Zeppelin - the Norway connection

The scope of this exhibit is to show the postal connections between the Zeppelin airships and Norway.

Graf (Count) Ferdinand von Zeppelin, a cavalry general of the German armed forces, constructed a rigid balloon as the world had never seen it before, **the Zeppelin**. On July 3, 1900, the first Zeppelin airship lifted off the ground, and many Zeppelins were to follow. He constructed his airships primarily for military use, and most of them were employed by the German forces during WW I. However, it was civil aviation which made them famous, and they will be remembered for mail and passenger flights.

Postal historical significance – rapid mail transport across the Atlantic: The business model for the commercial Zeppelin flights was to reduce the time required for transportation of passengers and mail. Airplanes could not yet cross the Atlantic Ocean, and the Zeppelins beat the mail transport by ship between Europe and America by several days.

Treatment: The zeppelin items are presented in a chronological sequence within each main section. The presentation of the items is part of the treatment; firstly, a general description of the flight, then the philatelic item, followed by analysis and description of the treatment of the mail.

Early Flights, Demonstration Flights 1912-1932

LZ 10 "Schwaben" was the first successful commercial zeppelin, operating 1911-1912. During World War I, the German army and navy employed many zeppelins. LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" was launched in 1928 and became the most famous of all airships. The zeppelin airships made many demonstration and publicity flights in Europe, flights to North and South America, the Arctic, the Middle East; and even one flight around the world.

LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" visited Norway on two occasions only, both in July of 1930. During the flight to the Arctic (the Spitsbergen flight), mail was dropped over Hammerfest in northern Norway. Mail was also dropped over Bergen on the west coast of Norway during the flight to the North (the "Nordland" flight to Iceland).

Flights to South America 1932-1936

It was not until early 1932 that Norway Post entered into an agreement with Deutsche Reichspost, and mail franked with Norwegian stamps could be sent to South America by LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin". LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" departed Germany every two weeks, cutting in half the time to Rio by the fastest steamships. The reduced time of transmission of passengers and mail across the Atlantic Ocean enabled a more efficient correspondence and gave business opportunities.

Flights to North America 1936

LZ 129 "Hindenburg", the world's largest aircraft ever to fly, was primarily built for regular transatlantic crossings between Germany and the United States of America, carrying mail and up to 50 passengers with both comfort and speed.

End of an Era 1936-1939 - from triumph to disaster

LZ 129 "Hindenburg" triumphantly flew over the 1936 Berlin Olympic Games, watched by spectators in the Olympic stadium and crowds of up to 3 million in the city.

The tragic destruction of "Hindenburg" on May 6, 1937 in Lakehurst, N.J. marked the demise of the Zeppelins, and the era of transcontinental passenger zeppelin travel came to an end.

Hindenburg's sister ship LZ 130 "Graf Zeppelin II" was launched in 1938; she made a few test flights, but never entered the commercial mail and passenger service for which she was built.


Early Flights, Demonstration flights 1912-1939

"Schwaben" - Flights at Rhine and Main

10 - 23 June, 1912

"Schwaben", the LZ 10, was the first successful commercial zeppelin; in operation for only one year from 26 June 1911 until she caught fire on 28 June 1912.

10 - 23 June 1912 – airmails at the rivers Rhine and Main. For this event – which included a postcard week – special cards, special airmail stamps and postmarks were used. Mail was carried by the airship "Schwaben" and the airplane "Gelber Hund" (Yellow Dog), and there were flights between Darmstadt, Frankfurt am Main, Mainz, Offenbach and Worms. Due to the many flights and the combination of airship and airplane transportation, it cannot be ascertained by which means and for which stretch the items were airborne.



Rhine/Main postcard with 20 Pf airmail stamp and 10 Pf Reichspost stamp, from **Frankfurt am Main** to Bergen, Norway. Postmarked "Flugpost am Rhein und Main / Frankfurt (MAIN) 14. 6. 12".

The message in Norwegian on reverse reads: "The new method of mail transportation".



Rhine/Main postcard with 10 Pf airmail stamp Pf and 10 Reichspost.stamp, sent from Darmstadt to Stavanger, Norway. Postmarked "Flugpost am Rhein und Main / Darmstadt 17. 6. 12".



