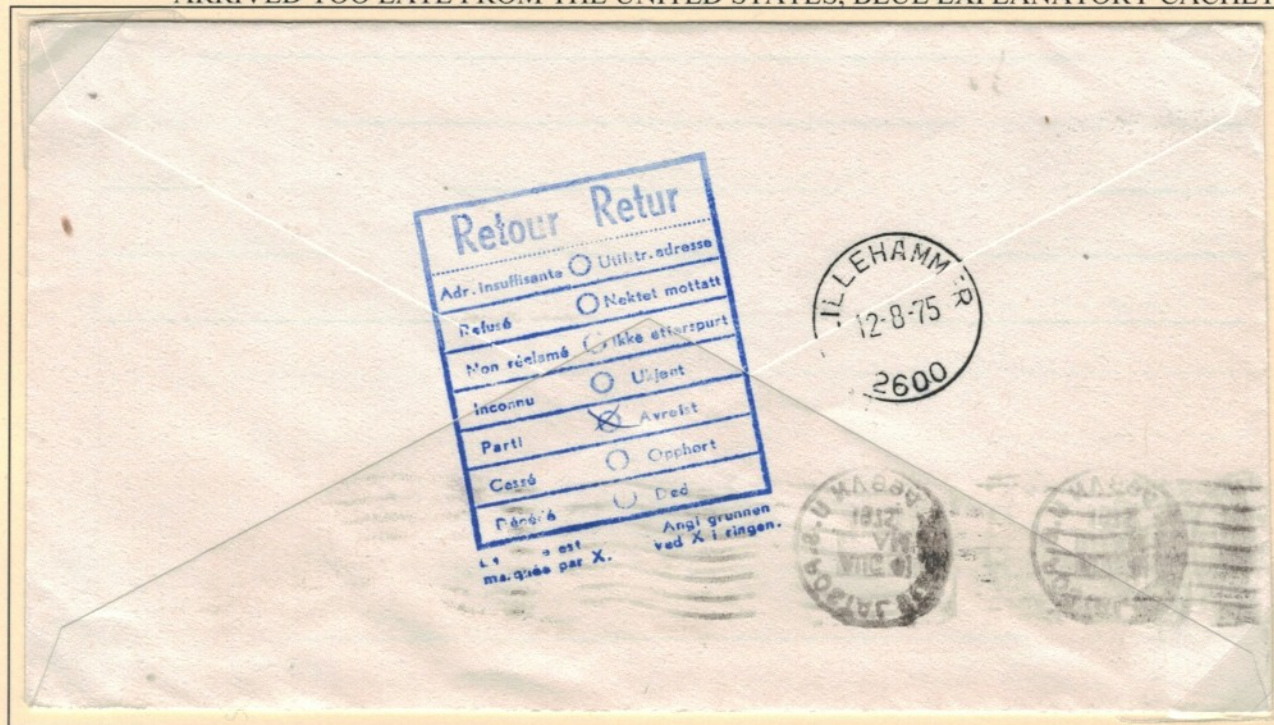

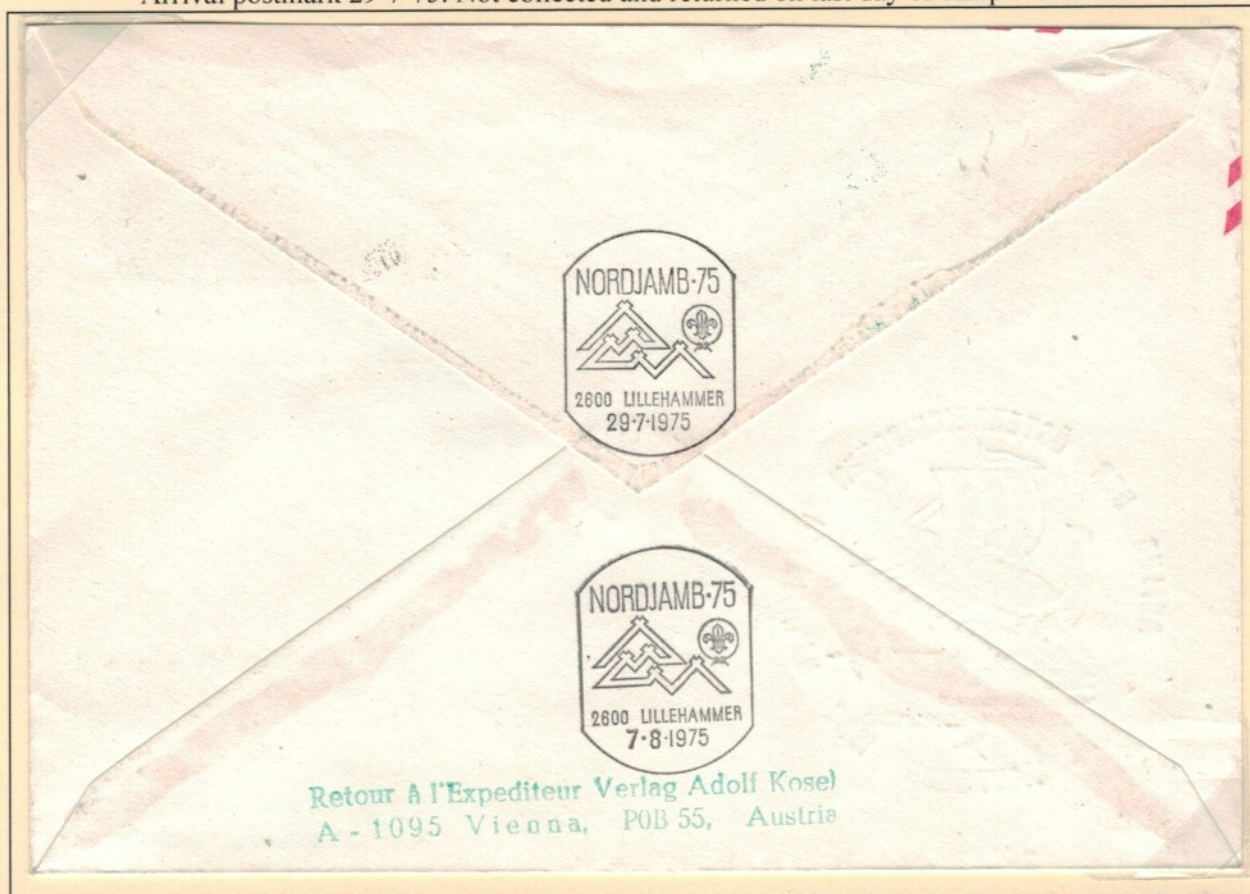

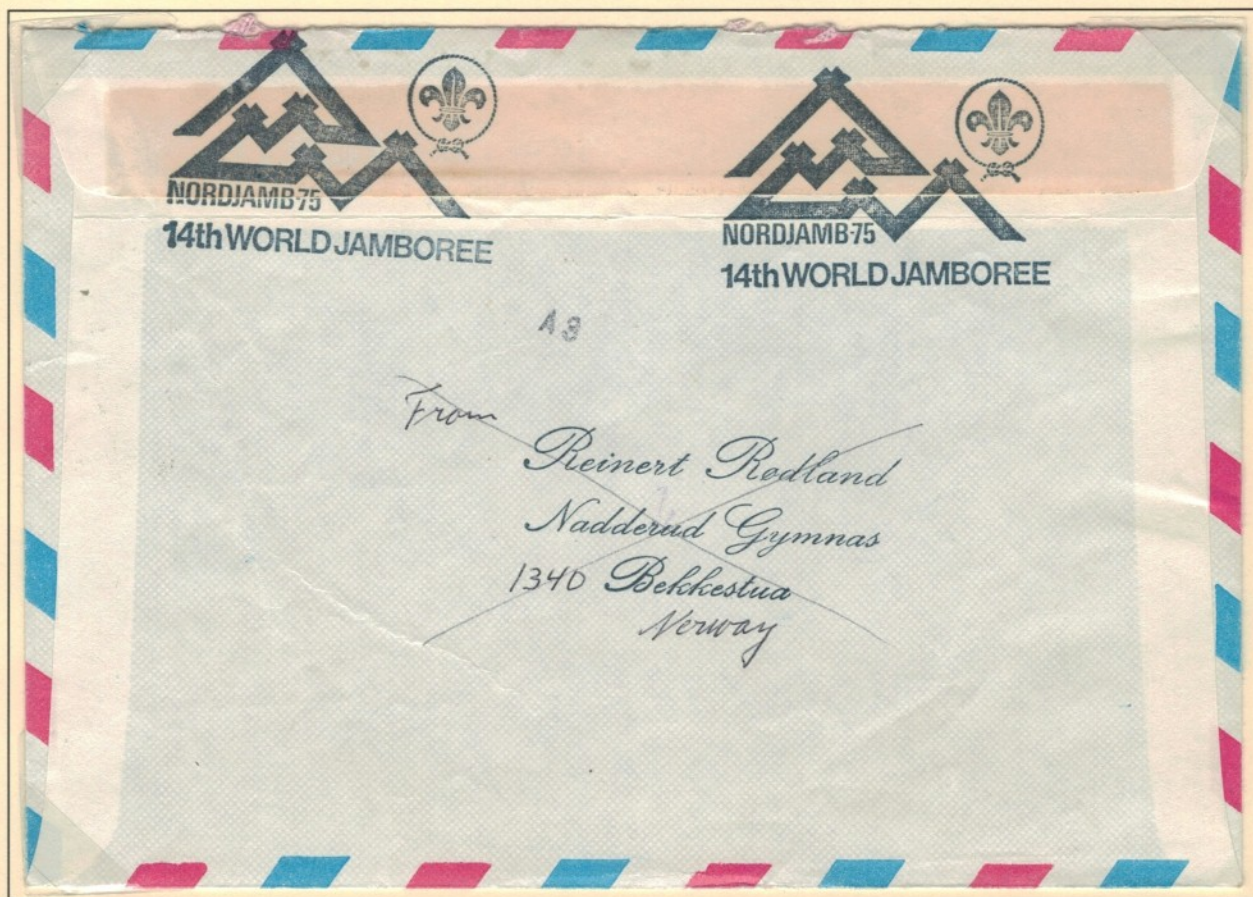

Nordjamb '75 is now part of Scouting's international history, but, like all mountaintop experiences, the memories linger on and become more cherished with the passing of time.

