## Scouting in Denmark until 1957

The Scout and Guide movement in Denmark consists of about ten different associations. Most of them are members of two large federations, but there are also some independent organisations. Affiliated to Danish Scouting and Guiding are the organisations in Greenland, on the Faroe Islands and in Southern Schleswig.

Scouting in Denmark started in 1909. Danish Scouts were among the charter members of the World Organization of the Scout Movement (WOSM), Danish Guides among the founding members of the World Association of Girl Guides and Girl Scouts (WAGGGS).




Drawing by Hungarian artist Lojas Martón, 1927, drawn at Beatelund during the Swedish national jamboree.

The 1912 Olympic Games took place in Stockholm, Sweden. King Gustav V invited 1500 Boy Scouts from five countries to pitch their tents next to the Olympic Stadium and offer help in the Olympic Games. This was the first national camp of Sweden's Scout Association. It is estimated that 1200 to 1500 Scouts participated, coming from Denmark, Norway, Germany, England and France, as well as Sweden. The Scouts were responsible for the sales of all Programs at the Stadion. Furthermore, the Scouts were available for service for the officials of the games at all locations where competitions took place. Approximately 600 Scouts served at Stadion each day.

On the Marathon day, Scouts were posted along the entire 42 km route, signaling orders between the officials.



Det Danske Spejderkorps - DDS (The Danish Boy Scouts Association) was founded 1909. The first large camp hosted by Det Danske Spejderkorps took place 1913 on the peninsula Kalø near Rønde on the east coast of Jutland. 600 Boy Scouts from all over Denmark participated, even guests from the YMCA Boy Scouts and from the Sea Scouts. The international aspect was covered by a troop of 24 boys from a mining area in northeastern England, and 10-12 Boy Scouts from Sweden.


The Danish Scout Association held national jamborees in 1913 and 1919, with local camps in the years between.



1917 – local Scout camp at Langtved Færgekro near the bottom of the Isefjord, Zealand. Frederiksværk viewcard written by a father to his son at the Langtved Scout camp, postmarked "HUNDESTED 12 7 17".

1919 – the second national camp for the Danish Scout Association.

1,600 'yellow' Scouts camped at Hindsgavl near Middelfart on the western tip of the Funen island.

The Boy Scouts Association held a parade on May 5, 1921 for H.R.H. Princess Margrethe who was their honourary Chief Scout.

The Danish Scout Association held national jamborees in 1919 and 1923, with local camps in the years between. 5<sup>th</sup> Division 5<sup>th</sup> Troop held their 1921 camp at Dyrnæs near Jægerspris.



Dyrnæs Pensionat viewcard written by a camp participant and sent to Copenhagen. Mail was brought to Copenhagen; postmark "KØBENHAVN S 11.7.21". From the written message in Danish: "I am currently in Scout camp... My address is 5 Division 5 Troop Summer camp, Dyrnæs, Jægerspris...".

The YMCA Boy Scouts of Denmark was founded in 1910. They held their district camp for Jutland on the island of Kalø in July, 1923.


St. Jørgen is the Danish name for St. George. The place name Sct. Jørgensbjerg translates to St. George's Mountain; however if you have been to Denmark then you know that the mountains aren't exactly huge. The rural post office Sct Jørgensbjerg was located near Roskilde and was in operation from 1905. The name was spelled Skt. Jørgensbjærg 1935-1948, and in 1972 the post office was renamed Roskilde 13.

The Second World Jamboree camp itself lasted from 10 to 17 August. On Sunday 17 August, after a week at the Ermelunden camp, the Boy Scouts moved to Copenhagen itself where they stayed at private homes. On August 21 a big party took place at Tivoli for all the Boy Scouts and guest families for the closing ceremony of the Jamboree.

Postcard to Gjentofte, Denmark, sent by "De Kinesiske Spejdere" (The Chinese Boy Scouts), dated S.S. "Porthos", Jibouti, Africa and postmarked on board "MARSEILLE A YOKOHAMA No 10 21 9 24". Without doubt sent by Scouts on their way home from the Jamboree. Postage due markings.