Rhine/Main airmail postcard with 20 Pf airmail stamp and 10 Pf Reichspost stamp, from **Offenbach** to Christiania, Norway. Postmarked "Flugpost am Rhein und Main / Frankfurt (MAIN) 14. 6. 12".

The LZ 9 Military airship "Replacing Z. II." was in operation from 1 November 1911 until 1 August 1914 when it was decommissioned and broken up for scrap. Although military, the airship was occasionally used for civilian flights.

The Reich Post Office granted the Patriotic Women's Association in Düsseldorf permission to deliver airmail on 22 April 1913 on the occasion of a private trip of the LZ 9 for the benefit of the Düsseldorf orphans. The women's association sold airmail stamps for 10 Pf. and air postcards for 20 Pf. The military airship came from Cologne to pick up the mail in Düsseldorf, and the mail bags were transported by the airship around 50 km from Düsseldorf to Cologne.



Rhine airmail postcard with 10 Pf airmail stamp and 2x 5 Pf Reichspost stamps and addressed to Christiania, Norway.

Postmark: "Luftpost am Rhein / Düsseldorf 20, 4, 13".

In accordance with the postal instructions, the airmail stamp should not be postmarked.



Navy Airship L20 (LZ59) participated in a mission from Germany to the north-east of England. Due to lack of fuel she could not return to Germany and set course for neutral Norway where she crashlanded on 3 May 1916 in Hafrsfjord near Stavanger. The entire crew of 18 survived. Six of the crew were released shortly after, and the remaining 12 were transferred to Hommelvik near Trondheim where they were interned on-board the German auxiliary cruiser "Berlin" until the end of the war.



Prisoner-of-war postcard to Hannover, Germany. German Navy postmark "KAIS. DEUTSCHE MARINE-SCHIFFSPOST No 88 8 12 17" and German navy censorship marking "MARINE SCHIFFSPOST No 88 BRIEF-ÜBERWACHUNG". Norwegian censorship marking "KONTROLLERT". The sender was Ober-Anwärter Erich Reuter, a member of the L20 crew, interned on-board the German auxiliary cruiser "Berlin".



Although the LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" had passed rigorous tests, she was nonetheless an experimental ship, and at the time, the largest airship ever to have flown. Yet only on her seventh flight, she was heading across the Atlantic with a full complement of twenty passengers.

The airship left Friedrichshafen, Germany on 11 October 1928. En route, she negotiated severe storms in the Atlantic Ocean, which caused damage to the cotton fabric covering the port horizontal stabilizing fin. This was repaired over the ocean, and she triumphantly circled New York City before landing at Lakehurst, N.J. on 15 October.

She returned to Germany two weeks later, leaving Lakehurst, N.J. on 29 October and landed safely in Friedrichshafen on 1 November, 1928.

Special flight cachet in purple"First flight air mail / via Graf Zeppelin / United States – Germany / Oct 28 1928". On reverse postmarks "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN 1.11.28" and "OSLO 3 XI 28".

"Graf Zeppelin" performed in 1929 a flight to the Orient, with main mail drop at Er Ramle (Ramla) in today's Israel. Cover sent from "HORTEN 1 II 29" to Cairo, Egypt. Flown by "Graf Zeppelin" on the 1929 flight to the Orient, starting from Friedrichshafen on 25 March, and mail drop at Er Ramle. Special rubber-stamped flight cachet in red-purple.



In order to send Norwegian mail by zeppelin prior to 1932, the zeppelin mail fee had to be paid by German stamps. Airmail Norway-Egypt was available from 1925, and 100 öre postage in Norwegian currency matches the rate for air mail letter 20-40 g to Egypt; 50 öre letter postage rate (30 öre for the first 20 g plus 20 öre for the next 20 g) and 25 + 25 öre air mail fee. Additional German franking representing the zeppelin surcharge has fallen off, the stamp was postmarked "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN BODENSEE LUFTPOST 24 MAR 29". On reverse transit postmarks "BERLIN C -3.2.29", "MÜNCHEN -4.2.29" and "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN -5.2.29". Arrival postmark "CAIRO 28 MAR 29".

The only recorded zeppelin cover with Norwegian franking prior to 1932.