You will remember that when you registered for the jamboree, it was definitely understood that since the budget was very carefully developed, a refund of any part of the fee was not to be anticipated. We were then confident that the cost factors developed would about equal the fee quoted.

Fortunately, because of outstanding management, favorable currency exchange rates, low contingency needs, and profitable disposal of jamboree equipment on the open market, we were able not only to balance the budget, but enjoy a modest, uncommitted surplus.

Included in our committee fund was a grant to the World Scout Bureau for use in underdeveloped countries and the replacement of the World Jamboree revolving funds that are set aside after each jamboree to provide working resources for the next following jamboree. We are sure you will agree that such commitments are within the scope of our World Brotherhood responsibility.

We are very glad to be able to announce to you that the World Jamboree Committee has voted to refund to each participant the sum of \$75.

This refund is enclosed, and we hope it will be helpful in making it possible for you to have another mountaintop experience.

Germany had proposed to the World Conference in 1975 that the jamborees should cease because they were not in accordance with the right spirit of Scouting. But they withdrew the proposal after Nordjamb-75, because the camp showed that it was possible to create "a jamboree that was scout-like".

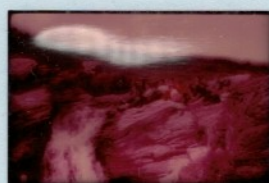

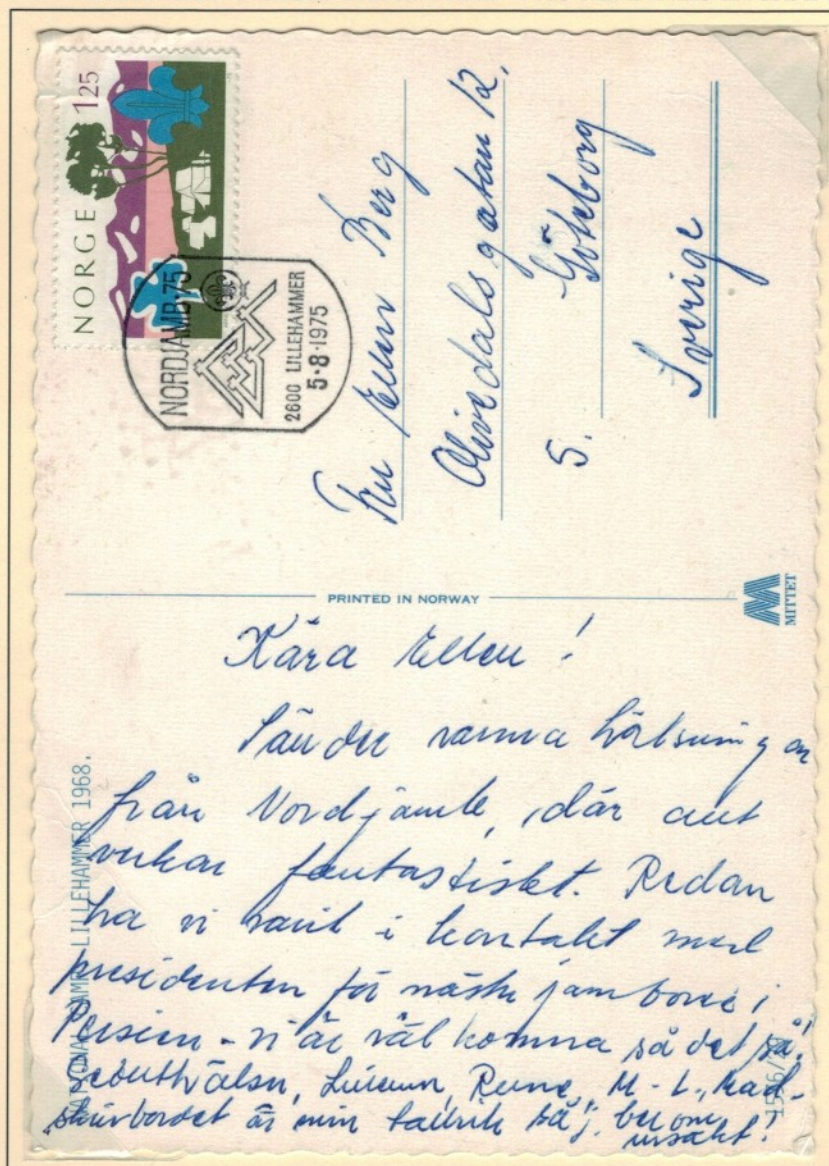
THE NEXT WORLD JAMBOREE WAS PLANNED IN IRAN

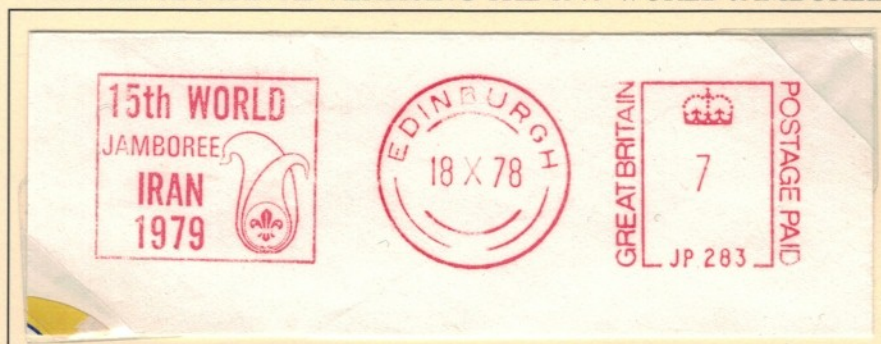

Scouting is not political, but like anyone else, Scouting is indeed affected by politics. **The destabilizing events of the 1979 Islamic Revolution in Iran caused the 15th World Jamboree to be cancelled near the end of 1978.** Instead, the World Organization of the Scout Movement announced the "World Jamboree Year" by holding several international World Jamboree Year camps in Australia, Canada, Sweden, Switzerland and the United States.

13 Foreign Countries Issued Postage Stamps

Postage stamps or postal stationery issued by the host nation have become a tradition of World Jamborees since 1933. Stamps issued by countries and postal authorities other than the host nation were first issued in 1937, and has been common since 1957.

STAMP-ISSUING COUNTRIES



The international postal support for Nordjamb-75 was overwhelming. As many as 13 foreign countries from near and far issued 59 postage stamps and 11 souvenir sheets in commemoration and support of Nordjamb-75, see map above. Not all of these sent scouts to Lillehammer, however.

There were local stamps from Davaar and Staffa islands in Scotland.

Austria, Sweden, Germany and the Philippines came with special postmarks.

Meter slogans advertising Nordjamb-75 came from Austria, Denmark, Mexico, Sweden, Switzerland and United Kingdom.

One postmark and two meter slogans were used in Denmark.