This was, looking at the number of participants (5000 scouts from 34 countries), the smallest of all World Scout Jamborees held until now. One of the reasons was the Imperial Jamboree, which was held a week before in London.

New at this Jamboree was home hospitality. After the Jamboree scouts stayed with a host-family for a week.

Problems during this Jamboree were the enormous amount of visitors and a flood. 5,000 wet Scouts were housed by the locals. In the Stadium of Copenhagen various games, invented by Baden Powell, were organised.

This Jamboree showed that Scouting isn't just a game, but it is a crucial contribution to the forming of world citizens.




5,000 Boy Scouts participated in the second World Scout Jamboree at Ermelunden near Copenhagen, Denmark in 1924.



The Jamboree badge was the Danish flag, with inscription "JAMBOREE DANMARK 1924", and a sequencial number. Each participant was given his own uniquely numbered badge.



The YMCA Boy Scouts of Denmark was founded in 1910. They held their third national camp at Trelde Nes in 1925 with 2,200 participants.

From the written message: "These cards were handed out, with strict orders to write home.".

The camp post office did not have its own postmark,
and mail was handled at the nearby Fredericia post office.

The Danish Boy Scouts Association held their 4th national camp at Granshoved in 1928 with 1,200 participants.





Hoptrup is close to the camp site and the card is sent by a Boy Scout three days prior to camp. From the written message: "Tell Mom to send lots of chocolate to me in camp".

In 1927, the Swedish Scout Association marked their 15th anniversary with a jubilee camp at Beatelund near Stockholm. Nearly 4,000 Boy Scouts from 15 countries attended the association's fourth national camp. Baden-Powell visited the camp and stated in a radio broadcast that it was the best Scout camp that he had seen.


The Danish contingent was 800 "yellow" scouts from Danish Boy Scouts Association (DDS), and the 5<sup>th</sup> Division of the YMCA Boy Scouts, plus 12 Danish Cub Scout leaders. The Danes had their own postmaster who collected and delivered mail. A special red three-line semi-official cachet was applied to outgoing mail from the Danish contingent.

"Væbneren" was the magazine of The Danish YMCA Scouts, issued in Aarhus from 1913 onwards.



The YMCA Boy Scouts of Denmark held their national camp on the island Fænø 12-21 July, 1930. 2,265 Boy Scouts attended the camp. Denmark's first regular Scout postmark was used 13-20 July.



Uprated postal card to Germany with postmark (DK-001) "MIDDELFART FÆNØ KFUM-SPEJDERNE 17 7 30". 6,632 ordinary mail items were sent from the camp post office, and none registered.



Letter from "ANHOLT BY 22 7 30" to the Fænø camp. The camp closed on 21 July. Redirected to Vordingborg and transit postmark "KØBENHAVN Omk. 25 7. 30". 5,742 ordinary mail items were received, 564 parcels and 66 registered letters.

The fourth World Scout Jamboree took place in Hungary in 1933. It was attended by 25,792 Scouts, representing 46 different nations and additional territories. They encamped around the Royal Palace in the Royal Forest of Gödöllő, about 11 miles from the capital of Budapest.

The YMCA Boy Scouts of Denmark held their 1935 national camp at Hjortekær near Klampenborg. 3,100 Boy Scouts attended the camp. The special postmark (DK-002) was used 6-15 July.

9,168 ordinary mail items were sent from the camp post office, 19 parcels, 2 registered letters and 4 money orders.

The Danish Scout association held their 1935 national camp at Ermelunden near Klampenborg. 3,000 Boy Scouts attended the camp, which marked the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the association. The special postmark (DK-003) was used from 22 July to 5 August, and 7,638 ordinary mail items were sent from the camp post office.

The Danish YWCA Girl Guides held their 1935 national camp at Sønderballe. 1,300 Girl Guides attended the camp. The special postmark (DK-004) was used 2-11 August.