In April 1929, "Graf Zeppelin" conducted a trip to the Mediterranean Ocean with drop of mail over Sevilla, Spain.

Postcard to Fåberg, Norway, posted on board "LUFTSCHIFF GRAF ZEPPELIN 22.4.1929" during the flight to the Mediterranean, special flight cachet in red.

On reverse machine cancel "SEVILLA (40) 23 ABR 29" and on front receiving postmark "FÅBERG 30 IV 29".

1 RM all-inclusive zeppelin mail rate for postcards to any destination.

In August 1929, "Graf Zeppelin" departed for a complete circumnavigation of the globe. The growing popularity of the "giant of the air" made it easy for Zeppelin company chief Dr. Hugo Eckener to find sponsors. One of these was the American press tycoon William Randolph Hearst, who requested the tour to officially start from the United States.

Starting from Lakehurst, NJ on 8 August, "Graf Zeppelin" flew across the Atlantic back to Friedrichshafen for fuel before continuing across vast Siberia to another stop in Tokyo.

From Japan, the "Graf Zeppelin" continued across the Pacific to San Francisco, before heading south to stop at Los Angeles. This was the first ever nonstop flight of any aircraft across the Pacific Ocean. The ship continued across the U.S.A., over Chicago and back to Lakehurst on 29 Aug.

The entire voyage took 21 days, 5 hrs, 31 min., and the dirigible travelled 49,618 km, with an average speed of almost 100 km/h.

(violet circular special flight cachet), and returned to Lakehurst on 29 Aug. (green "LAKEHURST, N.J. AUG 29 1929" postmark). Postcard rate Lakehurst to Lakehurst was \$1.75 zeppelin rate + 3c card rate, total \$1.78 (2c overpaid). On completion of the cruise at Lakehurst, mail was forwarded onward to destination by the ordinary means, and it required no additional fees for this forwarding.

This flight was partly sponsored by American newspaper publisher William Randolph Hearst who insisted that the flight begin and end in America. The flight received massive coverage in the world's press.

On completion of the cruise at Lakehurst, mail was forwarded onward to destination by the ordinary means, and it required no additional fees for this forwarding. Letter to Minde pr Bergen, Norway, mailed from "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN 15 AUG 29". Flown by "Graf Zeppelin" on the flight around the world from Friedrichshafen 15 Aug. (special flight cachets in red), and dropped in Tokyo, Japan 19 August, postmark "TOKYO 19 8 29". 4 RM all-inclusive zeppelin mail rate for letters from Germany to any destination and flown Friederichshafen-Tokyo, valid for this flight only.



Postcard from U.S.A. to Oslo, Norway, mailed from "NEW YORK N.Y MAY 31 1930", and flown by "Graf Zeppelin" on the return flight from Lakehurst on 3 June. Special flight cachets in red and violet. The violet cachet (type II) was used only on mail from Lakehurst. Transit postmark "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN 6.6.30". 65c correct postcard rate.



Letter from U.S.A. to Drammen, Norway, mailed from "BROOKLYN N.Y JUN 1 1930", and flown by "Graf Zeppelin" on the return flight from Lakehurst on 3 June. Special flight cachets in red and violet. The violet cachet (type II) was used only on mail from Lakehurst. Transit postmark "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN 6.6.30". The rate (postage plus fee for the air dispatch) was \$1.30. The rate included addresses in any European country. Senders did not always understand the rates. Sometimes you had to add the regular rates and other times it was included. This sender added the surface rate and that is why it is 5c overpaid.

"Graf Zeppelin" - Flight to South America "Graf Zeppelin" - Flight to Switzerland

"Graf Zeppelin" undertook a successful tour to South America in May, 1930. The flight route was Friedrichshafen-Sevilla-Recife-Rio de Janeiro-Recife-Lakehurst-Sevilla-Friedrichshafen. After this trip it was decided to open the first regular transatlantic airship line, traveling mainly between Germany and Brazil.



Cover from Brazil to Drammen, Norway, mailed from "RIO DE JANEIRO 24 MAI 1930", and flown by "Graf Zeppelin" on the return flight from Rio on 25 May. Special flight cachet type I in violet. Transit postmarks "RECIFE 28 MAI 30", "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN 6.6.30", "OSLO -9 VI 30" and receiving postmark "DRAMMEN 10 VI 30" on reverse.