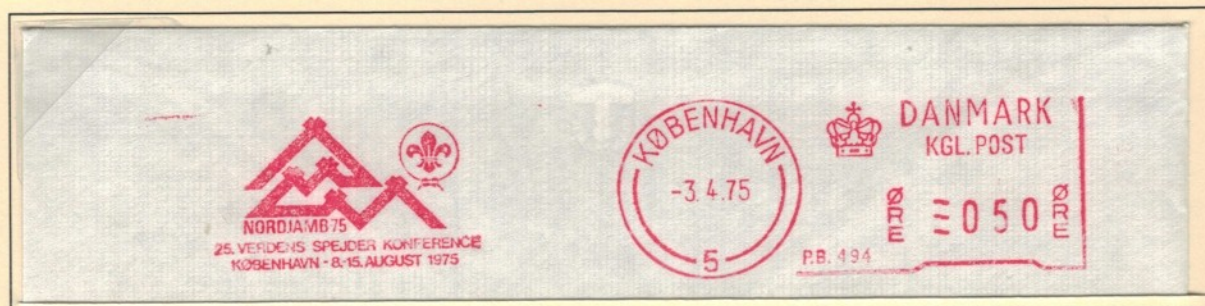

WORLD JAMBOREE METER SLOGAN



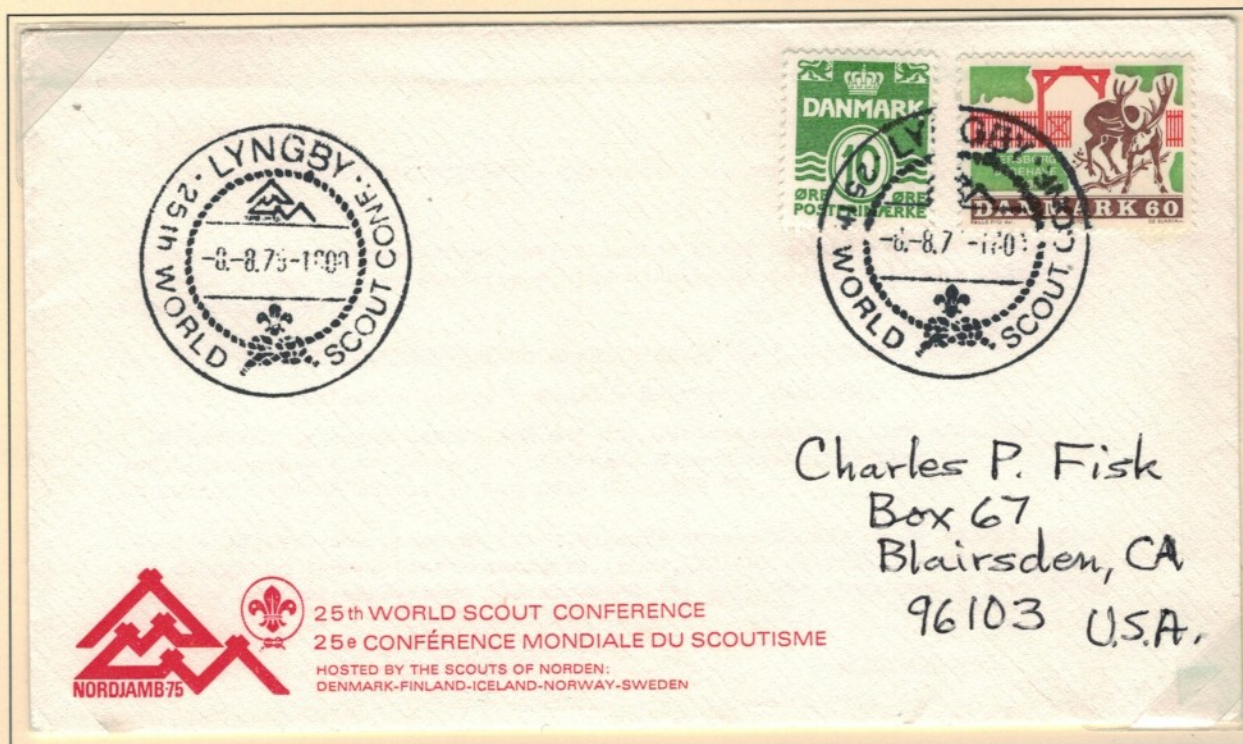
Meter slogan advertising the 14th World Scout Jamboree, used 1974 by the Danish Scout HQ.

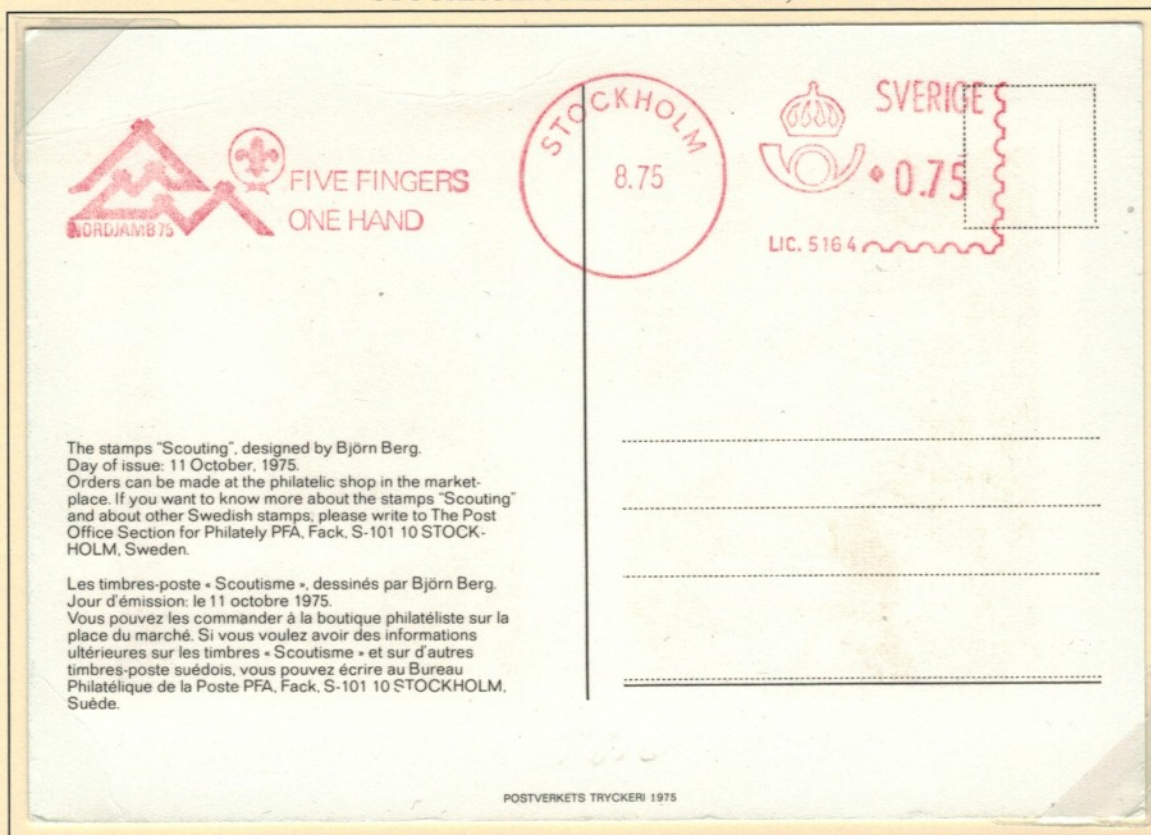

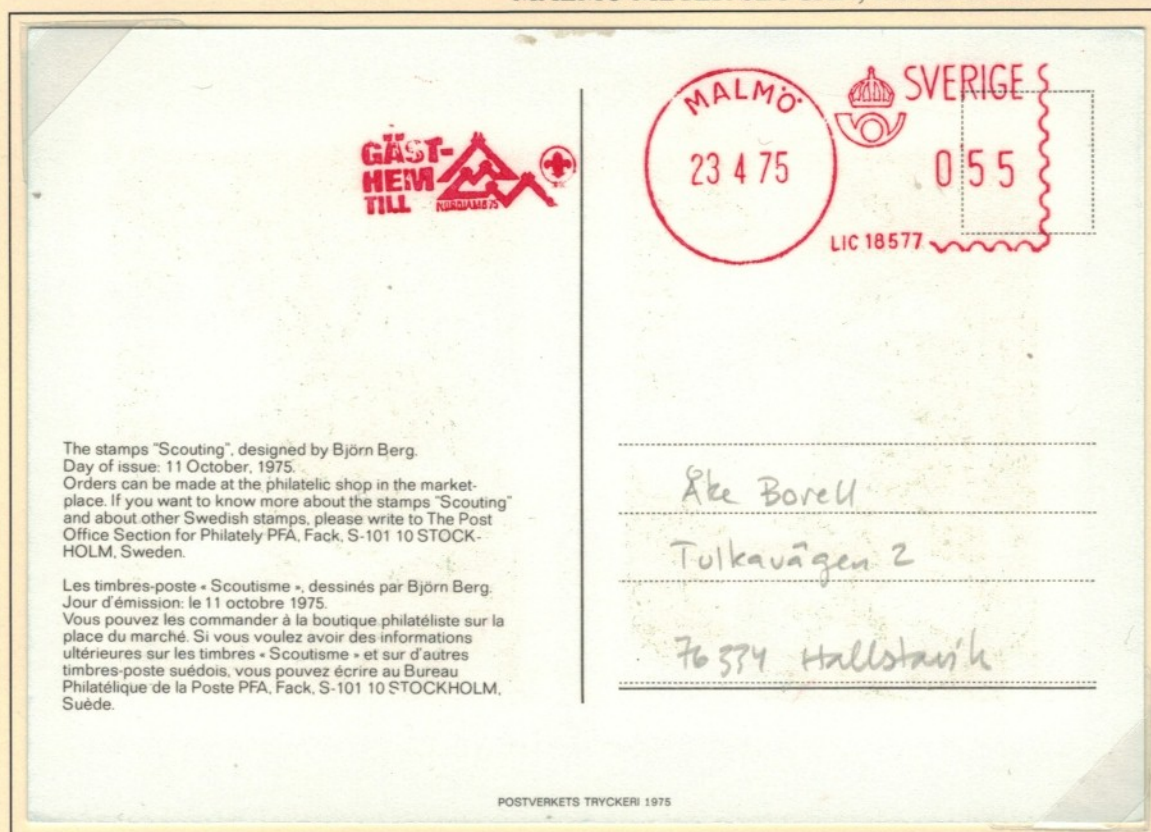

The Malmö meter slogan was used by the Malmö district of the Swedish Scout and Guide Association. It was used the entire year 1975. 55 öre for printed matter class B 1.5.1975-1.2.1976 to all destinations.

Scouting in Sweden was founded in 1910. Swedish Scouting has close relations to the Swedish royal family, and King Carl XVI Gustaf of Sweden visited Nordjamb-75. Sweden was co-organizer of Nordjamb-75. 602 Scouts from Sweden attended, plus an unknown number of attendees in Jamboree staff and Senior Scout Camp (the Nordic staff was 2141 strong). In 2011, Sweden hosted the 22nd World Scout Jamboree.