7 öre postal card sent to Copenhagen with postmark (DK-004) "K.F.U.K. Spejderne SØNDERBALLE -5 8 35". Correct postage rate for domestic cards was 10 öre. Postage due marking "6" in blue crayon, and 6 öre postage due stamps cancelled "KØBENHAVN -6 8 35". 6,592 ordinary mail items were sent from the camp post office, 8 parcels, 4 money orders, 4 cash-on-delivery and none registered letters.

The Danish Girl Guide Association marked their 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary and held their 1936 national camp at Brahe-Trolleborg castle near Korinth 3-13 August. An oval semi-official cachet was used on mail from the camp, in black colour on the first day only, then blue colour for the rest of the camp duration.




Lady Baden-Powell and Crown Princess Ingrid visited the camp.

"Det rullende Postkontor" (The Rolling Post Office, a post office in a bus) visited and served the camp only one day, on 7 July.






The Danish Boy Scout Association's headquarter was located at Fiolstræde 19 in Copenhagen.

Printed matter from the Danish Boy Scout Association, sent locally in Copenhagen. 4 öre postage paid by 29 Nov 1938 meter slogan applied at the post office. In 1937, the Danish Girl Guides Association (DDP) held a training camp for patrol leaders at Brahetrolleborg near Korinth. There were 240 participants. H.R.H. the Crown Princess Ingrid of Denmark visited the camp for two days. During the same period, an international Girl Guide camp took place at Blair Castle, Blair Atholl, Perthshire, Scotland. 340 participants from 19 countries attended. Lady B-P and Miss Agnes B-P visited the camp.



## Stamp money

Stamp money were used in Denmark from 1941 and is a form of alternative payment. They arose because the smaller denomination coins disappeared out of circulation due to high metal prices, and the banks found it difficult to get coins from the National Bank. Stamp money usually consist of a postage stamp wrapped in cellophane with a piece of cardboard on which some form of advertising is printed on the reverse.



Hoping to attract and enlist new Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts, stamp money were produced for the YMCA Scouts in Denmark. The stamp money were manufactured by the company Danatex in Copenhagen. They are printed in typography on cardboard of various colours, printed in sheets and cut to size.

All the recorded Scout related stamp money are with 1 öre denomination.

All the stamp money from Graabjørnene 11 Div, Graaulvene 11 Div and Massey-Harris were distributed by whole-saler Erik Sjøqvist, Frilufts-Magasinet, Skindergade 27, Copenhagen K. Frilufts-Magasinet was the Scout shop owned by the Danish Boy Scout Association, but they also sold Scout equipment to the YMCA Scouts. It is understood that the Graabjørnene YMCA stamp money were financed by Massey-Harris on condition that the M-H stamp money were distributed together with the scout stamp money. It seems, however, that they forgot to distribute the M-H stamp money.

In World War II, Denmark was occupied by Germany 1940-1945. Sweden kept neutral. Mail between the two countries were censored by the Germans.





The Danish YWCA Girl Guides held a national camp for senior girl guides in July 1943. The camp was located at Jomsborg near Jægerspris, a camp area owned by FDF, a non-scout Christian organizations for children and youth in Denmark. The camp post office did not use a special postmark or cachet.



Postal card written by a Girl Guide and sent from a YWCA Girl Guide camp at Troldegaarde, Jægerspris. Troldegaarde is located approx. 1 km from Jomsborg, and it is likely to be the same camp. Postmarked "JÆGERSPRIS 27. 7. 43" and sent to Valby near Copenhagen.

Cykle- og Ringfabriken Jyden A/S, manufacturers of bicycles and tyres, were located in Aalestrup. Their meter slogan shows a Boy Scout riding on a bicycle with an outline map of Denmark in the background, and the text "*Jyden CYKLER OG GUMMI kendes og sælges overalt i Landet*" (Jyden bicycles and tyres, known and sold all over the country). The meter slogan is recorded 1935-1947.

The Danish Girl Guide Association held their 1946 national camp at Brahe-Trolleborg castle near Korinth 9-16 July with 3400 participants, twice as many as the 1936 national camp which also was held here. The camp post office did not use a special postmark or cachet.