The Underwood, Elliot-Fisher, Sundstrom Company, a U.S. manufacturer of accounting machines, chartered the "Graf Zeppelin" for a flight to Switzerland on 4 July, 1930. Mail was dropped over St. Gallen. Postcard to Oslo, Norway, with signatures of three passengers, posted onboard. Transit postmark "ST. GALLEN -4.VII.30".

LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" flies to Norway



LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" visited Norway on two occasions, both in July, 1930.

During the 1st Nordland flight, the flight to the Arctic (Friedrichshafen – Spitsbergen – Friedrichshafen), two mail bags were dropped over Hammerfest on 10 July, containing in total approximately 800 covers and 2,500 postcards.

Mail drop for the 2nd Nordland flight, the flight to the North (Friedrichshafen – Iceland – Friedrichshafen) was planned over Tromsö, but was changed to Bergen due to the weather conditions. Two mail bags were dropped over Bergen on 16 July, containing a total of 658 covers and 1,812 postcards.

German all-inclusive postage rates (except special services) for zeppelin mail posted within Europe were 100 Rpf (1 RM) for postcards and 200 Rpf (2 RM) for regular letters, valid from 11 April, 1930 to 6 June, 1932.

A special flight cachet was used, in green for the first flight and blue for the second flight.

Flight to the Arctic

Postcard written by a zeppelin crew member, Bordingenieur (Flight Engineer) Albert Sammt, to his daughter. Posted on bord "Graf Zeppelin" on its northbound flight. Dropped over Hammerfest, postmark "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". Transit postmark "BERLIN C 16.VII.30" and Stuttgart air mail cachet. 1 RM all-inclusive postage rate for postcards to all destinations.



"Graf Zeppelin" carried 20 passengers, and this 1st Nordland flight was chartered by the Swiss Automobile Club. Postcard to Bern, Switzerland, written by one of the Swiss passengers and posted on bord "Graf Zeppelin" on her northbound flight. Dropped over Hammerfest, postmark "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". The all-inclusive postage rate for postcards was 1 RM to all destinations.



Cover sent to Fort Worth, Texas, U.S.A., posted on bord "Graf Zeppelin" on her northbound flight, and dropped over Hammerfest. Postmarked on reverse "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". 2 RM all-inclusive rate for covers to all destinations.



Postcard to Reykjavik, Iceland from "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN -8.7.30". Dropped over Hammerfest and postmarked "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". Sent from Norway to Iceland by regular surface mail. Arrival postmark "REYKJAVIK 20.VII.30". 1 RM all-inclusive postage rate for postcards to all destinations.



Cover sent from "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN -8.7.30" to Spitsbergen, dropped over Hammerfest and forwarded to Spitsbergen by ship. Backstamped "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". The all-inclusive postage rate for covers was 2 RM to all destinations, thus 4 RM for double weight.



Postcard with combined German and Scadta franking, addressed to Colombia, South America. The card is franked with 1 RM and postmarked on board "LUFTSCHIFF GRAF ZEPPELIN -9. 7. 30". 1 RM was the regular postage rate to all destinations. However, a 10 centavos Scadta stamp is affixed and postmarked "CALI 19. VIII. 1930", paying the Colombian air mail fee. The card was dropped over Hammerfest, and it is postmarked "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30".

The only recorded postal item from this flight with Scadta and German combined franking.



Postcard with combined Swiss and German franking, addressed to Switzerland. The card is mailed from Zürich, where the 0.40 Fr Swiss postage stamps are postmarked "ZÜRICH FLUGPLATZ -5 VII 30". This postage was insufficient for paying the air mail fee (1.40 Fr was the correct all-inclusive postage rate), and instead a 1 RM German postage stamp paid for the zeppelin transport and was cancelled on board "LUFTSCHIFF GRAF ZEPPELIN -9. 7. 30" on her northbound flight. The card was dropped over Hammerfest, postmarked "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30" and forwarded to Switzerland by surface mail.

The only recorded postcard with Swiss and German combined franking.



Postcard postmarked "WIEN -3.VII.30" and "-6.VII.30", addressed to Krefeld, Germany. 1.70 Schilling postcard rate to all destinations. Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". Transit postmark "BERLIN C 16. 7. 30".