DELAYED SWEDISH STAMPS

Sweden had planned two postage stamps "Scouting" to be issued before the opening of Nordjamb-75. However, the stamps were delayed due to a labour dispute at the printers Harrison & Sons in London.

A publicity postcard depicting the two stamps, and with information in English and French about how to order the stamps was given out for free by Norway Post at Nordjamb-75 (SSCC-P4 bottom).

A second publicity postcard was prepared for the actual stamp issue on October 11, same front but different text on reverse (below).

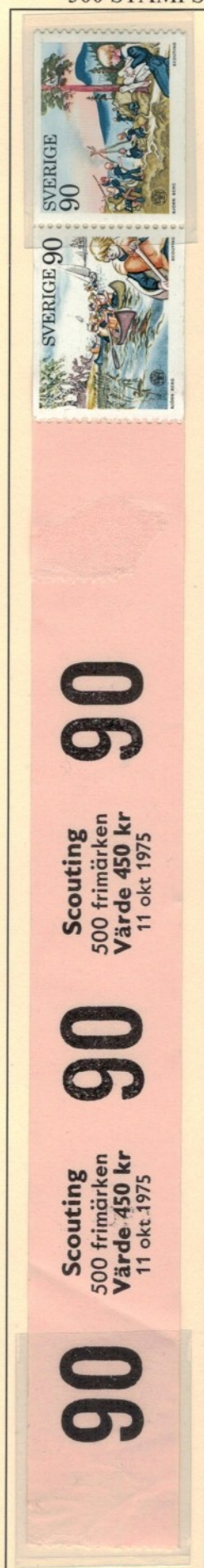

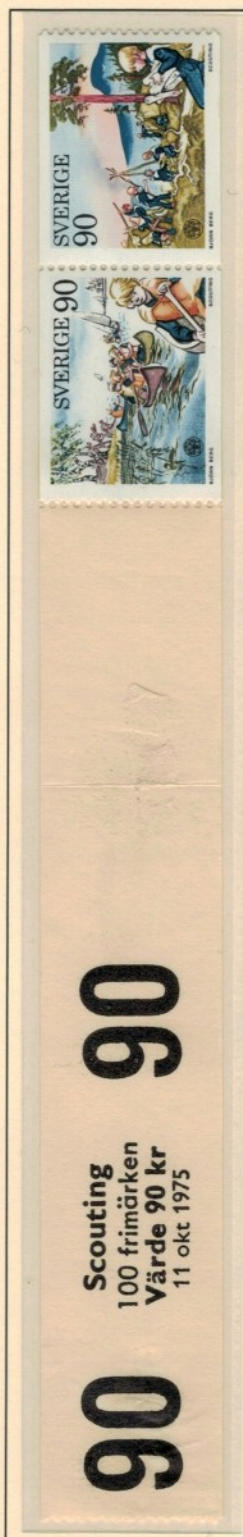

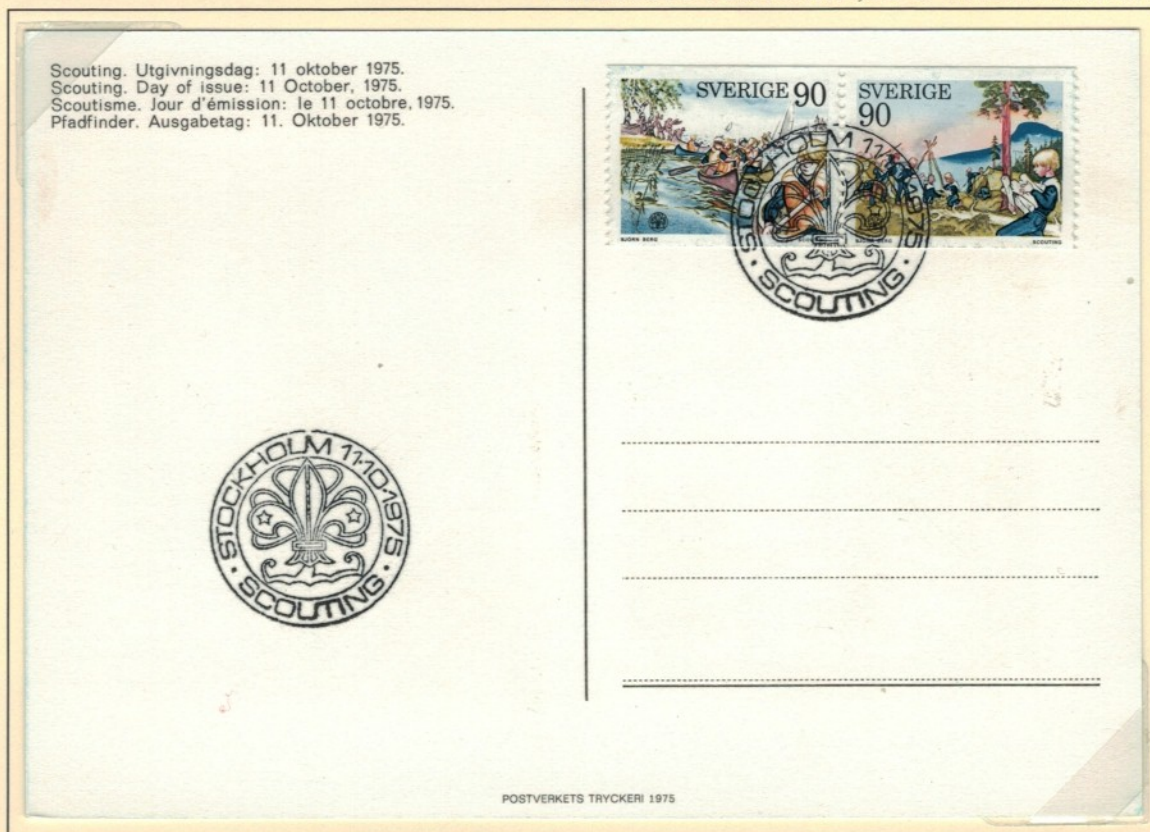

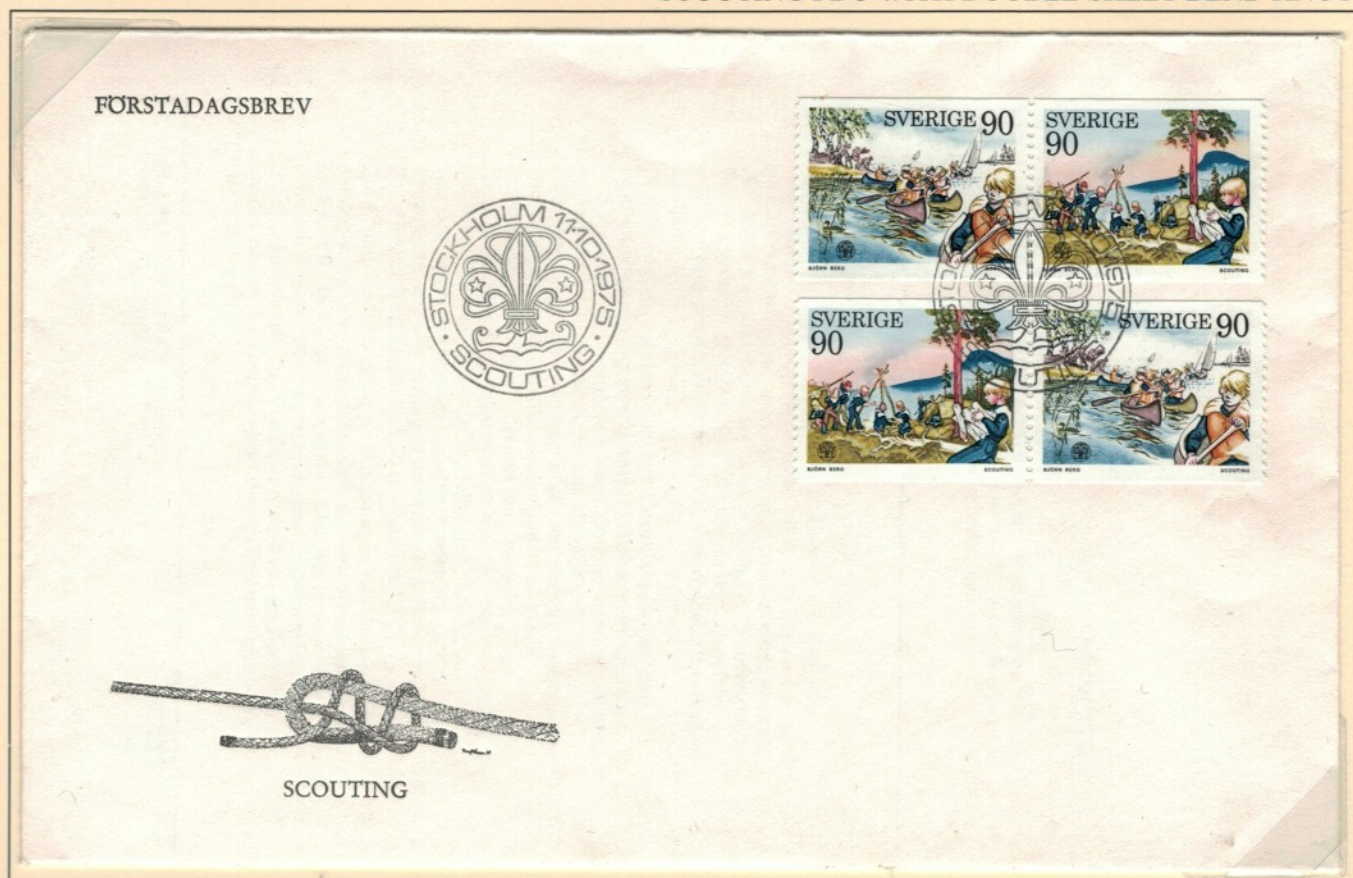

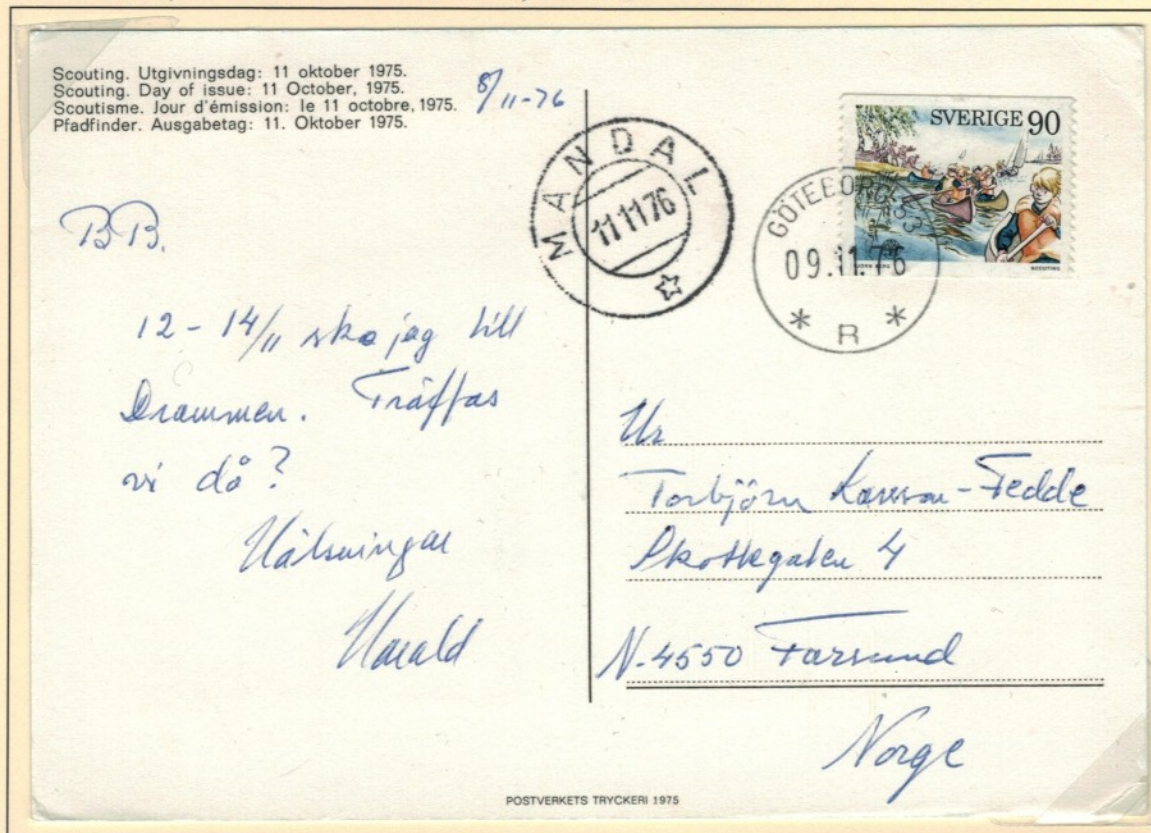