Expres (special delivery) cover sent from "HELLERUP 18.7.46" to a Girl Guide in the DDP national camp at Korinth. The two-line cachet "Kassebrev 18/7 1948 Kl. / Hellerup Postkontor" indicates that the letter was mailed / put into a mailbox and not delivered at the post office.

The camp closed two days before the letter was sent; therefore the letter was returned to Hellerup, annotation "Retur" (Return). The letter was not sent Expres (special delivery) when returned, and the Expres label was crossed over and attempted removed by the Korinth post office.

7,000 Girl Guides participated in the 1947 Danish YWCA Girl Guides national camp at Hindsgavl near Middelfart. The special postmark (DK-006) was used 23 July - 1 August.



The 6<sup>th</sup> World Scout Jamboree took place in France 1947, aptly named the Jamboree of Peace. 12,152 participants from 42 countries attended, including 178 Scouts of the Danish Boy Scouts Association.






Above: Specially printed envelope from Hillerød to a Danish Scout in subcamp 10 of the 1947 World Scout Jamboree, France.




The 1907 Brownsea Island camp was a boys camping event on Brownsea Island in Poole Harbour, Dorset, U.K., organised by Lieutenant-General Baden-Powell to test his ideas for the book Scouting for Boys. 21 boys from different social backgrounds participated 1-8 August, 1907 in activities around camping, observation, woodcraft, chivalry, lifesaving and patriotism. Recognised as the world's first Scout camp, the event is regarded as the real origin of the worldwide Scout movement.

To this day, several camping sites in the beautiful countryside bordering Poole Harbour, Dorset are available to rent by Scouts, Guides, and other organised groups. A group of Danish Scouts camped here in 1948.




Camp viewcard written by a Danish Scout and sent to Copenhagen. Postmarked "BOURNEMOUTH – POOLE 12 AUG 1948".

The Silver Jubilee of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines was marked with two postage stamps on 31 October 1948. First Day covers were serviced in Manila and in 15 other cities, using a red Silver Jubilee handstamp. At the Manila main post office, a machine cancel with slogan "25 Years of Service to Filipino Boyhood 1923-1948" was used 31 October - 5 November, 1948.

The camp post office did not have an official postmark, but a handstamp was applied on outgoing mail before the mail was brought to the nearby Væggerløse post office.






Postcard to Copenhagen, "ROHDEN PR. DAUGAARD PIGESPEJDER LEJREN -9. 7. 51".




Postcard to England, postmarked "GRENAA D.D.S. GRENAA LEJREN 11. 7. 51".




Cover with camp label, sent to Copenhagen, postmarked "GRENAA D.D.S. GRENAA LEJREN -7. 7. 51".






33 die as B.O.A.C.'s plane from Sydney for U.K. crashes in Singapore. British airline B.O.A.C. operated a route between Australia and U.K. using Lockheed 749 Constellation aircraft. On 13 March 1954 during landing at Singapore, the "Belfast" coming from Sydney, Darwin and Djakarta crashed on the landing strip of Kallang airport and caught fire. 32 passengers and one crew member were killed. A large part of the mail was recovered and a cachet was applied.



Participating in a jamboree is a great experience for the relatively few scouts who are lucky enough to attend. Jamborees are only held every four years, are quite expensive to participate in, and the number of participants is limited for each country. Fewer than 0.5% of the scouts get to enjoy a world jamboree with brother scouts from a wide range of foreign countries.

The Northern Jutland Division under Jens Hvass tried a new and affordable way to promote international get-together between scouts. Starting in 1947, they held some small jamborees in Rold Skov and gave them the name **Jamborettes**.

Several divisions have subsequently held many jamborettes, mostly by the Danish Scout Corps or by the YMCA scouts.

The jamborette should not be a Danish camp with guests from abroad, but a true international camp. "The Jamborette is an intimate Jamboree of a manageable format and with a fairly equal number of guests and hosts. In it you can really get together as one big scout family" quote from Jens Hvass, the man behind the first jamborette, Chief of the Nørrejyske Division.