Cover sent from "WIEN -5.VIII.30" by air mail "WIEN -6.VII.30", and addressed to Stockholm, Sweden at the 3.60 Schilling cover rate. Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on reverse "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". A total of 221 postcards and letters with Austrian franking were sent on this flight.



Postcard sent from "DANZIG -7.7.30" to Oslo, Norway.
1.50 Gulden allinclusive postage rate for postcards to all destinations.
Dropped over Hammerfest and postmarked "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30".



Cover sent from "DANZIG 23.6.30" to Hammerfest, Norway.

3 Gulden all-inclusive letter postage rate to all destinations.

Dropped over Hammerfest and backstamped "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30".



Postcard sent from "TRIESENBERG -5.VII.30" to Hammerfest, Norway. 1.40 Fr all-inclusive postage rate for postcards to all destinations. Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST 12 VIII 30" – **incorrect date** – note that the mail drop took place on 10 July.



Prior to 1931, mail from Luxembourg for dispatch by 'Graf Zeppelin' could only be sent with additional German franking for the Zeppelin mail fee. Postcard sent from "LUXEMBOURG VILLE III -2.7.30" to Rotterdam, the Netherlands. Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". Arrival postmark "ROTTERDAM 17.VII.30". The Luxembourgian postage rate was 80c for regular foreign postcards. The German all-inclusive zeppelin rate was 1 RM for postcards to all destinations.



Postcard from "AMSTERDAM CENTR.STATION -7 VII 1930" to Germany. 7½c postage for postcards plus 55c zeppelin fee to all destinations, total 62½c correct postage. Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30". On the return air mail via Karlsruhe (Baden).

Only 6 postcards from the Netherlands were carried on this flight.



Cover sent from "ROTTERDAM -4 VII 1930", addressed to Rotterdam, the Netherlands. 12½c postage for covers plus 110c zeppelin fee to all destinations, total 122½c, i.e. 5c overfranked. Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30".

Only 2 covers from the Netherlands were carried on this flight.



Postcard sent from "SAARBRÜCKEN -7.7.30" to Völklingen, Saar.
7 Fr all-inclusive postage rate for postcards to all destinations.
Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30".
On the return air mail via "BERLIN 16.7.30" and Saarbrücken.
75 postcards from Saar were carried on this flight.



Cover sent from "SAARBRÜCKEN -7.7.30" to Pforzheim, Germany.
12.5 Fr all-inclusive postage rate for covers to all destinations.

Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on reverse "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30".

On the return air mail via Karlsruhe (Baden).
31 covers from Saar were carried on this flight.



Postcard sent from "ROMANSHORN -7.VII.30" to Willmanstrand, Finland.

1.40 Fr all-inclusive postage rate for postcards to all destinations.

Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST P.P. 10 VII 30".



Cover sent from "ROMANSHORN -8.VII.30" to Hammerfest, Norway.


2.80 Fr all-inclusive postage rate for postcards to all destinations.

Dropped over Hammerfest, and postmarked on front "HAMMERFEST 10 VII 30".

This flight was advertised as the 2nd Nordland flight, and mail drop was planned over Tromsö. As it turned out, mail was dropped over Bergen, and the course was set for Iceland due to the weather conditions. Two mail bags were dropped over Bergen on 16 July, containing a total of 658 covers and 1,812 postcards.



Postcard written by crew member Steuermann (Helmsman) Kurt Schönherr and addressed to a colleague at the airship workshop in Friedrichshafen. 

The flight to Iceland from 30 June to 3 July 1931 was planned as a group flight for 20 passengers. Perhaps it was the prospect of a cold trip that caused only 12 people to sign up, and only 10 of these were paying passengers. The flight was from Friedrichshafen with a flight path across the Netherlands and the North Sea, following the east coast of England and Scotland, to the Faroe Islands, and along the southern coast of Iceland to Reykjavik.

Mail carried from Germany was dropped at Reykjavik, and Icelandic mail was hoisted on board. Iceland had issued three overprinted stamps on occasion. Letter postmarked





In July 1931, "Graf Zeppelin" made an historic trip to Franz Josef Land, the northernmost point she ever reached.