Austrian Boy Scouts were readmitted to WOSM in 1946. In 1951, Austria hosted the 7th World Scout Jamboree in Bad Ischl. 399 Scouts from Austria attended Nordjamb-75.

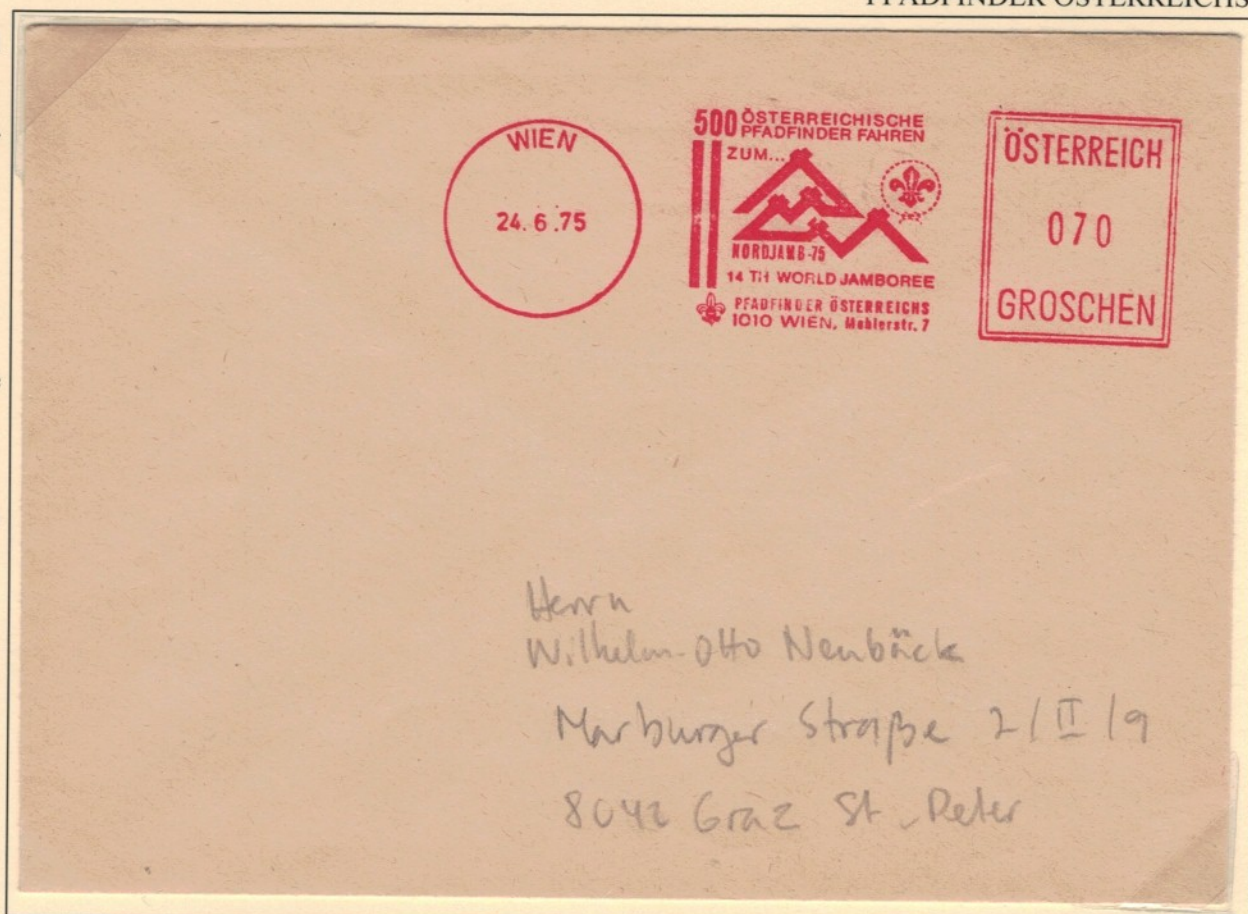

The Austrian departure postmark has a strong claim for being the most complex scout postmark ever. Scouting in Germany started in 1909. German Scouting flourished until 1934-35, when nearly all associations were closed and their members had to join the Hitler Youth. In West Germany and West Berlin, Scouting was reestablished after 1945. **1132 Scouts from West Germany and Berlin attended Nordjamb-75.** Scouting was banned in East Germany until 1990. Today it is present in all parts of the unified Federal Republic of Germany.