In 1931, "Graf Zeppelin" made an historic exchange of mails with the Russian icebreaker "Malygin" at Quiet Bay on Hooker Island, Franz Josef Land. During this flight the "Graf Zeppelin" reached her northernmost point, Rudolf Island, approximately 500 nautical miles from the North Pole.

Original plans called for a meeting at the North Pole between Wilkins-Ellsworth's sub-marine "Nautilus" and "Graf Zeppelin", but mechanical problems with the submarine prevented the rendezvous from taking place.

Flights to South America 1932-1937

Zeppelin mail fees from Norway to South America

LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" started in 1932 scheduled commercial airship service to South America. The standard airship route was between Friedrichshafen, Germany and Recife, Pernambuco, Brazil. From 1932 onwards, Norwegian air mail could be sent by Zeppelin to several countries in South America, and the Norwegian Postal Circular No. 7 of 22 March, 1932 gave details for sending such mail. The air mail fee included both the Zeppelin route and the connecting route(s). The air mail fees (öre) were:

The regular Norwegian postage rates were to be paid in addition to the air mail fees. The rates remained unchanged from 1927 to 1946: Letter 30 öre per first 20 grams and 20 öre per additional 20 grams. Postcard 20 öre. Printed matter 7 öre per 50 grams. Registration fee 30 öre. Express fee (special delivery) 60 öre.

First South America Flight 1932




End of an Era 1936-1939 – from triumph to disaster

"Hindenburg" - Test Flight


23 March, 1936

LZ 129 Hindenburg was a commercial passengercarrying rigid airship, the ship lead of class, Hindenburg the longest class of flying machine and the largest airship by envelope volume. It was designed and built by the Zeppelin Company on the shores of Lake Constance Friedrichshafen, Germany, and was operated by the German Zeppelin Airline Company. It was named after Field Marshal Paul von Hindenburg, President of Germany 1925-1934.

The airship flew from March 1936 and was a triumph of engineering for Germany's Third Empire.



LZ 129 "Hindenburg" and LZ 127 "Graf Zeppelin" over Lake Constance (Bodensee in German) on 23 March 1936. "Hindenburg" has not yet had her name painted on the hull. The two airships were used by the Third Empire in a nazi propaganda tour around Germany 26-29 March 1936.



Postcard to Norway, postmarked "FRIEDRICHSHAFEN 23.3.36" and special flight cachet in red. This was the first flight of the "Hindenburg" with mail service onboard.

The "Hindenburg" was used for propaganda purposes when she flew over the Olympic Stadium in Berlin on 1 August during the opening ceremonies of the 1936 Summer Olympic Games. Shortly before the arrival of Adolf Hitler to declare the Games open, the airship crossed low over the packed stadium while trailing the Olympic flag on a long weighted line suspended from its gondola.

This event is also a symbol for the success of the Zeppelins. It should not last long.

The two Hindenburg-class airships "Hindenburg" and "Graf Zeppelin II" were hydrogen-filled, passenger-carrying rigid airships, constructed entirely from duraluminium, built in Germany in the 1930s and named in honor of Paul von Hindenburg. They were the last such aircraft to be constructed, and in terms of length, height, and volume, the largest aircraft ever built.

Postcard to Norway, postmarked "Flug- und Luftschiffhafen RHEIN-MAIN FRANKFURT -1.8.36". Flown by LZ 129 "Hindenburg" on the Olympic Flight to Berlin on 1 August (special flight cachet in purple). Transit "BERLIN-ZENTRAL-FLUGHAFEN 1.8.36.-16". 2 Pf overfranked for the 50 Pf allinclusive zeppelin letter rate to any destination in Europe 1934-1939.



The "Graf Zeppelin II" was virtually identical to the "Hindenburg" and flew for the first time on 14 September 1938. It was conceived to replace the ageing "Graf Zeppelin" on flying the South American transatlantic route.

Postcard to Norway, postmarked "Flug- und Luftschiffhafen RHEIN-FRANKFURT MAIN -1.12.38". Flown by LZ 130 "Graf Zeppelin II" on the Flight to the Sudetenland on 2 Dec. (special flight cachet in On reverse postred). mark "REICHENBERG (SUDETENGAU) 2 12 38". 50 Pf all-inclusive zeppelin postcard rate to destination Europe 1934-1939.

The Sudetenland is the historical German name for the northern, southern and western areas of former Czechoslovakia. The area was annexed ("liberated") by Germany in 1938.



After opening its 1937 season by completing a single round trip passage to Rio De Janeiro in late March, LZ 129 "Hindenburg" departed from Frankfurt on the evening of 3 May on the first of 10 round-trips between Europe and the United States that were scheduled for her second year of commercial service. Mail was dropped over Cologne en route to the USA.

Three days later – LZ 129 "Hindenburg" caught fire and was totally destroyed on landing at Lakehurst, New Jersey on 6 May, 1937. Norwegian mail was not salvaged from the disaster.

The "Hindenburg" disaster marked the demise of the Zeppelins. "Graf Zeppelin" was grounded and "Graf Zeppelin II" which was under construction never entered passenger service.




Letter sent from "Flug- und Luftschiffhafen RHEIN-MAIN FRANKFURT -1.5.37" to Oslo, Norway. Intended to be flown on the "Hindenburg" Germany flight on 1 May, 1937 (special circular flight cachet in purple), but the flight was cancelled due to bad weather.

Instead flown on 3 May, 1937 and dropped over Cologne, as demonstrated by the boxed explanatory cachet "Wegen Ausfalls der Deutschlandfahrt Postabwurf bei Nordamerikafahrt". Transit postmark "KÖLN 3.5.37" and arrival postmark "OSLO 2 TUR -5 V 37" on reverse. The all-inclusive postage rate for zeppelin letters to any destination in Europe was 1 Reichsmark, valid from 11 May, 1934 to 31 August, 1939.

This was the first leg of the disaster flight to North America.

Norwegian mail was not salvaged from the disaster.

In 1939, LZ 130 "Graf Zeppelin II" made a landing flight from Frankfurt to Görlitz in Saxony.



Two postcards sent from "OSLO 14-7-39" to Görlitz, Germany. Transit postmark "Flug- und Luftschiffhafen RHEIN-MAIN FRANK-FURT 16.7.39". Flown by "Graf Zeppelin II" from Frankfurt to Görlitz (special flight cachet in red), to Görlitz on 16 July as shown by the postmark "GÖRLITZ Landungsfahrt LZ 130 16.7.1939".



The Norwegian postage on both cards overpaid the 20 öre postcard rate to Germany (valid 1927-1946), but was not accepted as payment for the German 50 Reichspfennig all-inclusive zeppelin airmail postage rate for Europe (valid 1934-1939), and hence the postage due cachets "-Nachgebühr-" (above) and "Nachgebühr 50 Rpf." (above and below). The Nachgebühr cachets are German, but the location were they were applied is not known.

In 1939, LZ 130 "Graf Zeppelin II" made a landing flight from Frankfurt to Bielefeld in North Rein-Westphalia. The flight continued to Münster after landing in Bielefeld.



Postcard sent from "OSLO 22-7-39" to Bielefeld, Germany. Transit postmark "Flug- und Luftschiffhafen RHEIN-MAIN FRANK-FURT 23.7.39 --6" which is 6 a.m., this proves that the airship left Frankfurt in the morning of 23 July, and not in the evening of 22 July as stated in the Michel and Sieger catalogues.

Flown by "Graf Zeppelin II" from Frankfurt to Bielefeld (special flight cachet in red), to Bielefeld on 23 July as shown by the special postmark "BIELEFELD Landung des "Graf Zeppelin" 23.7.1939".

Norwegian postage 50 öre overpaid the 20 öre postcard rate to Germany (valid 1927-1946), but was not accepted as payment for the German 50 Reichspfennig all-inclusive zeppelin airmail postage rate for Europe (valid 1934-1939), and hence the postage due cachet "Nachgebühr 50 Rpf.".

The end of the Zeppelins

In April 1940, Hermann Göring issued the order to scrap both *Graf Zeppelins* and the unfinished framework of LZ 131, since the metal was needed for other aircraft. By April 27, work crews had finished cutting up the airships. On May 6, the enormous airship hangars in Frankfurt were leveled by explosives, three years to the day after the destruction of the *Hindenburg*.