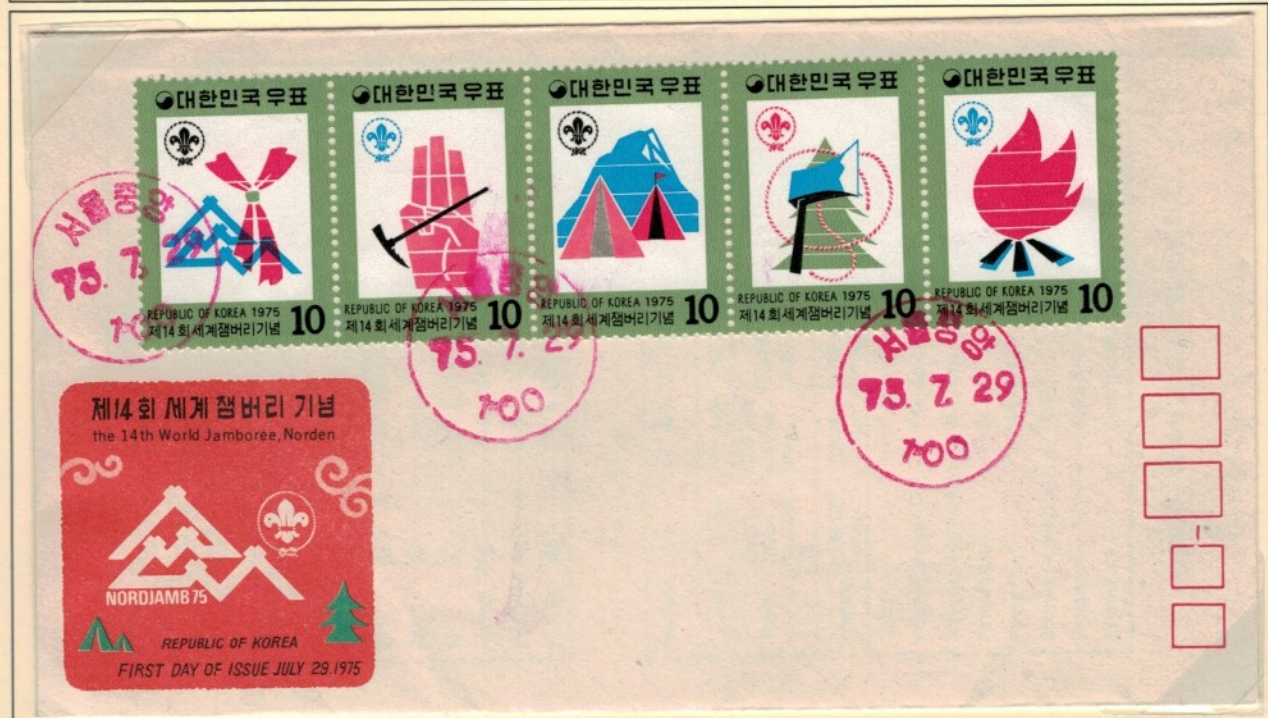


Letter from "160 Incheon 75.9.2" to Seoul, 10 won for domestic letters to 5g 1.7.1975-9.1.1980.

Not being a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement until 1990, there were of course **no participants from Maldives at Nordjamb-75.**

Mali is one of 29 countries where there today is no National Scout Organization which is a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement.

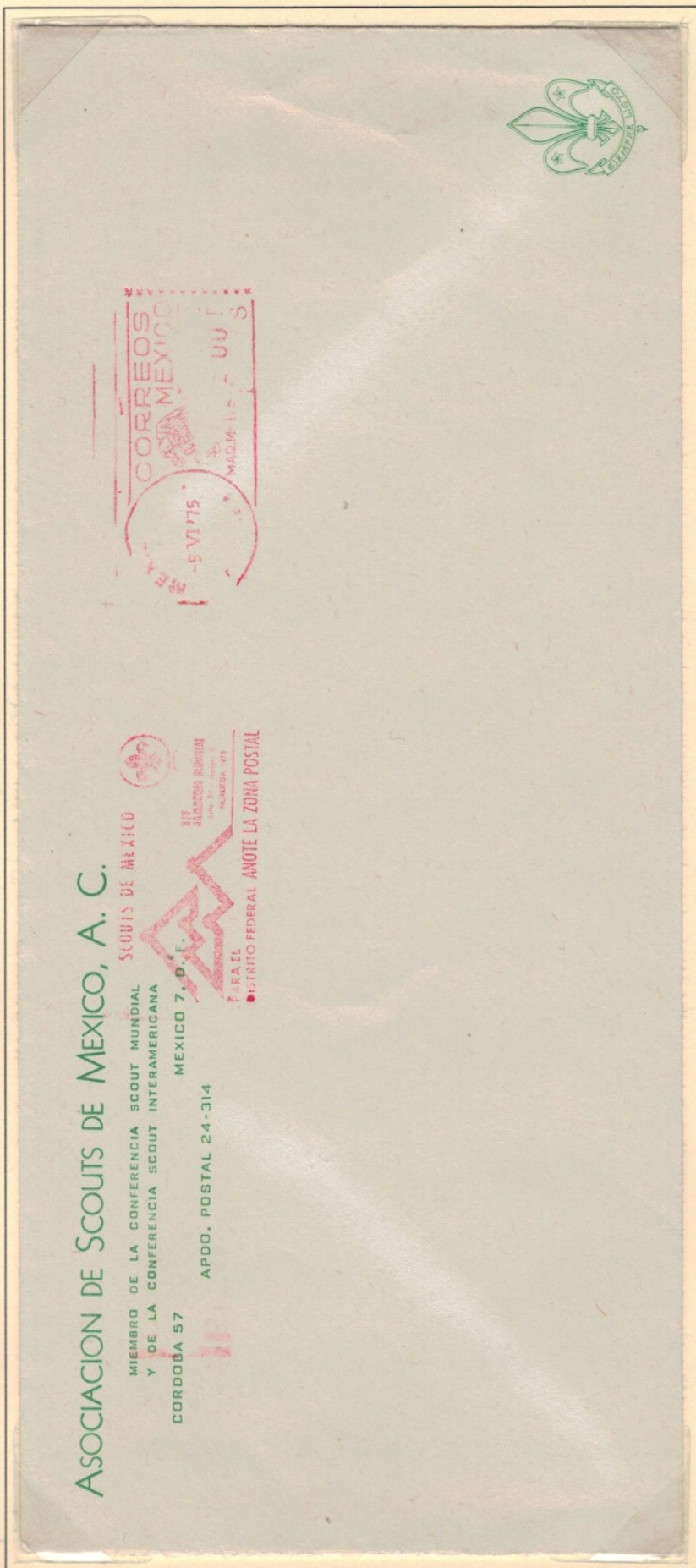

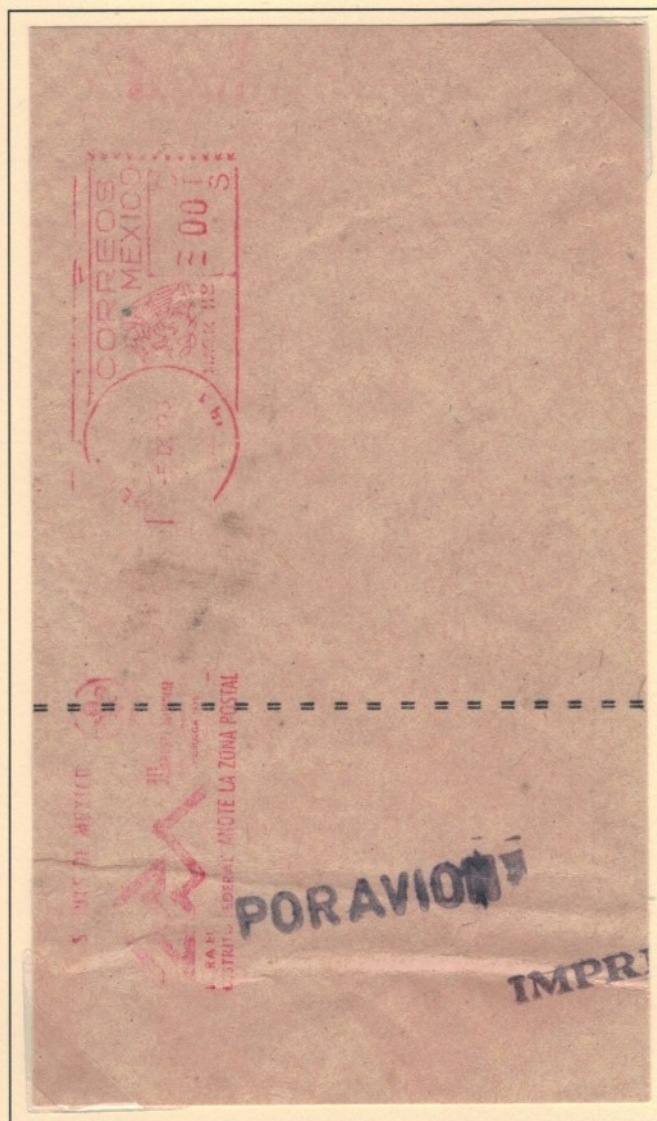

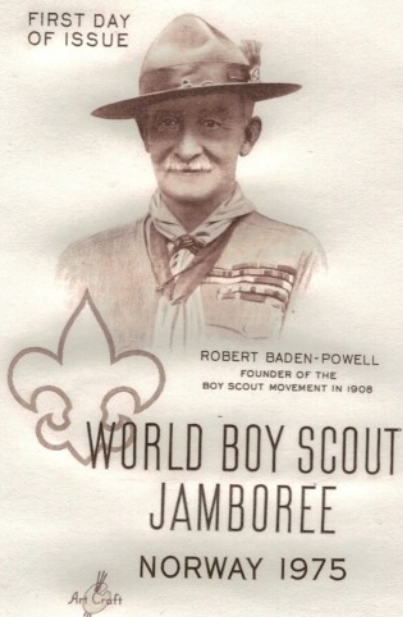

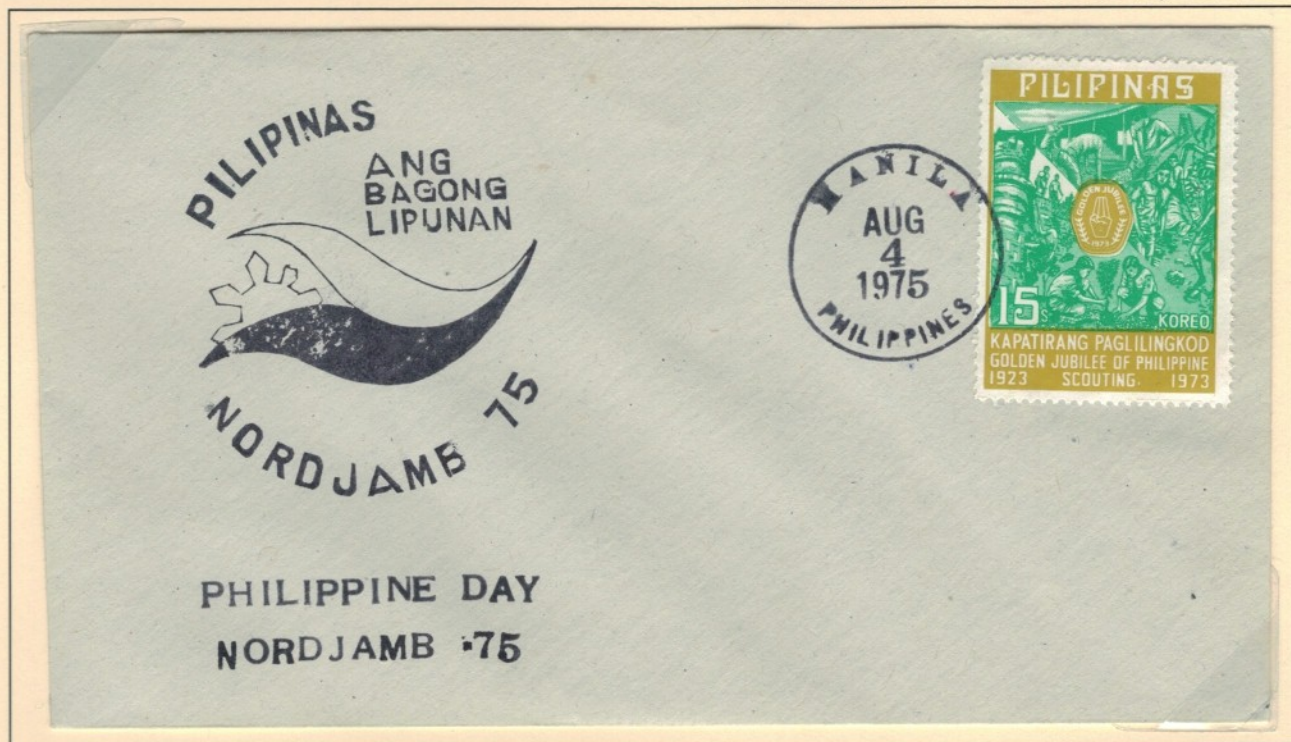

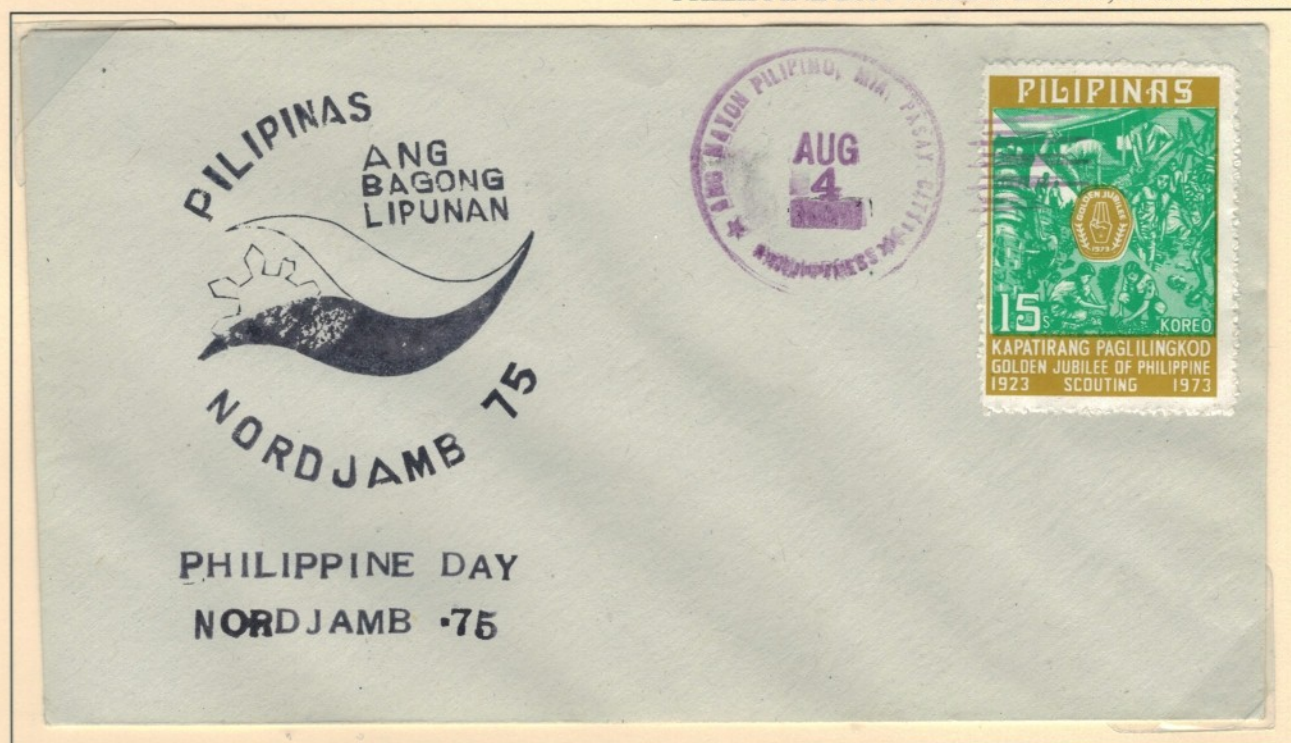

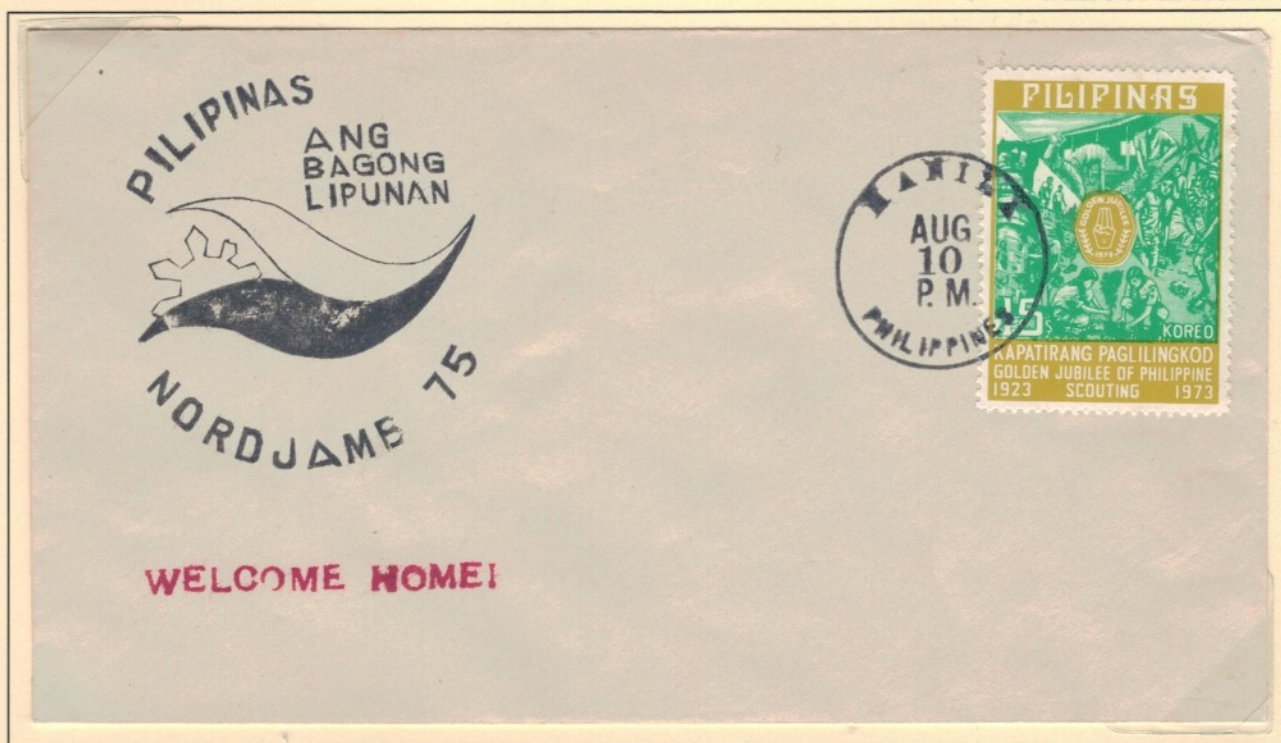

It would appear that the Philippine Contingent received permission to use a special postmark at the Jamboree for one day only to celebrate Philippine Day – August 4. 1000 covers (SSCC-E18) were prepared with a pair of the 1973 Philippines Golden Jubilee of Scouting stamps and postmarked. These covers were sold unaddressed by the Contingent for NOK 5 and later in the Scout Stamp Bank Tent for NOK 6 to raise funds for the Philippine Contingent.

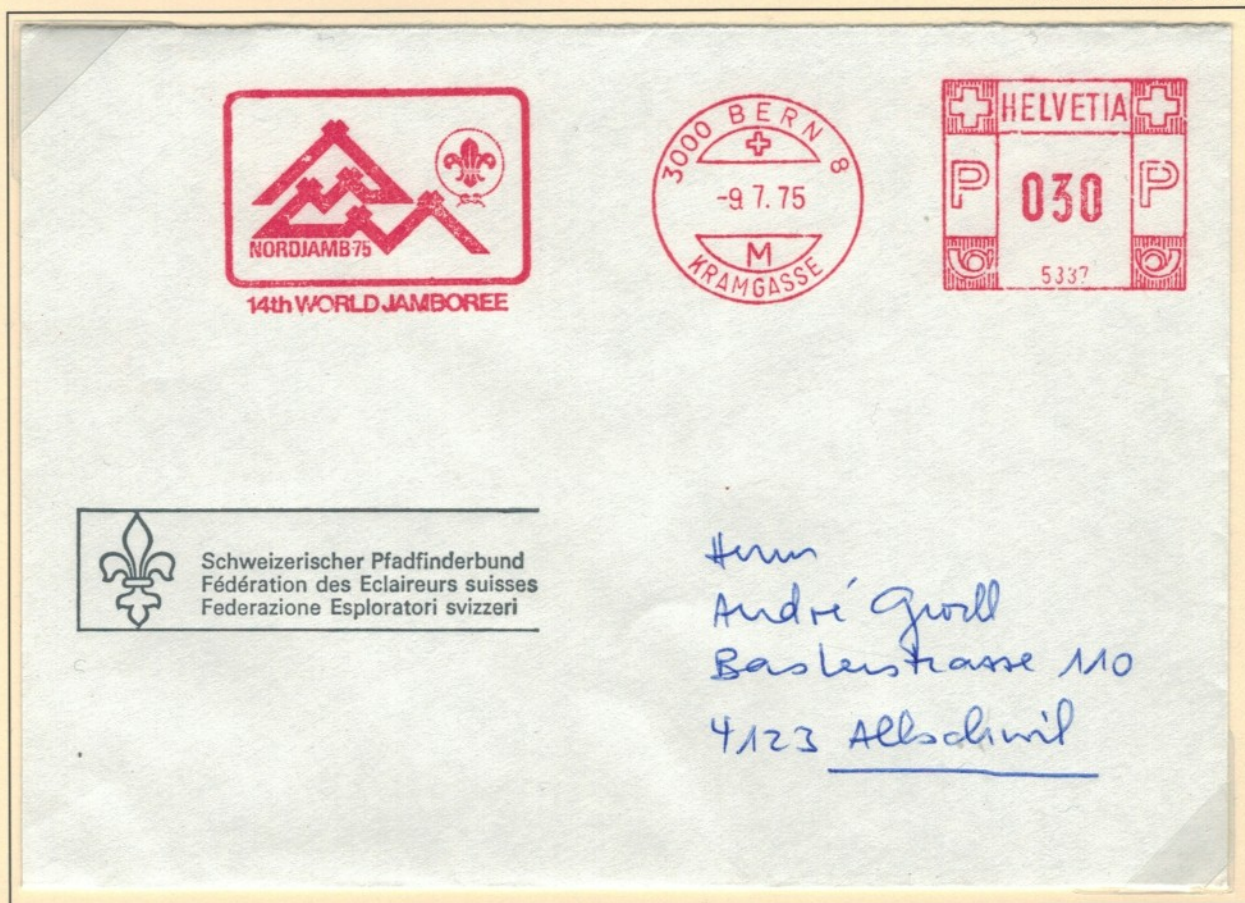

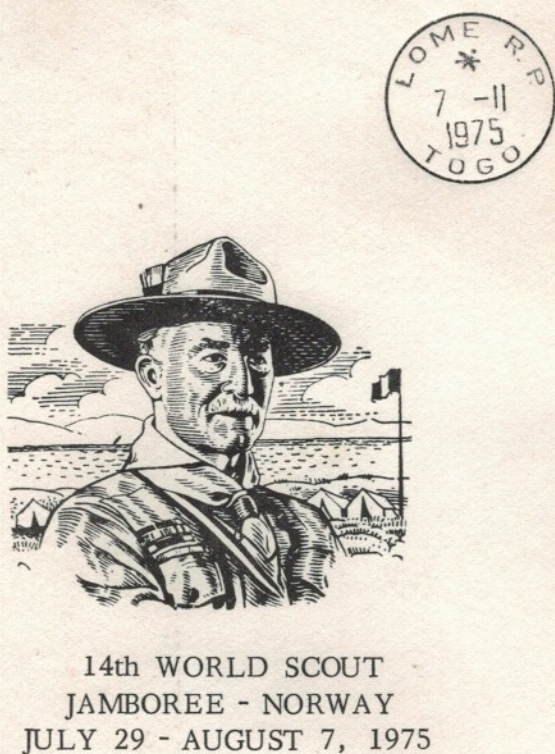


Nordjamb-75 meter slogan on domestic cover, "BERN -9. 7. 75".

The Association Scoute du Togo (A.S.T.), the national Scouting organization of Togo, was founded in 1920, and became a member of the World Organization of the Scout Movement in 1977, two years after Nordjamb-75. Togo issued two postage stamps and one souvenir sheet in commemoration and support of Nordjamb-75, and 8 Scouts from Togo attended.

November 7, 1975. Overprint "14ème JAMBOREE MONDIAL DES ECLAIRES" on two of six postage stamps and the souvenir sheet issued 1973 for the World Scout Conference in Nairobi, Kenya.

FIRST DAY COVERS



The United Kingdom is the birthplace of Scouting, and Baden-Powell organized the first trial camp at Brownsea Island near Poole, Dorset in 1907. U.K. hosted the 1st World Jamboree in 1920, the 3rd in 1929, the 9th in 1957 and the 21st in 2007. 1627 Scouts from the United Kingdom attended Nordjamb-75.

The Scottish Scout Headquarters in Edinburgh used a publicity meter slogan in their model 205 Roneo-Neopost franking machine. It was used intermittently from March 1974 to August 10, 1975.

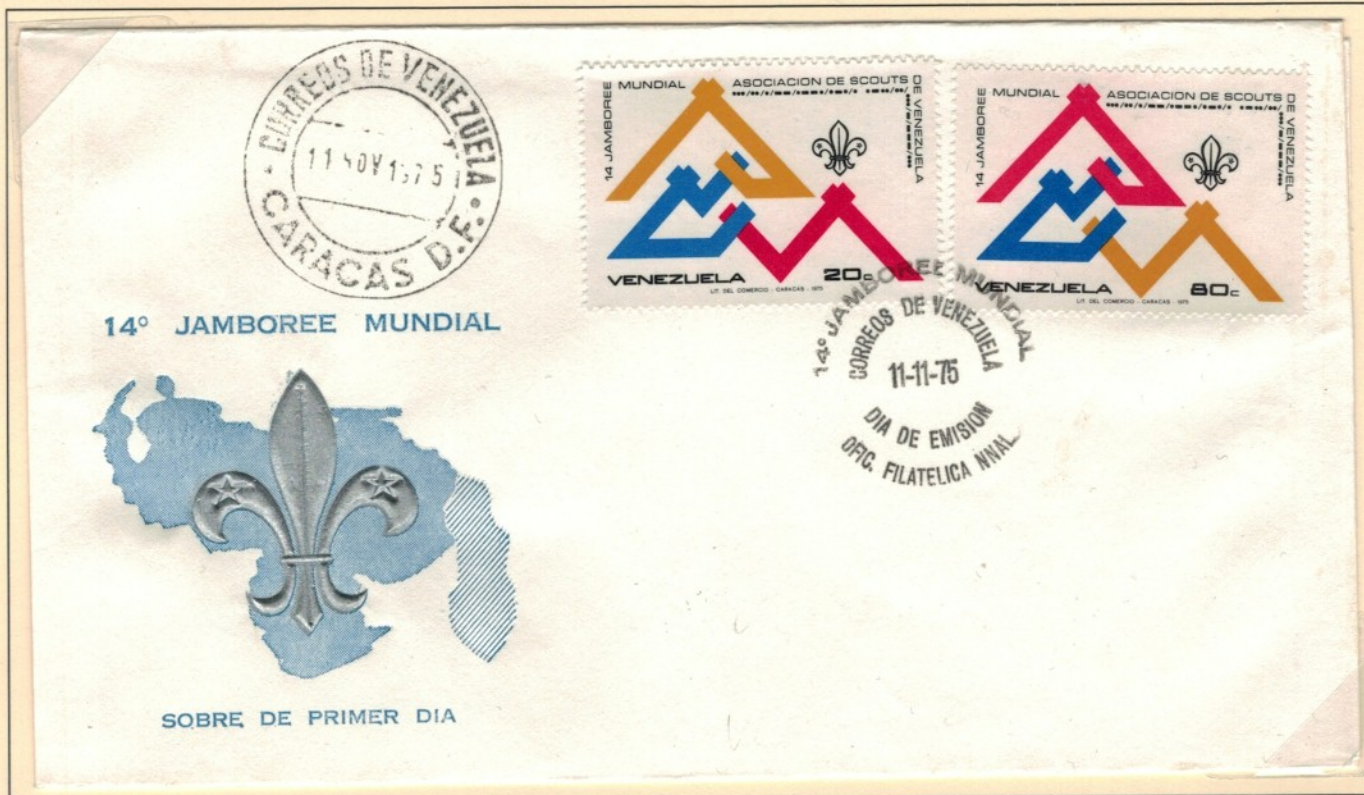
